When considering access matters the North Yorkshire Local Access Forum works to the following principles:-

- 1. All rights of way should be maintained to the standard required and where appropriate upgraded physically and legally to a higher standard.
- 2. The Forum will work to see rights of way developed to redress the fragmentation of the network, connect communities and improve links to places of demand.
- 3. Any new access should be at the highest rights practicable.
- 4. The Forum will work to develop more access opportunities to include the widest possible range of users, especially families, children, minority groups and the less able.
- 5. The Forum seeks the establishment of an annual budget to fund the fulfilling of the Rights of Way Improvement Plan (RoWIP).
- 6. Whilst the creation of all access is welcomed, the Forum stresses that permissive (temporary) access does not equate with the public benefit of definitive (permanent) access.
- 7. The Forum wishes to raise awareness of how different users can enjoy responsible sharing of routes, whilst supporting appropriate challenges to illegal use.
- 8. The Forum recognises the establishment and challenges of new initiatives such as coastal access, access to water, access to woodland and dedication of land for public access.
- 9. The Forum supports the continuation of Best Value Performance Indicator for rights of way (BVPI 178) to measure the ease of use of rights of way in the county.
