WORK PROGRAMME REPORT

1.0 Purpose of Report

- 1.1. The Committee has agreed the attached work programme
- 1.2. The report gives members the opportunity to be updated on work programme items and review the shape of the work ahead.

2.0 Background

2.1 The scope of this Committee is defined as:

'The needs of vulnerable adults and older people and people whose independence needs to be supported by intervention from the public or voluntary sector.'

3.0 Request for Scrutiny of Support for Carers: Mr D Harbourne

- 3.1 I reported to the last meeting the suggestion from David Harbourne, Chair of the Carers' Resource, Ripon, Harrogate that the Committee undertake a review of the County Council's position, strategy and plans for supporting carers in communities.
- 3.2 You agreed that an "overview" be taken on how the County Council supports carers and their families to full Committee on Thursday 2 June, possibly Thursday 8 September.
- 3.3 The intention was your Chairman and other Group Spokespersons review the background and do some fact finding and research. They have agreed the approach but have yet to enter into a brief informal dialogue with organisations that work with, represent and support carers.
- 3.4 This work has therefore been delayed and is now more likely to be reported to the November Committee meeting.

4.0 Briefing: Disability Living Allowance and Independent Living Fund

- 4.1 I reported to you that the Group Spokespersons would be considering the potential implications of the Department of Work and Pensions decision to withdraw the Independent Living Fund. The Independent Living Fund is now permanently closed to all new applications.
- 4.2 The Group Spokespersons, at their Mid-Cycle Briefing on 11 May, considered the response last year to a Department of Work and Pensions consultation. Whilst there was no formal mechanism for recording all the information requested, analysis suggested a steady average of 13 new packages funded by the Independent Living Fund per year. Withdrawal of funding might require reassessment of those clients who are not currently supported by Adult and Community Services. These clients would need to be reviewed annually and an assessment carried out should there be a change in circumstances. There was potential for the Directorate to incur increased costs, in terms of current level of care and any increase in needs, not only for those clients who are currently being supported by Adult and Community Services, but also those who are not known to Adult and Community Services but whose needs are currently fully met by Independent Living Fund.
- 4.3 Members learned that those clients who currently have a high level of funding from Adult and Community Services and Independent Living Fund but who do not have access to increase in formal support, may not be able to continue to live independently if Independent Living Fund funding were not to be maintained.
- 4.4 The issue for Group Spokespersons was particularly for new clients where Adult and Community Services may not be in a position to offer a level of support necessary to remain independent within the community.
- 4.5 Discussion on this issue led to a much wider debate around the Coalition Government's welfare reform intentions. It had been some time, Members remarked, since welfare benefits generally had been considered by Scrutiny.
- 4.6 It was agreed that further work be done on arranging a seminar/ workshop for members of the Committee with agencies involved in welfare benefit advice and support. The purpose would be particularly to help Members understand the implications for the Directorate and communities of the Coalition Government's possible changes to welfare reform generally.

5.0 Dementia Declaration

5.1 Your Group Spokespersons discussed how to move forward some of the Committee's intentions about the commitments entered into as part

of the Dementia Declaration. County Councillor John Savage, a Group Spokesperson on the Committee, is currently active in the Harrogate and Craven Local Dementia Users Forum. Councillor Savage attends this both in the context of his being a member of the Committee and also as a carer. His first hand experiences will help assess how you move forward the commitment to make North Yorkshire a best practice example of elected Member commitment and involvement in local Dementia issues. A report will be prepared for September.

6.0 Recommendations

6.1 The Committee is recommended to consider the attached work programme and determine whether any further amendments should be made at this stage.
