2.0 Mid Cycle Briefing – 5th September

Topics covered:

- 1. <u>Child Obesity pathway model</u> Briefing from the North Yorkshire and York Primary Care Trust on how its contribution as a partner organisation to the Children and Young Peoples Plan using Child Obesity as an example.
- 2. <u>Young Carers</u> Following discussions at the previous meeting of the Young People Overview & Scrutiny Committee, Members requested a briefing explaining the apparent inequalities of provision available to young carers across different areas.
- 3. <u>Scrutiny Review "Reducing Corporate Waste"</u> Briefing by the Scrutiny Support Officer on the report and recommendations of the Environment & Heritage Overview & Scrutiny Committee
- 4. <u>Young People affected by Domestic Abuse Draft Report of the Task</u> Group.

Members of the Task Group involved in the in-depth scrutiny review 'Sporting Chance', which looked at sports provision and participation in North Yorkshire, will be pleased to learn that an update in relation to the recommendations arising from this review has been organised for the next Mid Cycle Briefing on the 10th October. All members of the Task Group will be welcome to attend.

3.0 School to School Transport for young people aged 14-19

Members will recall the presentation and briefing on the 11-19 Strategy which highlighted that by 2013, every young person aged 14-19 has the right to choose from 17 different diplomas at 3 different levels and also have the choice to sign up to an apprenticeship at the age of 16 if they so wish.

There are a number of challenges facing North Yorkshire in relation to the 11-19 Strategy but in particular the issue of School to School Transport has been raised as a significant challenge. Members agreed that this area of work would benefit from a joint scrutiny review and the close involvement of both the Young People and the Transport & Telecommunications Overview & Scrutiny Committee's who could explore the issues to be faced.

The first meeting of the Joint Task Group took place on the 5th September. Members were provided with background information and learned about the

areas of work identified through the Strategic Cross-Directorate Group. The Joint Task Group agreed the scope and framework for this next review and will provide both overview and scrutiny committees' with timely progress reports.
