2.0 Mid Cycle Briefing – 10th October 2008

Topics covered:

2.1 Scrutiny Review - 'Sporting Chance'

Members were provided with an update following their scrutiny review on sports participation by young people across North Yorkshire.

There have been several sporting opportunities and developments such as a Boxing Club, Step Forward (Leadership Programmes) and a Rugby Challenge to name just a few. There are still challenges to be addressed around difficult to reach groups and schools engaging better with sports clubs.

Data collection was an area of concern raised by the report and Members were pleased to learn that the Schools Sports Partnerships now have a better management system which will identify and focus on those young people not achieving or participating in 2 hours physical activity in a week.

Members also heard about an innovative project known as Soundbeam run by the SportsSpecial School Sports Partnership which focuses upon developing PE provision for young people with profound and multiple learning difficulties (PMLD). Soundbeam is described as a virtual musical instrument and when the soundbeam is cut, through movement, the projected sound alters.

The Governments agenda to increase access to high quality sport to five hours by 2012 has still to be addressed and guidance is awaited on how this should be delivered.

2.2 Restructuring Youth Service in Scarborough

Members were advised of a review of the current Management and Delivery of Youth Work in the Scarborough Areas. The purpose being to provide and delivery the best possible youth services to young people in Scarborough.

The main area to be affected by the restructure is the Mentoring work that presently takes place within Schools in the Scarborough urban area. It is still early days but Members were reassured they will be kept informed as the process develops.

2.3 'MyPlace'

Members were provided with a briefing on the 'MyPlace' initiative. They heard that across the country young people are calling for more places to go where they have new and interesting things to do, that offer a real alternative to the 'street corner'. In providing positive activities the Government sees this approach as an important tool in helping communities tackle antisocial behaviour as well as helping young people to re-engage in their communities.

Bids for 'MyPlace' are channelled through the Big Lottery Fund and here in North Yorkshire work is already underway to develop potential bids.

Any bids will initially be presented to the Children and Young Peoples Strategic Partnership Board, if acceptable signed off by the Chief Executive John Marsden before being forwarded to the Big Lottery. The Big Lottery then carry out a further filter to consider suitability for 'MyPlace'.

Members were assured they will be kept informed of any progress made.

3.0 Joint Task Group School to School Transport for young people aged 14-19

The Joint Task Group continues to develop a greater understanding of the challenges facing North Yorkshire in relation to the 11-19 Strategy and in particular school to school transport. Through their Task Group meetings they have consulted with expert witnesses and continue to gather background information and examples of good practice. Part of their information gathering included a visit to Malton School in Ryedale, to meet with a group of students from Norton College, who are participating in the Ryedale pilot and benefiting from a greater choice of courses provided by the partnership.

The students raised a number of issues which focussed on travelling time, timetabling and travel arrangements. Despite some teething problems the students acknowledged the benefits of the partnership.

The next meeting of the Task Group will be held on the 15th December.

4.0 Work Programme:

Health Related Survey

The Committee are informed that the results of the Health Related Survey are in the very early stages of being validated and the Officers felt they would not be in a position to provide members of the committee with a complete picture or a full briefing. With the approval of your Chairman, this item has been moved to the next meeting which is 23rd January 2009.
