STATEMENTS OF EXECUTIVE MEMBERS AND CHAIRMEN OF OVERVIEW AND SCRUTINY COMMITTEES

County Councillor Clare Wood, the Executive Member for Adult Services, made a statement, a summary of the key points of which had previously been circulated and which appears in the Minute Book (pages 3226-7).

County Councillor Tony Hall declared an interest as the Chairman of Hambleton Citizen's Advice Bureau, which had benefited form the Innovation Fund mentioned in the statement.

County Councillor Wood responded to questions.

County Councillor Gareth Dadd, the Executive Member for Highways and Planning Services, made a statement, a summary of the key points of which had previously been circulated and which appears in the Minute Book (pages 3228-9). He responded to questions, including a written question from County Councillor John Clark relating to disabled parking bays and said he would provide all Members of the Council with a copy of the written response.

County Councillor Chris Metcalfe, the Executive Member for Rural Services, Waste Disposal, Public Passenger Transport, Economic Development and Library Services, made a statement, a summary of the key points of which had previously been circulated and which appears in the Minute Book (pages 3230-2). He responded to questions, including a written question from County Councillor Bill Hoult relating to the Scarborough Power Pyrolysis Plant.

County Councillor Arthur Barker declared a personal interest as a non-Executive Director of Yorwaste and County Councillor Bill Chatt declared an interest in the question.

County Councillor John Watson OBE, the Executive Member for Financial Services, including assets, IT and procurement, made a statement, a summary of the key points of which had previously been circulated and which appears in the Minute Book (pages 3234-6). He responded to questions.

County Councillor Carl Les, the Lead Executive Member for Children's Services, Special Educational Needs, Youth Justice and Chief Executive Group Services made a statement, a summary of the key points of which had previously been circulated and which appears in the Minute Book (pages 3238-41). He responded to questions, including a written question from County Councillor Paul Richardson relating to the "One Council" approach.

County Councillor Arthur Barker, the Executive Member for Schools, 16-19 year old education, Early Years Provision and Youth Service, made a statement, a summary of the key points of which had previously been circulated and which appears in the Minute Book (pages 3242-3).

County Councillor Bill Chatt declared an interest as a community governor of Barrowcliff School.

County Councillor Barker responded to questions.

The written statements of the Chairmen of the Scrutiny Board and the Overview and Scrutiny Committees (pages 3244-57) having previously been circulated, the Chairman of the Corporate and Partnerships Overview and Scrutiny Committee responded to questions.

COUNCIL PROCEDURE RULE 10 QUESTIONS

MOTION - CHIEF CONSTABLE OF NORTH YORKSHIRE

Although no reasons for urgency had been given in respect of the motion, the Chairman stated that he believed that it would be inappropriate for it to be referred to the Executive for report back to the Council in October. Accordingly he invited County Councillor Geoff Webber to move the motion of which he had given notice.

County Councillors Polly English, David Ireton, Janet Jefferson, Jane Kenyon, Carl Les, Brian Marshall and Helen Swiers declared personal interests in the motion as members of the North Yorkshire Police Authority.

County Councillor Geoff Webber moved and County Councillor Stuart Parsons seconded:-

"Following the Chief Constable's admission of gross misconduct, and the significant expense to the public purse of the enquiry resulting from his failure to admit the gross misconduct at an early stage, that this council no longer has confidence in Mr Maxwell as Chief Constable."

Following debate, the Council divided and, on a show of hands, there were:
for the motion – 8
against the motion – more
and the motion was declared lost.

RESOLVED -

99. That the motion relating to the Chief Constable of North Yorkshire is not supported.

Since the publication of the agenda, reasons for urgency had been given in respect of the motion by the mover with which the Chairman agreed. Accordingly he invited County Councillor Bill Hoult to move the motion of which he had given notice.

County Councillor Bill Hoult moved and County Councillor Andrew Goss seconded:

'This Council agrees to recommend to the Executive that it should extend by six months the time allocated to supporters of category three libraries to submit their business plans for the continuing provision of a library service to their local communities. The funding to be from the general working balance.'

Following debate, the Council divided and, on a show of hands, there were:
for the motion – 10
against the motion – more
and the motion was declared lost.

RESOLVED -

100. That the motion relating to the funding of libraries in category 3 is not supported.

MOTION – COMPLIANCE WITH WASTE AND ENERGY POLICIES

Although no reasons for urgency had been given in respect of the motion, the Chairman stated that he believed that it would be convenient for the conduct of business for it to be debated on the day. Accordingly he invited County Councillor John Clark to move the motion of which he had given notice.

County Councillor Arthur Barker declared a personal interest in the motion as a non-Executive Director of Yorwaste.

County Councillor John Clark moved and County Councillor John Savage seconded:

"There have been significant changes to E.U. regulations and government policies on energy and waste. It is vital that North Yorkshire County Council complies with these as far as possible. Otherwise the financial penalties could be large. In view of these changing circumstances, this Council resolves that:

A report is brought to the full Council. This report to examine the "fit" between the NYCC/Amey Cespa Energy from Waste project and the following:

- i. The government Waste Strategy June 2011.
- ii. The draft EU directive 22nd June 2011 on energy efficiency COM (2011) 370 final 2011/0172 (COD).
- iii. The government Climate Change Regulations.

Questions to be included in the Report

In what ways does the NYCC Energy from Waste comply with the above? Where does it differ? How will the differences be measured? What are the potential costs and consequences of the variances?"

Following debate, the Council divided and, on a show of hands, there were: for the motion – 4 against the motion – more

and the motion was declared lost.

RESOLVED -

101. That the motion relating to compliance with waste and energy policies is not supported.
