Statutory Responsibilities

- **Tackle crime and disorder** (Serious and Organised Crime Board)
- **Tackle anti-social behaviour** (LDTs/ Hubs)
- **Tackle alcohol and substance misuse** (NY Drugs and Alcohol Partnership)
- **Tackle any behaviour which has a negative effect on the local environment** (95 Alive)
- **Undertake Domestic Homicide Reviews**



Integrated Community Safety Hubs

- Each District and City of York have integrated community safety hubs
- Oversight and 'management' via Community Safety Hub JCG
- Each Hub is different- but areas of commonality

- Strategic lead- Domestic Abuse JCG (North Yorkshire and City of York)
- Connectivity with partnerships- Safeguarding Boards, CSPs



Protecting Vulnerable People

Domestic Abuse

- To coordinate services committed to early intervention and prevention of DA for adults, children and young people
- To improve the safety of victims who experience DA and support them in rebuilding their lives

Domestic Abuse

- To coordinate and deliver interventions for perpetrators to reduce reoffending
- To work together to improve the equity and consistency of services with committed funding through effective partnership working



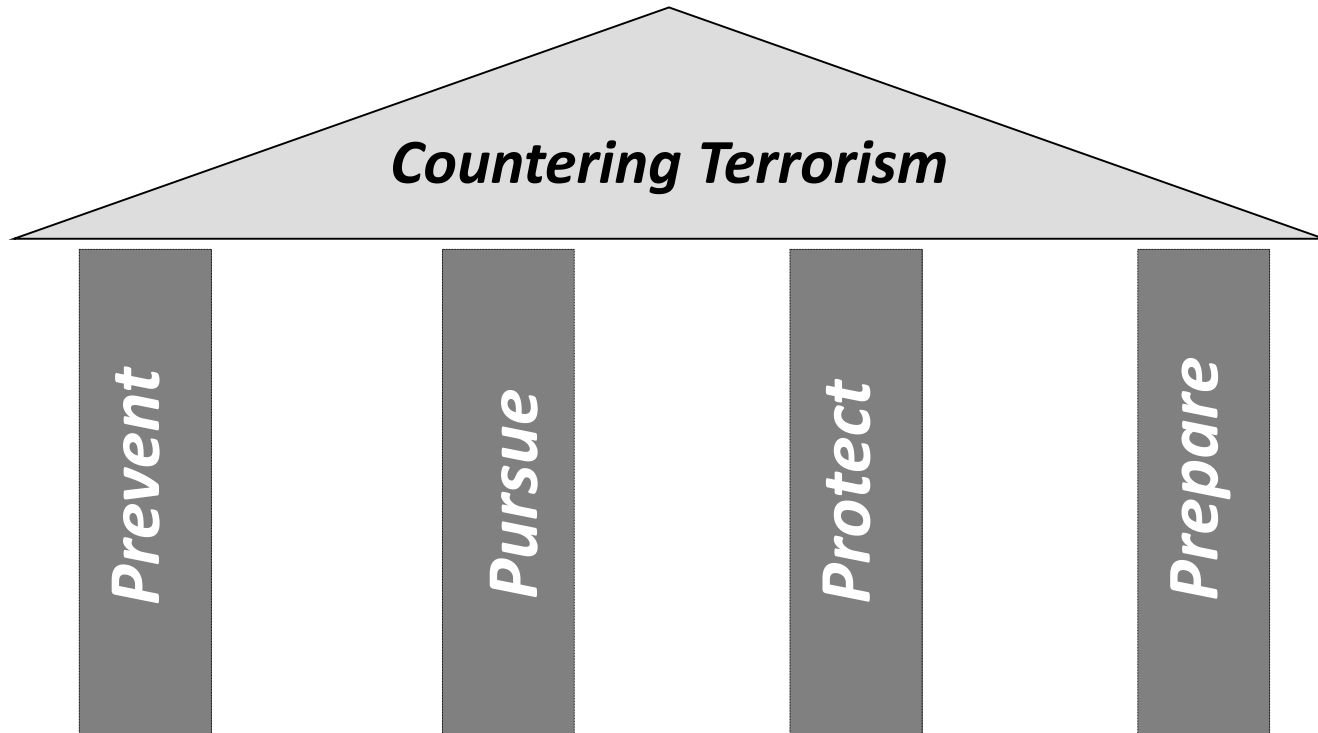
Protecting Vulnerable People

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Revealed, the first NHS doctor to join ISIS: hormone expert abandoned his hospital job and his wife and children to fight with ihadists

NHS doctor Issam Abuanza left his wife and children to join ISIS in 2014. Photographs on Facebook show him wearing doctors' scrubs with a pistol. Father-of-two was condemned by his own sister due to his 'path to terror'. ISIS registration form when he entered Syria said he was to be a 'soldier'. 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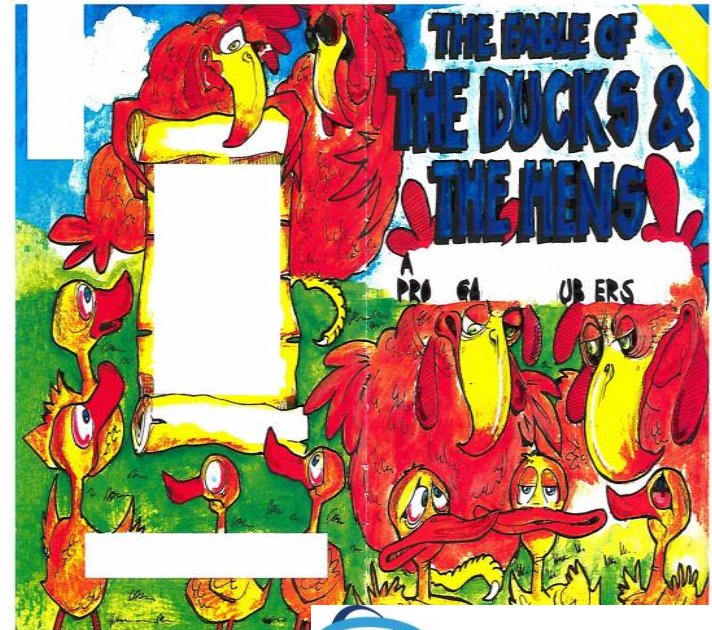
he first British NHS doctor to join ISIS in Syria has been revealed thanks to leaked ISIS recruitment papers.

issam Abuanza, 37, allegedly left his wife and two children behind in Sheffield when he fled the UK in 2014.

he had been a practising doctor with the NHS for seven years, after he received his licence to practise medicine in the UK in 2009, according to a BBC investigation.

hacking images posted on social media appear to show Abuanza wearing an army uniform and lurching an AK-47 while reading the Koran.

another photograph shows him wearing doctors' scrubs with a gun in a holster slung over one shoulder.
