#### PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY MAINTENANCE UPDATE

#### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To provide an update on maintenance work undertaken in the first part of this financial year.

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 This report covers the period 1 April 2010 to 8 November 2010.

#### 3.0 FIGURES

3.1 The Following table shows the number of issues handled:

- 3.2 Whilst the figures represent an increase in backlog, recent trends show that in the months of May, June, July & August the number of new reports traditionally exceeds the number resolved and this trend is usually reversed between September and April.
- 3.3 The figures for 1<sup>st</sup> September to date show that 522 issues were logged and 577 resolved, reflecting what is expected to be the trend for the remainder of the financial year.
- 3.4 Work within particular workstreams has continued and details are set out below.

#### 4.0 PLOUGHING AND CROPPING

- 4.1 During the Spring 2010 survey, 123 routes were inspected and 93 of these passed the inspection. Of the remainder landowners were asked to complete the necessary reinstatements and a re-inspection resulted in 10 notices being served. None of these notices had to be acted upon.
- 4.2 The autumn survey has just commenced and a total of 135 routes are being surveyed. We will once again follow up any route not reinstated.

4.3 Following concern at previous meetings, this year's reminder letter highlighted to landowners that routes must be reinstated to the full legal width. Any routes not complying will be followed up with landowners.

#### 5.0 SEASONAL UNDERGROWTH

5.1 This years' seasonal undergrowth cutting programme was completed between May and October, in total 275km of route was cut, with each route receiving 2 cuts through the season. The Yorkshire Wolds Way National Trail, which is funded by Natural England, received 3 cuts.

#### 6.0 BRIDGES

6.1 This year has seen the completion of bridges at the following locations:

Askwith – SE188517 Thornthwaite - SE160297

These helped to facilitate the completion of the 6 Dales Trail which is covered on a separate agenda item.

Work is continuing on the replacement of Ridge Mill Bridge in Cowling and it is anticipated that this major structure will be completed by the end of the financial year.

The Countryside Rangers have carried out 10 significant repair schemes across the network.

#### 7.0 CONCLUSIONS

- 7.1 This work contributes to the enjoyment of our network and the improvement is highlighted in Appendix 1, which shows some examples of the work completed
- 7.2 It is recommended that members receive this report for information.
