#### PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY IMPROVEMENT PLAN PROGRESS

#### 1.0 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 Following the November meeting of the Forum, a report was requested on progress in implementing the Public Rights of Way Improvement Plan. This report provides an update on progress covering the current financial year.

#### 2.0 ROWIP IMPLEMENTATION

- 2.1 A requirement in producing the Plan was the inclusion of a statement of action, which identified specific actions contributing to the achievement of the 9 long term objectives.
- 2.2 Day to day maintenance and improvement works on the network have been built around the objectives of the plan and the following table maps achievements this year against the statement of action.
