One Hour Free Parking on High Street, Northallerton and Market Place, Knaresborough

Report of the Assistant Director – Highways and Transportation

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To recommend the extension of the temporary one hour free parking concession on High Street, Northallerton and Market Place, Knaresborough for the period 1 - 31 January 2021 to assist with performance monitoring, reporting and supporting social distancing measures required as part of the ongoing Covid-19 situation,.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 In February 2020, a petition was received from Northallerton BID Company Ltd requesting the County Council reviews its existing on-street parking operation on High Street, Northallerton in context of its parking policy and extends the free parking allowance from its current duration of 30 minutes to two hours with immediate effect.
- 2.2 The petition was reviewed by way of the County Council's Right to Challenge Parking Policy Petition Scheme with the findings and recommendations presented to and approved by The Executive on 28 July 2020. The report resolved that the existing P&D system on High Street remained an appropriately applied parking management operation in accordance with the strategic approach and policy objectives.
- 2.3 Notwithstanding the above, The Executive tabled and approved a separate proposal to extend the 30 minutes free parking allowance on High Street, Northallerton to one hour for the remainder of the year to support local businesses and shoppers in result of the ongoing Covid-19 situation and social distancing measures.
- 2.4 This extension became operational in early September 2020 applicable to all P&D parking spaces on High Street and will remain until 31 December 2020. It was requested by The Executive that performance is monitored to allow a further decision to be taken on whether to extend the allowance or otherwise.
- 2.5 In response to the report and decision of The Executive, Northallerton BID Company Ltd submitted questions concerning the use and interpretation of some the data used to evidence the conclusions and believe NYCC took into account irrelevant matters whilst failing to consider relevant matters in reaching its decision.
- 2.6 Northallerton BID Company Ltd also highlighted that a procedural oversight had occurred during the review process. The Right to Challenge Parking Policy Petition Scheme requires consultation with the respective District Council, Town Council, Federation of Small Business and Elected Members. Whilst all of the named consultees were engaged in the matter, unfortunately that part of the process was not fully satisfied with only the Elected Members being formally consulted.

3.0 Review and Report

- 3.1 At the request of The Executive, the performance of the one-hour free parking concession has and continues to be monitored. However, given the relatively short time the concession has been operational, the amount of information that can be gathered for analysis from the few available data sets is limited and further compromised by the latest 4 week lockdown period. The timescales attached to the governance process for reporting to The Executive further reduces the monitoring period.
- 3.2 Therefore in respect of the above, it is proposed to extend the one hour free parking concession to apply throughout January on High Street Northallerton and Market Place, Knaresborough, allowing additional time to gather and assess data as well as complete the governance process for reporting to The Executive. This proposed extension will also assist with the continued Covid-19 response to support local businesses and communities.
- 3.3 As mentioned in paragraphs 2.5 and 2.6, Northallerton BID Company Ltd have raised a number of questions concerning details included in the July 28 report and the petition review process. These matters will be addressed in the report to The Executive at its meeting scheduled for the 26 January.

4.0 Equalities Implications

4.1 There are no equality implications considered to arise from the proposed one month extension of the one hour free parking concession on High Street, Northallerton or Market Place, Knaresborough. Appendix A

5.0 Financial Implications

- 5.1 The current suspension of charge for one hour parking on High Street, Northallerton and Market Place, Knaresborough does result in reduced income although the recent lockdown and tiered restrictions that have been in place this year mean that it is not possible to accurately estimate the impact on parking income at this stage.
- 5.2 The parking charges scheme is subject to the regulations set down in the Road Traffic Regulations Act (RTRA) 1984 which stipulates that the first call on any income is to meet the expenditure of providing the parking (in accordance with the section 122 duty) operation and the surplus of any income over expenditure for parking charges can only be utilised in accordance with section 55 of the RTRA 1984.

6.0 Legal Implications

6.1 There are no legal implications associated with the existing Traffic Regulation Order providing for charges in the Pay and Display zone(s) ("the TRO") and the extension of the temporary 1-hour free parking allowance.

7.0 Climate Change

7.1 There are no climate change impacts associated with the proposed extension of the temporary one hour free parking concession. Any future decisions made in light of the scheme will result in further assessment. Appendix B.

8.0 Recommendations

- 8.1 It is recommended that the Corporate Director, BES, in consultation with the BES Executive Members approves:
 - i. The extension of the one hour free parking concession on High Street, Northallerton and Market Place, Knaresborough until the 31 January 2021.
