
CCCUPATION RCAD of the width of twenty four feet commencing at the East end of Hauber I are and leading in a south easterly and easterly direction to the south west corner of an allotment set out to the Jector of Thornton for Glebe thence in an easterly direction across the same allotment and another allotment also set out to the said Rector for tithes to the north east corner of an allotment sold to Sir John Lister Kaye and thence in a south easterly direction to the north end of the Ventcliffe Head Poad which road I distinguish by the name of HAUBER I ANE FCAD CNE CTHER PRIVATE CARRIAGE AND CCCUPATION ECAD of the width of twenty one feet commencing at Moor Cate Poad near Thick Bank and leading in an easterly direction.





The alignment of the footpath prior to the 2007 Diversion Order








over Kelbrook Moor to the north end of Cob Lane which road I distinguish by the name of MCCR GATE PCAD CNE CTHFF PUBLIC BRIDLE AND CARRIAGE FCAD AND HIGHWAY of the width of thirty feet commencing at an ancient gate in the lands late belonging to Henry Alcock Fsquire near Dodgson House and leading in a south easterly direction across Thornton Moor to the Colne and Skipton Turnpike Foad in the Township of Lothersdale and which road I distinguish by the name of DCDGSCN HCUSE PCAD CNE PRIVATE CARRIAGE AND CCCUPATION PCAD of the width of Thirty feet commencing at Dodgson House Road on Bleary Moor and leading in a north westerly direction across allotments sold to Letter Countries.






