

## SEX & RELATIONSHIP EDUCATION SCRUTINY REVIEW

<b>Recommendations</b>	
<b>1</b>	Young people and their parents are consulted on the content and materials used for SRE
<b>2</b>	Young people are invited to evaluate their SRE
<b>3</b>	Professionals are actively encouraged to undertake PSHE training courses in teenage pregnancy hotspots
<b>4</b>	Schools are encouraged to appoint a PSHE Governor and Governors are made aware of and encouraged to participate in training courses on SRE
<b>5</b>	SRE training events receive a higher profile in Governors training brochure and courses are actively promoted
<b>6</b>	Teenage Pregnancy Coordinator makes sure that young men are well informed on sexual health matters and can find help and support
<b>7</b>	County Council compares the National Teenage Pregnancy Unit Deep Dive Findings with our own
<b>8</b>	Scrutiny review report is circulated to all primary, secondary schools head teachers and governors, PCTs, District Councils, Area Committees and Local Strategic Partnerships
<b>9</b>	Teenage Pregnancy Coordinator determines how more support, help and information sharing can be offered to parents
<b>10</b>	Teenage Pregnancy Coordinator develops a consistent County wide approach to providing SRE services
<b>11</b>	County Council works with PCT(s) partners to employ more school nurses from 2007
<b>12</b>	School Nurses receive SRE training and are part of delivery team
<b>13</b>	PCTs are consulted on their plans to roll out the National Chlamydia Screening programme
<b>14</b>	Information is requested from PCTs on the incidence of STIs in young people
<b>15</b>	Young People's Champion explores how young people can report back to the County Council their views on SRE
<b>16</b>	Children and Young Peoples Service considers holding an annual SRE forum involving all partners
<b>17</b>	Young People's Overview and Scrutiny Committee receives regular updates on implementation of the recommendations
<b>18</b>	Scrutiny of Health Committee receives regular reports on developments and progress against recommendations 10,11,12 and 13.
<b>19</b>	Following the adoption of its SRE policy, the Youth Service considers how it might contribute more to the SRE delivery process.
