76/06 - **PRAYER:** The Mayor's Chaplain, Reverend Gordon Lister led Members in prayer prior to the commencement of the meeting.

77/06 - **APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE:** Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Clark, Freeman, Anne Jones, Pauline McHardy, Philips, Theakston, and Ward.

78/06 - **URGENT BUSINESS:** There were no items of urgent business.

82/06 - **COMMUNICATIONS:**

01. **MR PETER WHITHAM – MACEBEARER / MAYOR’S**

ATTENDANT: The Mayor announced that his attendant, Peter Whitham, was attending his last meeting of the Council, retiring from the Council’s employment on the next day after 22 years of service and, together with all Members of the Council, joined in wishing Peter all the best for his forthcoming retirement.

02. **OPEN ARMS INFANT HOME BLANTYRE MALAWI:** The Mayor briefly referred to Cabinet Minute 91/06 with regard to the Twinning Advisory Group and the proposed establishment of a ‘link’ with the Open Arms Charity, supporting the Open Arms Infant Home, Blantyre, Malawi and, in that regard, indicated that bookmarks in support of the Charity were on sale at the meeting, donations in respect of which would be most welcomed.

83/06 - **PUBLIC ARRANGEMENTS – PETITIONS:** No petitions had been received.

84/06 - **PUBLIC ARRANGEMENTS – QUESTIONS:** No questions had been received.

85/06 - **MEMBERS’ QUESTION TIME:** Pursuant to Standing Order 12, the following questions had been received:-

1. Question to the Cabinet Member for Planning and Transport from Councillor Christine Willoughby.

‘In view of concerns from residents living in Hambleton Terrace and Hambleton Grove, Knaresborough about the possible removal of six trees on their highway, could the Cabinet Member for Planning and Transport give the Council an update on the latest position?’

The Cabinet Member explained to Council the background to the issue concerning complaints received over many years from residents of this locality about the damage trees were doing to their properties and also from the local school regarding wheelchair access for a disabled pupil. In response a survey of residents which would also encompass the Town Council, the local school and Local Ward Members would be undertaken in the near future in

order to determine a way forward on the problem and examine possible replanting of new trees in the area. In responding on this issue the Cabinet Member advised that it had been necessary during the course of the last twelve months for the Council to take down between 30 and 40 unsafe trees located in the District but in that same period had planted over 160 new trees.

2. Question to the Leader of the Council from Councillor Philip Broadbank.

'Welcoming the news about the £495,490 grant this Council is about to receive from the Local Authority Business Growth Incentive Scheme, are there any plans to consult with business leaders throughout the whole district about whether some of that money could be used to fund "one off" capital projects they may have to help boost the local economy and business growth?'

The Leader of the Council stated that as part of his portfolio of responsibilities he was in constant contact with business leaders within the community and that the grant was a reward for promoting economic growth throughout the District. The allocation of these funds would be dealt with through the Medium Term Financial Strategy (from July 2007 onwards). The Council would, as always, be consulting fully on the Medium Term Financial Strategy and this would include consultation with the business community. A key issue for the Council in determining strategy was the likely impact of the Comprehensive Spending Review 2007 (CSR07), which was repeatedly delayed by the Government. This would be a major influence on how this money was spent.

3. Question to the Cabinet Member for Planning and Transport from Councillor Philip Broadbank

'Would the Cabinet Member for Planning and Transport tell the Council

- 1) How many new on street Pay and Display parking spaces in Harrogate town centre has he approved since taking responsibility for Transport since May 2003 in total? And
- 2) What are the latest gross projected income figures from on street parking in Harrogate town centre for the financial year 2006/07 and the estimated gross income for 2007/08 from the same source?'

In respect of the additional on street Pay and Display parking spaces in Harrogate town centre approved since May 2003 the Cabinet Member advised that a total of 161 spaces had been introduced by May 2004, with a further 42 extra spaces approved and to be introduced by March 2007. In addition 40 more disc

spaces had been made available during that period giving a total of 2,500 free spaces available for use in 2007. With regard to the Pay and Display income the Cabinet Member advised that the projected income for 2006/07 was £1624.2K and the estimated gross income for 2007/08 was £1631.8K.

4. Question to the Leader of the Council from Councilor de Courcey-Bayley.

'Following the shocking Ombudsman's report into the case of planning maladministration by Members of the Administration, this Council voted, on 16 January 2007, in favour of a judicial review of the original planning decisions.

Will Councillor Gardner please bring Members up to date on the progress of this legal procedure by which this Council is having itself investigated to avoid the disastrous consequences of those planning decisions?'

In response to the question the Leader advised that Ombudsman Report 05/C/15424 related to the determinations of the Planning Committee.

Following confirmation from the Chief Solicitor with regard to the disclosure of the Council's action in seeking a Judicial Review of the decision the Leader of the Council reminded Members that the action in calling for such a Review was not one taken by the Council on 16 January 2007, rather one arising from a meeting of the Cabinet held on 3 January of that year convened by the Leader to address the situation and which, in doing so, had accepted all the recommendations contained within that Report as well as seeking Judicial Review of the matter. For purposes of clarity the Leader also wished to emphasise that there was only one Planning decision the subject of the Ombudsman Report and Review.

Councillor de Courcey-Bayley then asked the following supplementary question:

"The Judicial Review is expected to cost many thousands of pounds. Is there any truth in the rumour that you, Councillor Gardner have promised that the clearly identified members of your Group responsible for this unforeseen and unplanned waste of public money, will make good the final cost to the taxpayers of this District by handing back their Council Allowances; and if not, why not?"

The Leader advised that he did not respond to rumours.

86/06 - **MEMORANDA OF REPORT FROM OVERVIEW AND SCRUTINY COMMISSIONS:** There were no reports to be considered.

87/06 - **REPORT BACK ON PREVIOUS NOTICES OF MOTION:** In accordance with Standing Order 10 (6) (a), the Council considered the following reports on the Notices of Motion referred from Council at its meeting held on 6 December 2006.

87/06 (01) **NORTH YORKSHIRE AGENCY AREA LOCAL TRANSPORT PLAN:** The Cabinet Member for Planning and Transport submitted a written report arising from a Notice of Motion proposed by Councillor Marsh and seconded by Councillor Pat Marsh expressing concern over the level of the Local Transport Plan Budget for the agency area of Harrogate and Knaresborough. The Cabinet Member had met with the mover and seconder of the Motion to consider the impact of the budget cuts both on carriageways and footways in that there would be no carriageway resurfacing during the next financial year and footway reconstruction and resurfacing would be reduced by 80%. Council officers had expressed strong concerns to the County Council about the level of funding to be provided for capital highways maintenance schemes in the agency area as it became apparent that this was likely to be significantly reduced. The lobbying for increased monies had continued since the allocations were announced and a copy of a letter from the Cabinet Member in that regard was also attached to the written report. The impact of the budget cuts on the quality of the services that could be offered was worrying and the Cabinet Member advised that he would pursue the Executive Members at the County Council in order to obtain a fair share of the Highway Budget. He also encouraged all District Members also serving as County Councillors to support him in his work in lobbying for further funding.

87/06 (02) **TREATMENT OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE:** The Cabinet Member for Public Protection and Rural Affairs submitted a written report arising from a Notice of Motion proposed by Councillor Pat Marsh and seconded by Councillor Marsh calling upon the Department of Health to reject the NICE (The National Institute for Clinical Excellence) recommendation on limiting the availability of certain drugs to treat future patients with Alzheimer's Disease. In meeting subsequently with the mover and seconder of the Motion it had been agreed that the Cabinet Member write a letter to the Secretary of State for Health and the three local MPs asking for the recent NICE recommendations related to Alzheimer's drugs to be ignored and for GPs to be allowed to use their clinical knowledge and skills to prescribe Alzheimer's drugs based on health needs alone. A copy of the letter to the Secretary of State for Health was attached as Appendix A to the Cabinet Member's report.

87/06 (03) **RIPON SPA BATHS:** The Cabinet Member for Cultural Services submitted a written report arising from a Notice of Motion proposed by Councillor Hawke and seconded by Councillor Freeman bringing to the attention of the Council the concerns in the Ripon area regarding the general condition and impression of the Ripon Spa Baths and calling for a detailed inspection and report on the condition of those Baths. Section 2 of the report detailed the discussions held with the mover and seconder of the Motion at a meeting convened to consider the Notice.

The Cabinet Member advised that the condition of the Ripon Spa Baths and its future investment requirements were known and that this was forming part of a broader review of current resource allocation. Officers were currently undertaking further detailed analysis of operations across the whole of the Leisure, Museum and Arts service with a view to producing options for funding these investment needs. This would form the basis of a report back to Cabinet in the summer of 2007.

Councillor Hawke indicated that he was not minded to accept the report in the context of the Spa Baths being an outdated facility whose life was limited and that a new modern facility was now warranted to serve Ripon and the locality. In calling for a vote on the matter the Mayor drew Council's attention to the original Notice which asked for a detailed inspection and a report on the condition of the Ripon Spa Baths, as would be the case following completion of the resource allocation review currently under way across the whole spectrum of the Leisure, Museum and Arts service.

No evidence had been uncovered that the caravan had been used as a sole or main residence during the period for which it was unbanded.

e. for existing domestic dwellings, the Council commits itself, subject to budgetary pressures, to making a contribution towards the cost of Residents' planning applications for renewable energy installations while noting that the proposer and seconder of the motion did not submit this as part of their budget proposals and so must identify a funding stream and calls on them to do so during debate

f. this Council supports encouraging residents in new and existing developments, to use energy efficient lighting

g. this Council lobbies the government to allow photovoltaic cells to qualify as permitted development.

The mover and seconder of the original Motion signified their acceptance of the amendment with the exception of the additions to Part (e) after the words 'energy installations'.

The mover of the amendment, with the acceptance of the seconder, agreed to withdraw this part of the amendment and sought and received approval from Council to replace, in the introduction to the Notice of Motion the word 'shall' with the word 'should'.

Upon a vote being taken on the Notice as amended, the Mayor declared the Motion carried.

- (03) That this Council calls upon NYCC to enter into immediate negotiations with Northern Rail and Network Rail to provide new rail halts for Bilton and for Knaresborough East.

(04) This Council recognises that

1. Crime and the fear of crime remain major concerns of residents of the Harrogate District, in particular fuelled by the persistence of so-called low level crime and antisocial behaviour, the shortage of police officers on the beat, and the difficulty in getting an adequate response to incidents from an overstretched police force;
2. The general public's confidence in safely visiting by day and night all parts of the Harrogate District must be reinforced, in particular by tackling at source known centres of disorder;

3. Whilst partnership arrangements have led to better co-ordination between agencies on law-enforcement within the Council's area, these are hampered by lack of resources and appropriate powers locally and misdirected government policies nationally;

This Council notes that

1. More police officers on patrol are urgently needed, and could be provided by switching the billions of pounds being wasted on introducing the Government's ineffective national ID Card scheme to police budgets;
2. Local communities should have more power to close pubs and clubs that cause trouble within the Harrogate District area;
3. The national 5-point 'We Can Cut Crime' campaign includes these proposals with others designed to reduce crime, reduce the fear of crime and improve the quality of life within the community, and ensure any victims of crime are properly compensated, and therefore

This Council resolves to

1. Support the objectives of the national 'We Can Cut Crime' campaign;
2. Lobby the relevant Secretaries of State for the action proposed in that campaign, and for the additional powers and resources needed locally by Harrogate District Council and the Police to deliver its objectives, and calls on local Members of Parliament to support the campaign, and to write to Ministers accordingly.
