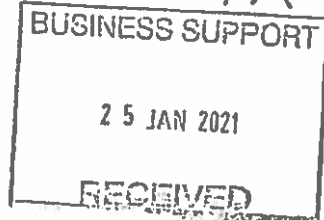

The UK like most other countries around the World has fallen victim to the Pandemic Disease, Covid 19. In the UK, the government has introduced various Regulations since March 2020 in an effort to stop the spread of the virus, reduce the number of deaths and stop infection rates. Some of these regulations have resulted in financial and economic hardship for many sectors across the country, but the government has deemed the measures were necessary in an effort to fight the virus.

This application for a review of a Premises Licence relates to The Bay Horse Selby, where North Yorkshire Police believe the both the Premise Licence Holder, and Designated Premises Supervisor, has deliberately operated in contravention of the Health Protection Regulations since 4th July 2020. Their actions have shown a total disregard for the wider community implications of breaching regulations during a national Pandemic and has been, focused purely on own financial gains. North Yorkshire Police consider this is a serious matter that undermines the following licensing objective:-

**The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
Public Safety and,
The Prevention of Public Nuisance,**

The Bay Horse, is a licensed premises located within Selby Town centre, and operates as a bar, with accommodation available on the first floor to lease, Number of rooms available is 4.

The Bay Horse is licensed for the following Licensable Activities:-

Sale by Retail of Alcohol
Monday – Sunday 0700 x 0400

Provision of regulated entertainment

Monday – Sunday 0700 x 0400

Provision of Late night Refreshment

Monday – Sunday 2300 x 0400

North Yorkshire Police are concerned that the failure to ensure compliance with the Health Protection Regulations by both the Premise Licence Holder Campey Estates Limited and the DPS (who is _____ of the Premise Licence holder) are contributing to the spread of the virus. They are ignoring the rules set to help reduce the threat of this virus, which places both its customers, staff in danger and threatens their safety, which then widens to the safety of their families and the communities they live in.

By breaching the regulations, they have committed a criminal offence, which engages the Prevention of Crime and Disorder Licensing objective.

The sub-committee is entitled to take robust, appropriate and proportionate steps to prevent this operator from further undermining the licensing objective and North Yorkshire Police would respectfully request the sub-committee revoke the Premises Licence.

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note:

Following the national lockdown instructed by the government in March 2020 due to the Coronavirus pandemic, The Coronavirus Health Protection Regulations 2020 came into force. These Regulations required the closure of specified businesses in which food and drink are sold for consumption on its premises, (though allowing for selling of the same to be consumed off the premises). The relevant businesses included public houses.

On 4th July the Government reopened pubs with specific guidance, including track and trace, table service and social distancing measures in place. Following this announcement North Yorkshire Police and the Licensing Authority engaged in joint visits to licensed premises to explain the guidance and check premises were complying with the new rules.

Timeline of Engagement/Reports

On 4th July 20: _____ Selby Neighbourhood policing team _____
_____ Selby Licensing Manger (SDC) and _____ Environmental Health Selby District Council, attended the premise as part of a number of post lockdown checks, in Selby, discussions and advice provided to staff in line with current regulations and guidance.

On the 4th July 2020 at 21:17 hrs officers were flagged down by a member of door staff at The Bay Horse who stated he had been assaulted. Whilst escorting a male from the premises another male approached from behind and punched the door man in the face causing reddening to his face and a

bloody nose. The male was arrested for a Section 47 assault, he admitted the offence and received a caution. The premises said that they would close for the evening. (APPENDIX 1)

At 21:41 on the same day (4th July 2020) another incident occurred at the premises and another male was arrested for an assault. The victim did not wish to pursue a prosecution and as there was no CCTV evidence available at the premises the male was de arrested. The officers raised concerns regarding the lack of CCTV and also no social distancing, despite a multi-agency visit earlier in the day to discuss the current regulations and guidance. (APPENDIX 2)

On 9th July 20²⁰ _____ Selby Licensing Officer _____ Police Licensing Manager, _____ Licensing Manager (SDC), and _____ Environmental Health (SDC), attended the premise to speak with _____ who was in process of applying to become the new Designated Premise Supervisor.

Covid Risk assessments and Covid measures were checked by Environmental Health Officers, and in line with guidance the following measures had been put in place:

One way system, track and trace sign in sheet and sanitising station at the door. One in one out policy and one person in toilet at a time. Clear signage _____ had applied to become the DPS and was the person in charge of the premises at the time of the visit.

On 23rd July 2020 [redacted] Police Licensing Officers, attended the premises, after a complaint was received of the roof terrace being used which did not form part of the licensed area. The DPS [redacted] confirmed that the roof terrace was used on the first weekend after lockdown when they reopened, to spread customers out. [redacted] was advised to submit a variation application if it was to form part of the licensable plan and was advised to liaise with Selby District Council Licensing Department. (APPENDIX 3)

On 25th July 2020 a report of an assault was received at the premise whereby an SIA registered door man is arrested for a Section 18 assault whilst on duty at the premises. The investigation is still ongoing and awaiting a charging decision from the Crown Prosecution Service. CCTV is installed at the premises and was requested as part of the criminal investigation however, the cameras outside where the incident occurred were not working. (APPENDIX 4)

On 28th July 2020: [redacted] visit following SIA door staff arrest. Speak with DPS, [redacted] reference CCTV at the premises. They state they have a system however it wasn't fully working and the outside cameras were not working at the time of the incident. [redacted] advised that CCTV is there to promote the Licensing objective of prevention of crime and disorder, and if it is installed it should be working, to protect the public and staff, although this is not a condition of the premise licence

On 29th July 2020 Email sent by Selby District Council reference roof terrace and tables and chairs on the highway (no Pavement café licence) or permission to use the highway. The Premise licence only allows "ON" sales and the pavement is not included in the premise plans, PLH1 [redacted] of Campey Estates Limited, stated the highway was part of the premise (APPENDIX 5)

On 1st August 2020 Covid complaint stating premises was full and no covid rules being followed – sent to Selby District Council as lead authority at the time for Covid reports (APPENDIX 6)

On 1st October 2020 [redacted] (SDC), visit the premise after report of 3 possible pubs allegedly opening until the early hours during covid restrictions on businesses. CCTV spot checked by [redacted] and Assistant Manager [redacted] from Saturday 26th September 2020, and premises was shown to be closed at 23.30 hours. This was the only date checked at the time. (10pm closures in place at this time).

On 3rd December 2020 [redacted], Selby District Council visit following new regulations, (Tier system) whereby Selby was placed in tier 2. DPS, [redacted] stated she was opening at 9am daily until 11pm and food was delivered by outside caterers at 10.30am and again at 12.30pm, these consisted of breakfast sandwiches and platters, which were kept behind the bar in insulated boxes. [redacted] then dished out food after lunch and stayed into the evening daily. [redacted] was asked if this delivery could be brought forward as alcohol would be served between 9am – 10.30am without food. [redacted] showed [redacted] a text received from the outside caterer stating, she could get it earlier but only if the shop counter wasn't busy. This was raised as a concern to [redacted] who stated she could get more deliveries if needed. (APPENDIX 7)

On 4th December 2020 Covid report received stating no regulations were being followed in premises (Tier 2 regs). (APPENDIX 8)

On 5th December 2020 Covid report received reference a lock in allegedly evidenced on social media. (APPENDIX 9)

On 11th December 2020: [redacted] SDC Licensing Manager, visited the premise as part of a joint operation between North Yorkshire Police and Selby District Council.

Upon entering the premise at 18:45 hours, groups of up to 6 people observed seated at tables with one paper plate of food in the middle of each table. Food on the plates consisted of 2 triangles of sandwiches, small samosas and crisps for one person, this was between 6 people. Due to concern over this a return visit was made at 22:25 hours after officer had visited a number of other licensed premises in Selby. Upon attending the premise a large group of males was seen in the snug area from outside and could be seen standing, shouting and at one point hugging and their faces touching while holding what looked to be an alcoholic drink in a pint glass.

_____ requested the presence of uniformed Officers to attend in order to enter the premises safely and to be easily identified as Police Officers, as Licensing Officers and Council Officers were in plain clothes to reduce any risk of confrontation.

The front door of the premise was locked and officers entered via the back door. Upon entering a group of 18 people in total, 16 males and 2 females, were counted in the snug area of the premise situated opposite the bar. They were all sat on bench seating, all with alcohol and no food, no social distancing, no screens and no regard to regulations. _____ spoke with the person in charge, who identified herself as _____, and asked why there was a large group sat together with no food. _____ stated she had not seen them all come in and was covering for the DPS _____ as she was at her other pub.

_____ phoned _____ on her mobile while at the premise, to inform her of what had been found. _____ stated she was at the _____ and was having to self-isolate due to being in contact with a person who had tested positive for covid 19.

On 15th December 2020 _____ spoke with _____ over the phone who gave NYP / SDC permission to view the CCTV at the premise following the joint visit on 11th December 2020, as this does not form part of the licence conditions. _____ stated she was self isolating so wouldn't be in attendance at the premises but her _____ and the PLH, _____ was on site.

_____ both viewed the CCTV from 11th December in the snug area, to check footage prior to officers entering the premises, and to ensure no alcohol sales were conducted after 10pm. No alcohol sales seen on the CCTV at the bar area opposite the snug. The snug area camera was not working and the camera was showing no video along with one other camera. All other cameras were working. The PLH, _____ was also present at this point. The CCTV was also one hour fast. The Assistant Manager _____ was informed of this and why this was important if any further incidents were recorded. _____ informed _____ if CCTV was installed it should be working and show correct date and time to promote licensing objectives. _____ stated she would try and change the time.

_____ then spoke with Manger on duty at the premises, _____ the same female who had been present on 11th December, reference how they were serving food. _____ stated that customers can stay as long as they want as long as they order food at breakfast and lunch and this is how she was doing it. No limit on drinks no requirement for customers to leave once their meal was finished. This was raised with _____ as a concern.

On 15th December 2020 North Yorkshire Police Licensing were informed that Selby Environmental Health had issued a £1000 FPN for covid breaches, witnessed by NYP and SDC on 11th December. The FPN was hand delivered to premises by _____ Enforcement Officer SDC and _____ SDC Licensing Manager. A copy was also emailed to DPS _____ as she was not on site due to self-isolating, to ensure the FPN had been served. (APPENDIX 11)

On 16th December 2020 _____ sent the DPS, _____ an email of a timeline of engagement between the premises, North Yorkshire Police and the Licensing Authority.

On the 18th December 2020 a report was received at 20:33 stating that the pub was not adhering to any of the Covid guidelines (APPENDIX 13)

On the 19th December 2020 at 18:11hrs _____ attended the Bay Horse to speak with _____ regarding a complaint she had made regarding police and COVID 19 visits. This visit was recorded on the Sergeants body worn camera and shows groups sat together drinking, lack of social distancing and SIA registered door staff and bar staff with no masks. _____ has provided a statement of his visit. (APPENDIX 14)

On 30th December 2020 a report was received at 20:50 hours, stating that there was no social distancing, no masks, no food and sandwiches had been laid out on tables for anyone to take and was a free for all. No food needed to be purchased to get a drink. (APPENDIX 15)

_____ attended the premises and their statements are attached.
(APPENDIX 16 & 17)

_____ (Police licensing officer) has attended the Bay Horse on multi agency visits and his statement is attached as APPENDIX 18

In conclusion, best practice and management of Licensed Premises advises a stepped approach of engagement with operators and responsible authorities to ensure measures are in place to promote the Licensing Objectives, with the aim of avoiding a Review of the Premises Licence.

The breaches evidenced in this review, are not one off events, a lack of understanding of complex legislation or misunderstandings of changing rules by the operator. The breaches have continued to occur, despite a stepped approach of engagement, advice, warnings and the premise being issued with a fine following a serious coronavirus breach and therefore leaving North Yorkshire Police no option than to seek a review of the premises licence.

This approach was conducted over the course of a 5 month period, to afford the DPS and PLH an opportunity to work with the Police and Licensing Authority to ensure compliance with the premises Licence conditions, promotion of the Licensing objectives and compliance with the Health Protection guidance and regulations in relation to coronavirus.

The Licensing objectives and the Health Protection Act, have been put in place to mitigate risk, and stop the spread of a potentially fatal virus.

The DPS and PLH have shown no regard to any advice given by the Police or Licensing Authority, and have continued to act in a manner that is reckless and negligent.

It is believed that if the Premises are allowed to retain a Premise Licence this will have an adverse effect on the local community during this pandemic and the Licensing Objectives will continue to be undermined as a result.

It is the view of North Yorkshire Police that the Premises Licence should be revoked.

Following the joint visit to the Bay Horse, Selby yesterday morning, by North Yorkshire Police Licensing and Selby Council Officers, concerns have been raised by all parties present in relation to how you are operating in regard to the following regulations:

'The Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (All Tiers) (England) Regulations 2020

Restrictions on service of food and drink for consumption on the premises

13.—(1) A person responsible for carrying on a restricted business, or providing a restricted service, in the Tier 2 area that falls within paragraph 15(2) and which serves alcohol for consumption on the premises may sell food or drink for consumption on the premises only if—

(a) the food or drink is ordered by, and served to, a customer who is seated on the premises, and

(b) the person takes all reasonable steps to ensure that the customer remains seated whilst consuming the food or drink on the premises.

(2) A person responsible for carrying on a restricted business, or providing a restricted service, in the Tier 2 area that falls within paragraph 15(2) and which does not serve alcohol for consumption on the premises may sell food or drink for consumption on the premises only if the person takes all reasonable steps to ensure that the customer remains seated whilst consuming the food or drink on the premises.

(3) For the purposes of sub-paragraphs (1) and (2), an area adjacent to the premises of the restricted business or restricted service, where seating is made available for its customers (whether or not by the business or the provider of the service), or which its customers habitually use for consumption of food or drink served by the business or service, is to be treated as part of the premises of that business or service.

(4) If a business or service falling within paragraph 15(2) ("business A") forms part of a larger business ("business B")—

(a) sub-paragraph (1)(a) does not apply to the service of food or drink if the condition in sub-paragraph (5) is met, and

(b) the person responsible for carrying on business B complies with the requirement in sub-paragraph (1) or (2) if that person complies with the requirement in relation to business A.

I can say prior to attending the premises and because I was dealing with a complaint about the police and previous visits that has been made to the premises regarding various covid-19 restrictions breaches, I made the conscious decision that if I witnesses any Covid -19 regulation breaches that I would not be dealing with them whilst on the premises but would record them on my body worn video (BWV) and report them to the licensing department and Selby council enforcement team.

I visited The Bay Horse an Saturday 19th December 20020 at 1811hrs in company with _____ and spoke to _____ I introduced myself and explained that I was there to discuss her complaint and to address the issues she had raised.

I explained to _____ that I was aware of all the occasions when the Police (local and licensing) had attended her premises and that the visits initially took place as a collaborative visit along with our council enforcement colleagues to check for covid compliance. I was aware that on each visit there were no more than 2 police officers (uniformed and plain clothes) and 2 council enforcement staff. She stated she also had been visited by 2 CID

officers, I informed her that to the best of my knowledge she had not been visited by any CID officers but that any NYP staff who had attended in plain clothes would have been licensing officers.

Since my visit I have since discovered that _____ who is a council enforcement officer had attended the premises. _____ is an ex North Yorkshire Police officer who worked within the CID department and is very well known in the Selby area. _____ had spoken with a customer of The Bay Horse when he attended on 11/12/20 in his council enforcement capacity. Having spoken with _____ he informed me that the customer he had spoken to whilst within The Bay Horse knew him as he had dealt with the customer on a number of occasions whilst working for NYP and that this customer may have still thought _____ was employed by NYP and this may have led to _____ thinking CID had attended per premises.

I explained to _____ that on no occasions have any more than 2 NYP officers attended her premises, which she accepted.

I advised her that she had not been visited by NYP officers every day.

I explained to _____ that NYP officers have a legitimate reason to attend her premises to check for Covid compliance as we have a duty of care to her, her staff, her customers and the general public in line with public Health Protection Regulations. I have explained that NYP understands she has a business to run and that we appreciate what a difficult year this must have been for her financially but that we have a duty to perform to protect the public. I explained that we have not only visited her premise but have visited other premises within Selby town centre and surrounding rural areas, and that she was not the only person to be issued with a non-compliance fine but that another premises had also been fined, she stated at this point she was aware that _____ had also been fined. I explained it was not NYP who had issued the fine but Selby District Council who had issued the fine.

I explained to _____ that when we initially conducted our visit on 11/12/20 numerous Covid compliance breaches were discovered and advice was offered to allow for a greater understanding of the regulations and to allow changes to take place. I explained that I wanted to work with her with a view to reducing the number of police and council enforcement visits, I explained in order to achieve this she had to become more Covid compliant and once we were satisfied the regulations were being followed the visits would reduce. She stated she was trying to follow the rules but found the rules very difficult to understand. I outlined to _____ that whilst walking through the premises prior to speaking with her I had seen that the premises were very busy and there appeared to still be various Covid breaches. She informed me she had employed door men to assist her in enforcing the regulations but that she found it difficult to ascertain who lives together and who doesn't. I handed _____ a copy of the attached letter which explains the regulations and what assistance she could access to understand the rules, I can exhibit this letter as exhibit LPM/2.

Prior to leaving the location I asked _____ if I had addressed all of her concerns and if there was any further questions she had of me or any further assistance I could offer, she informed

me that I had answered all of her questions and thanked me for my visit. I provided _____ with my details and explained my role as the neighbourhood policing sergeant for Selby town centre and advised her that if I could be of any assistance in the future all she had to do was call me. _____ thanked me for my help and I left the premises.

The whole of my visit to The Bay Horse and my interaction with _____ was captured on my body worn video which I can exhibit as LPM/1.

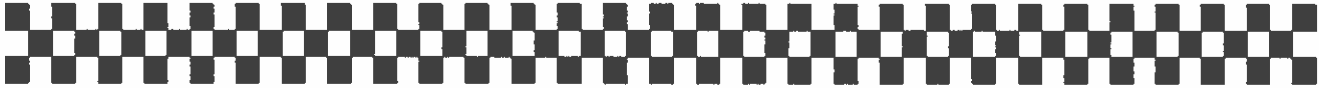

On Wednesday 30th December 2020 I was on duty in full uniform, I was not wearing a Body Worn Video, as there were none available due to some being out of commission and those serviceable were needed by other officers.

I had finished scene guard on FINKLE STREET in Selby, and on my way back to the Police Station with _____ When at 2110hrs I was asked by the Control Room to attend the Bay Horse Public house on Micklegate in Selby, the report was that there was about 20 people in the Bay Horse public house that was not social distancing and not wearing masks, The Bay Horse is a licenced premise that should be adhering to the Tier 2 legislation.

looking around I can say that there was about 4 – 5 tables to the left of the main door that had around 4 - 5 persons which were mainly males on each table, I cannot say whether they are from the same household. the tables did not seem to be 2 metres apart and did not have any screens between each table or any back to back seating, from my observations no one at the tables were wearing masks or social distancing and I noticed beer glasses on the tables. I can also say that looking around I could not see anyone sat at the bar and could not see food on any tables or the bar area, I also noticed that there was no cutlery at all anywhere in view. To the right of the door which seemed to be the dining area I could see cutlery on 2 tables although there did not seem to be many in that part of the premise. I am Police Community Support Office _____, of North Yorkshire Police currently stationed at SELBY POLICE STATION. On Wednesday the 30th of December 2020 I was on duty in full uniform. At approximately 21:10hrs I was on duty in full uniform in company with PCSO _____ when I received a call to attend the BAY HORSE Public House which is a licence premise on MICKLEGATE, SELBY due to reports of around 20 people in the premises not wearing masks or socially distancing which was in-breach of Tier 2 Coronavirus restrictions in NORTH YORKSHIRE.

I arrived at the BAY HORSE Public House at around 21:15hrs. I walked towards the premises; there was nobody stood outside and no security present. I walked through the front door and walked towards the bar. Whilst making my way towards the bar I noticed on my left was a wall which then opened up to a seating area. I looked to my left and identified around 5 tables, each table had people sat around them. I would say that some tables had in excess of 5 people sat around them. The seating area was very cramped with minimal distancing between tables and chairs. In some cases I would say different table groups were almost touching. There had been no effort to divide the tables with a physical screen and I also felt that the air in the premises was heavy and damp which indicated a lack of ventilation.

I stood at the bar and saw 2 female staff members behind the bar. One female was white with dark brown hair and the other female was white with blonde hair worn in a shorter fashion, both were wearing masks. I initially spoke with the dark haired female who was pouring a pint of beer. I said;

"WE HAVE HAD A REPORT OF CORONAVIRUS REGULATIONS BREACHES AT THIS PUB"

to which she gave no response.

—"DO YOU THINK ALL THESE PEOPLE LIVE TOGETHER"

I gestured towards the busy tables one of which had around 5 males sat so close they were touching legs. The member of staff responded,

"WE CANNOT CHECK ID'S FOR ADDRESSES". At this stage, the second female interjected who was also preparing a drink. I believe this female to be identifiable from the body worn video (BWV) footage dated 19/12/20 from PS _____ linked to the original log NYP-30122020-0387 and exhibited as LPM/1. The female is visible at 18:12hrs.

This female said "I WILL SPACE OUT SOME OF THE TABLES"

I responded "I WILL HAVE TO REPORT THIS TO LICENCING".

The atmosphere in the pub was loud and a lot of the people drinking were adult males who were talking loudly, flushed in the face and seemed intoxicated. On the tables I was unable to identify any substantial food; however I did see numerous drinks glasses, some of which were empty on all the tables. As alluded to previously, the staff were pouring further drinks as I was speaking with them and could see no food being served.

I felt that the atmosphere in the pub was tense with groups of adults and no family groups from what I saw. Given that myself and _____ have no personal protective equipment (PPE) to protect ourselves if confrontation should erupt I felt it pertinent to withdraw from the premises to protect myself and my colleague. Myself and

_____ both agreed that the situation could easily become unmanageable. Once outside the premises : _____ reported our findings back to the force control room (FCR) who responded "OKAY". I knew that we had a lack of available police officers in SELBY at that time due to high commitments as a serious incident had taken place the

previous day and had caused most resources to be utilised. This was part of my thought process when considering a response. I also had no body worn camera as none had been available when I started my shift at 1500hrs that day due to most BWV units being repaired.

I am PC _____ of North Yorkshire Police. I am currently attached to the Licensing Unit based at Fulford Road Police Station, York.

On Friday 11th December 2020 I was part of a joint licensing operation working with officers from Selby District Council. We conducted a number of licensing visits at various premises in the Selby area. I was responsible for conducting a number of licensed premises checks in the town centre area. I was in plain clothes for the operation and in company with _____ (SDC enforcement officer) and PC _____ Selby SNT (in uniform)

At about 22:20 hrs PC _____ and I attended the Bay Horse public house Selby _____ had attended the premises earlier in the evening, around 18:30hrs, with _____ Selby District Council licensing officer. A number of officers attended the premises at this time including _____ SDC, _____ SDC, _____ SDC, _____ SDC. The purpose of the return visit was to ensure compliance with regulations regarding no sale of alcohol after 22:00hrs and closure of the premises by 23:00hrs. We stood directly outside the pub, I could see it was very busy in the room (snug) to the right side of the front door as I was looking at it. There was a window open in the snug and I could clearly hear lots of noise coming from the room. I had a good view of the premises. The area was well lit. I went right up to the pub window to look inside. The bottom section of glass in the windows was frosted / coloured and sign written. I could see through gaps in the design. The room was full of people. I saw two males stood up hugging each other. There didn't appear to be any social distancing being observed and it looked as though there were far too many people in the room. I stepped back from the window and re-joined my colleagues. Moments later two females walked past the front of the pub. I watched them walk past the front door, approached and the side door / fire exit to the premises, open the door, walked through and disappeared from view. I went and checked the pub's front door and found it was locked. The premises was open, it appeared quite busy. The door should not have been locked. Being so could have put pub customers at risk.

We decided to enter the premises. I flagged down a passing police van, identified myself and asked if the officers would assist us going into the pub. PC _____ and SC _____ parked their vehicle and joined us outside the premises. We explained our concerns re breach of covid regulations to them. We then entered the premises. I went in first and used the side gate / fire escape as I had seen the two females do moments earlier. I went in to the bar and identified myself to a door supervisor who was stood by the inner front door and next to the snug. This male I now know to be _____ SIA badge number _____, he was not wearing a face mask / covering. I would estimate I saw between 18-20 people in the snug area, most were sat down. I saw one male sat on another male's lap. I believe there were three tables in the room, chairs round each table and a bench seat around one part of the perimeter wall. I saw a few plates with leftover food on them on the tables, this didn't appear to correspond with the amount of people in the room. I would estimate the age range of this group between 18-25 years. I told _____ that I believed covid regulations were being breached, that there was no social distancing being observed, there were too

many people in the room, there didn't appear to be people eating food or used plates cutlery etc on the tables for the amount of people in the room. People in the group realised we were police officers and started asking what was wrong. There appeared to be two other members of staff on duty at the time we entered the premises, _____ who informed me she was the person in charge and that she also had a personal licence and _____ bar staff. Both were wearing face coverings. _____ said that _____' DPS was not working at the pub this evening and that they had had another member of bar staff on earlier called _____ she did not know any further details for this female. I took contact numbers for all three staff. During the conversation I had with _____ he told me that he had not been briefed by staff regarding the regulations, he confessed he did not know what they were. He said he worked for a security company called _____ he contacted what I assumed was a manager from this company, called _____ I spoke to _____ and explained the situation to him. _____ was unaware that only groups from the same household could socialise together while observing social distancing and other regulations while in the premises. As stated it appeared the large group were of a similar age range, consisting of males and females. Staff had allowed this large group to congregate in the snug area, in my view in breach of the regulations, food didn't appear to have been or was being consumed, I didn't believe that many of the persons present were from the same household or support bubble, lack of social distancing between tables / people present. The people present in the snug were literally sat side by side, there was very little space, certainly not 2 meters, between them or between the people sat at tables. As mentioned I saw one male sat on another person's lap.

We decided to clear the room (snug) but prior to doing so colleagues and I tried to engage and explain with those present regarding the current covid regulations, as per (NPCC) guidance. I spoke with a few customers who were intoxicated and some became argumentative. I explained that the virus was still rampant and killing large numbers of people, including people in their community. I told them that by following the regulations and playing their part this would hopefully cause the numbers of infections and deaths to fall which would ease pressure on health services. I told them that they could only socialise with people from the same household or a person in their support bubble. That they should be socially distanced (2 meters) from others in the premises and should be wearing a face mask / covering when not sat at a table. The response we got was mixed, some accepted our advice, others were unaware of the regulations in force, others were defensive and argumentative. We decided to try and engage, explain and encourage people to follow the regulations as opposed to taking enforcement action at this time. There were more customers in other areas of the pub, staff asked all present to drink up and leave as the premises was to be closed by 23:00hrs, which they did. Once the premises was empty and closed we left. I am aware that my colleague PC _____ spoke with the DPS, _____ on the phone while we were at the premises.

On Wednesday 16th December 2020 I re attended the Bay Horse public house with _____ an enforcement officer from Selby District Council. We attended the premises at about 18:45hrs to conduct a covid compliance check. _____ was the manager in charge of the premises at the time we visited. The premises was showing a Leeds football match and was quite busy. There were about twelve males in the snug area (room to the right as you enter the premises through the front door). There was a television set on the wall in this room. The males were mostly sat directly next to each other on an "L" shaped bench seat on the perimeter wall of the room, apart from two males sat on chairs next to each other opposite the main group. I saw paper plates of food in front of each of the males. Staff were wearing face masks / coverings.

I identified myself as a police officer. I engaged with the group of males in the snug area. I asked if they were from the same household. The males said they were all from the same household, which I found hard to believe. One of the males then said that six of them were from the same household, he identified which six, being sat directly next to each other. I asked a male sat next to the sixth person who he was at the premises with. He said he was alone. I explained to him that he should not have been sat next to the group of six as he was not from their household, that he should have been socially distanced from other persons at the premises. There was another male sat directly next to this person. I asked him who he was at the premises with. He again said he was alone. I started to explain that he also should have been sat socially distanced from the others present. One of the males from the group of six then said words to the effect of " Look mate we are obviously not all from the same household, we are just here watching the football." I asked if they had informed staff that they were from the same household. They said staff had asked and they confirmed that they were. I made a request that they separate into groups from the same household being socially distanced. I tried to engage with the males but this seemed to fall on deaf ears. I spoke to the manager about this, it was the second time I had been to the premises and the second time I found issues in this particular room.

I went and spoke with other customers at the premises, a group of five males stated they were all students and lived together. I also approached a group of three females, who confirmed they lived together. There was food and plates at both of their tables. I briefly spoke with an older male, probably in his late 50's, he was argumentative and verbally abusive telling me to fuck off. After telling this male to stop using foul language or face arrest I tried to engage with him. I tried to tell him why we were at the location, what the regulations were and how compliance would benefit all. He would not listen to me, remained agitated and argumentative. I walked away so the confrontation did not escalate.

We left the premises at about 19:15hrs.
