#### **Work Programme Report**

#### 1.0 Purpose of Report

This report asks the Committee to:

### 2.0 Transport for young people aged 14-19

Members will recall the presentation and briefing on the 11-19 Strategy at the last meeting of the Committee. This presentation confirmed that by 2013, every young person aged 14-19 has the right to choose from 17 different diplomas at 3 different levels; they must also have the choice to sign up to an apprenticeship at the age of 16 if they so wish.

No single school or Further Education College can provide the entitlement outlined above: it requires excellent collaboration between neighbouring schools, colleges and employers.

There are a number of challenges facing North Yorkshire but in particular the issue of School to School Transport has been raised. Your Chairman mentioned that a joint scrutiny review would benefit from the close involvement of both the Young People and the Transport & Telecommunications Overview & Scrutiny Committee's who could explore the issues to be faced.

With both Chairman in agreement the next duty of the committee is to nominate members to sit on a joint Task Group. Members of the Transport & Telecommunications will have already met and agreed their nominations prior to the meeting of this committee.

It is proposed that the Scrutiny Support Officers from each committee will arrange an initial meeting/ workshop of the Joint Task Group.

#### 3.0 Work Programme (attached at Annex A)

(i) <u>Transition arrangements for young people with learning difficulties and disabilities</u>

This item was due to be covered at today's meeting. However in consultation with your Chairman the committee were advised that a Cross Directorate Working Group has been set up and was due to meet for the first time this month. Its purpose is to look at areas of best practice and also where improvements in service provision could be made.

It was proposed that a Report is considered by Members of the Committee in September 2008. This report would outline the work of the cross directorate group and provide Members with a more meaningful engagement on the issues in hand and to comment on areas for development.

#### (ii) Young Carers

The Chairman was informed that at the moment there is nothing of substance to bring to the Committees attention on this topic. It is suggested that this item is moved to the Mid Cycle Briefing for later in the year when it might be more appropriate to follow this up.

#### 4.0 Additions to Work Programme - 11.07.08

At the previous meeting the Committee considered it important to develop a greater understanding of the 11-19 Education Reforms and to monitor progress of the delivery plan. At the request of Members of the Committee this item has been returned to the Work Programme.

Members also received a presentation and briefing on Integrated Youth Support and the recently outsourced service of Delivering Information, Advice and Guidance to Schools and Colleges in North Yorkshire by Igen. This briefing highlighted the fact that this provision was still in its early stages. Your Chairman considered that an update later in the year would be useful and provide the committee with information on performance. This item has been returned to the Work Programme.

#### Local Safeguarding Childrens Board

Members had become aware that changes and developments linked to the Local Safeguarding Childrens Board were under discussion. The Committee considered that this was an appropriate time to request an update and briefing on this matter. This item has been added to the Work Programme
