End of Life Care and 'Dying Well' Progress report on in-depth scrutiny

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on the progress that has been made to date with the in-depth scrutiny that the Scrutiny of Health Committee is undertaking on End of Life Care (EoLC) across North Yorkshire.

Members are asked to review the progress to date, seek clarifications and make suggestions for further lines of enquiry.

Background

- 1. At the 1 July 2016 Scrutiny of Health Committee meeting, the initial framework for this piece of in-depth scrutiny was agreed by Members. At the last meeting of the Scrutiny of Health Committee on 2 September 2016, the project plan was formally signed off. What follows is a summary of the progress that has been made to date.
- 2. The intention is to submit the final version of the report into the in-depth scrutiny of End of Life Care in North Yorkshire to the Report to the Health and Wellbeing Board on 17 March 2017. A series of recommendations will be made.

Work to date

- 3. Since the last meeting of the Scrutiny of Health Committee on 1 July 2016, the following activities have been undertaken to progress this in-depth piece of scrutiny:
 - Ongoing development and refinement of the project plan as it is implemented and new data, information and analysis is gathered
 - Meetings with North Yorkshire County Council lead officers across Health and Adult Services, Children and Young Peoples Services and Public Health
 - Discussions with the five North Yorkshire Clinical Commissioning Groups about their approach to commissioning End of Life Care Services
 - Discussions and feedback from a series of expert witnesses
 - Finalisation of 3 site visits to hospices in Harrogate, Scarborough and York
 - Work with North Yorkshire Healthwatch on developing a process to capture the views of the public on the End of Life Care that is available in North Yorkshire
 - Initial drafting of the final report, with the identification of the emergent issues.
