WARD AFFECTED: Weapness and Ramshill, Castle

SUBJECT: SCARBOROUGH CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

RECOMMENDATION (S):

That the Portfolio Holder for Quality of Life approves the entering into a contract with Blachere Illuminations UK for the three year hire of Christmas Lighting Scarborough Town for the sum of £89,000.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION(S):

To continue to provide a Christmas lighting scheme for Scarborough Town Centre and Ramshill Road.

HIGHLIGHTED RISKS:

Delay in approving the scheme will result in no Christmas lights in the town centre and on Ramshill Road as previously provided.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The current contract for the provision of Christmas lights came to an end in 2020.

- 1.2 Tenders have recently been sought for the hire of Christmas Lights for a three year period and Blachere Illuminations have been chosen as the preferred supplier due to the scheme, price and experience in providing festive lighting.

2. CORPORATE AIMS

- 2.1 The project will support the following corporate plan objectives

Better Places – By providing an attractive environment over the Christmas period

Vibrant Town Centre – Ensuring that the town centre remains attractive during the festive period

Vibrant Culture and Heritage Officer – Ensuring that the town is attractive to visitors during their stay over the festive period

3. BACKGROUND AND ISSUES

- 3.1 The existing Christmas lighting scheme for the Town Centre and Ramshill Road came to an end in 2019 following a three year contract. A one year contract was subsequently awarded in 2020 due to COVID restrictions and the Council's decision to suspend longer term contracts.
- 3.2 In order to ensure a Christmas lighting scheme is provided for future years, a tender exercise has been carried out for the hire of Christmas lighting for a three year period.
- 3.3 Following evaluation of the tenders, Blachere Illuminations have been chosen as the preferred supplier of the scheme see Appendix A.
- 3.4 Blachere Illuminations have been developing, designing and manufacturing Christmas lights since 1973 and have previously very successfully supplied Scarborough Borough Council with Christmas Lighting.
- 3.5 The lighting proposal will ensure that residents and visitors to Scarborough have an enjoyable Christmas experience when shopping and enjoying hospitality in the Town Centre and on Ramshill Road.

4. ASSESSMENT

- 4.1 Blachere Illuminations are a well-established festive lighting company and the proposed scheme will enhance the aesthetics of the town during the Christmas period.


