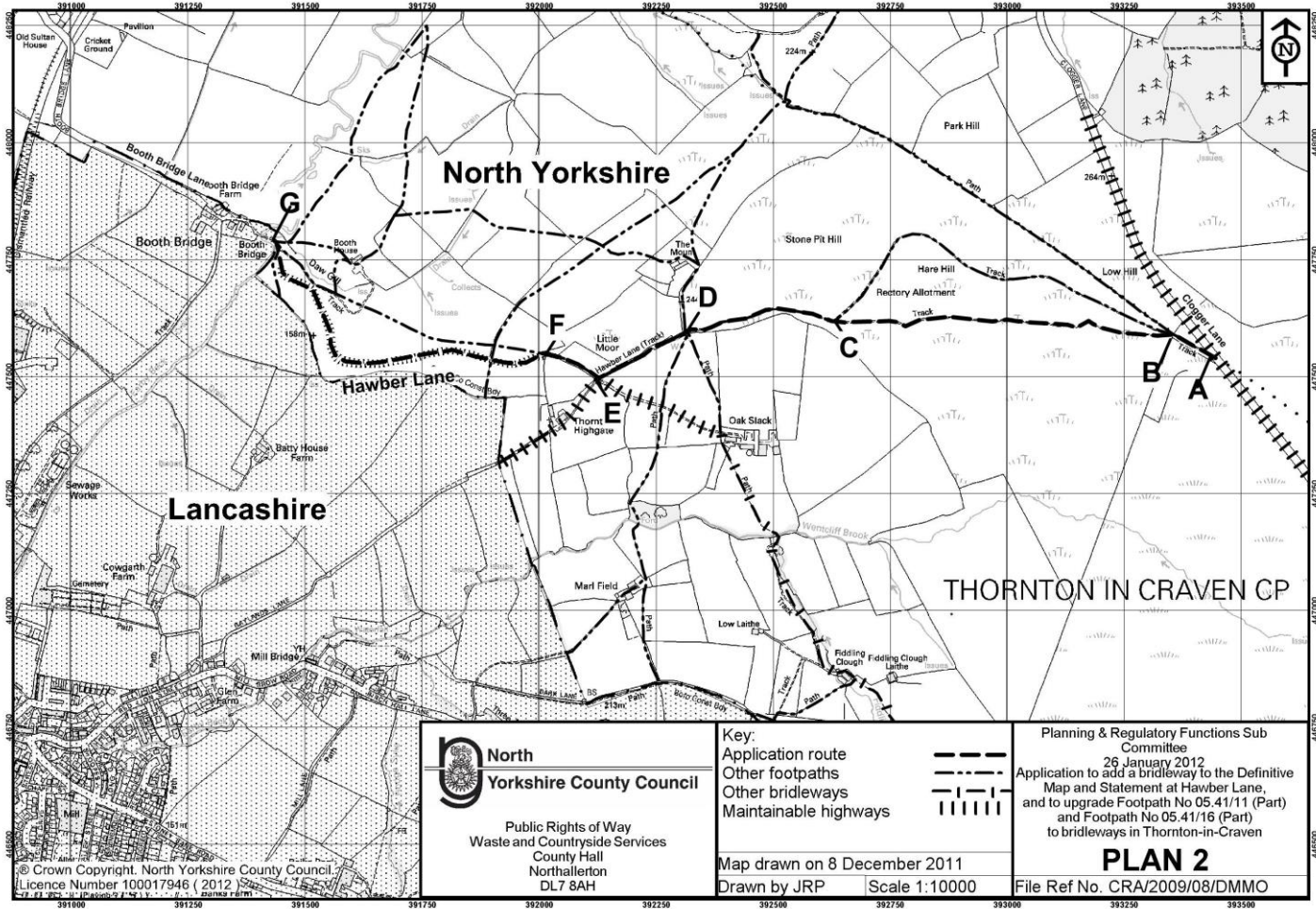

LOCATION PLAN

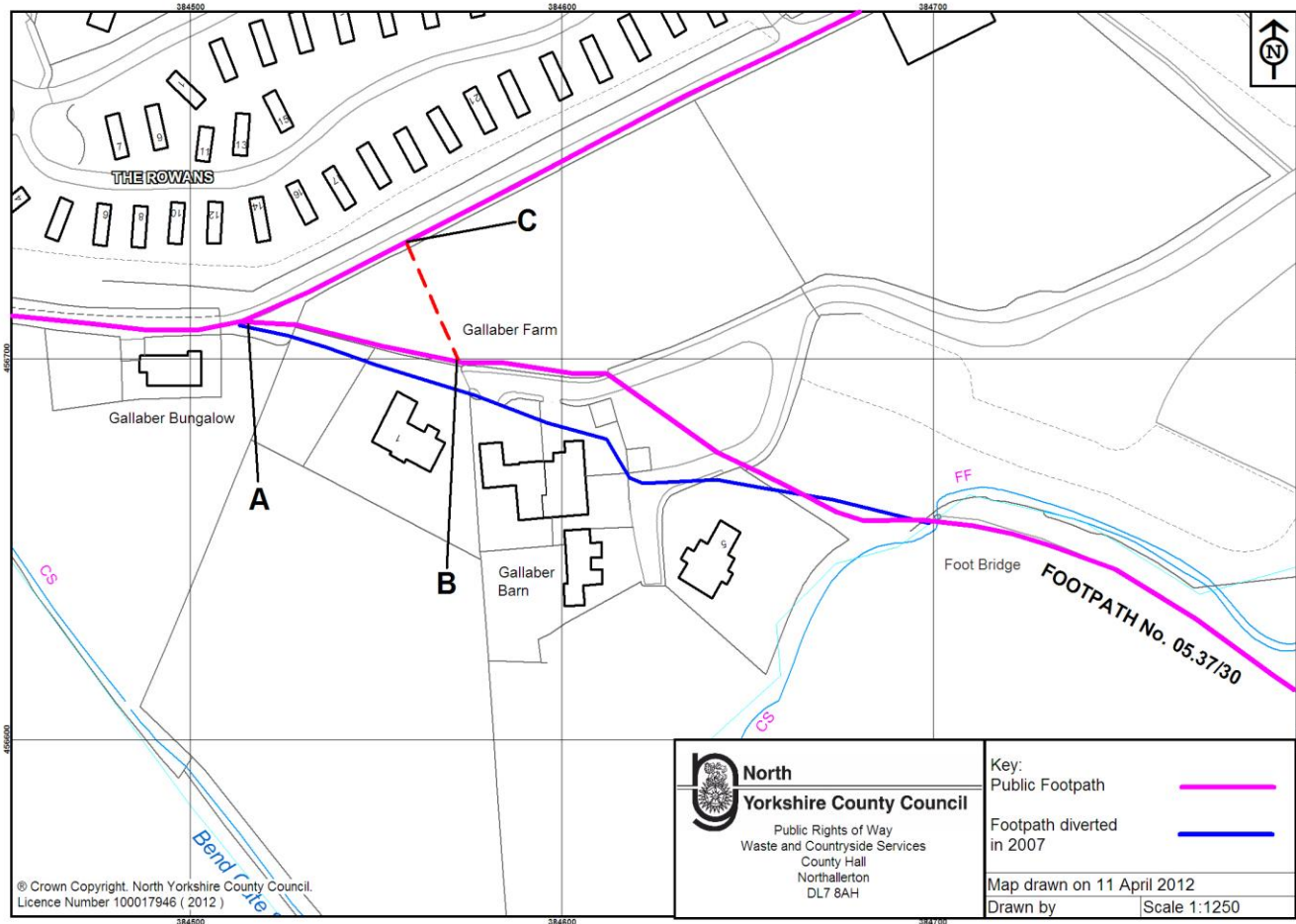

do solemnly and sincerely declare as follows:

1. Over a period of 16 years I have regularly walked along the bank of the River Nidd from the point marked A on the sketch-map above, where the start of a footpath is still visible, to the point marked B, near the garden wall of the house known as The Abbey.
2. As the ground in this area is hard, dry and mostly free of grass, there is no visible path along the river-bank itself. But the dotted line shown above marks the approximate route I have followed, either from A to B or in the reverse direction.
3. This right-of-way along the river-bank has been enjoyed by the people of, Knaresborough from time immemorial, and it could easily be restored if the present owner, who has recently erected the wooden fence, unlocked the gate at point B and allowed access at point A.
