CEF Funding Opportunities

Selby District is divided into 5 Community Engagement areas.

Each CEF area has a Partnership Board with an annual budget that it can use to award grants and project funds to community groups and organisations.

The Eastern CEF covers a large rural area including the following parishes: Barlby. Biggin, Cawood, Cliffe, Escrick, Hemingbrough, Kelfield, Lund, North Duffield, Osgodby, Riccall, Ryther, Skipwith, South Duffield, Stillingfleet, Thorganby and Wistow

What is the Community Engagement Forum?

Community Engagement Forums are public meetings at which you can raise any concern or make any comment about your local area and your local services.

The Community Forum meetings give you a chance to speak directly to the people who deliver your local services, for example policing, street cleaning and road safety. This is a chance for you to have your say about the issues that are important to you and the place where you live.

The Partnership Board meetings are where funding applications are discussed and necessary decisions are made for the furtherance of forum business. The Partnership Board is made up of District, County and Parish Councillors, and co-opted members of the community.

What is the Community Fund?

Each CEF receives an annual budget that it can distribute to groups and organisations within its own CEF area. There are two types of funding available; grant funding and project funding.

What sort of projects can CEF fund?

Each CEF has developed its own Community Development Plan (CDP) which focus on areas of priority for that community. Applications for funding must show that they meet one or more of the objectives on that CEF's CDP.

Our Community Development Plan focuses on the following overarching priorities;

- · Highlight and act upon local issues
- Support our villages to provide a vibrant range of activities
- Encourage involvement and volunteering in our community
- Address transport issues
- · Encourage information sharing between communities, activities and organisations
- Address issues of loneliness and isolation
- · Increase activities for young people
