Work Programme Report

1.0 Purpose of Report

This report asks the Committee to:

2.0 Corporate Parent Standing Group

The first meeting of the Corporate Parent Standing Group (CPSG) was held immediately on the rising of this committee on the 23rd January and County Councillor Michelle Andrew was elected as Chairperson. Should Members of the Committee require a copy of the Outcomes and Actions Notes please contact Stephanie Bratcher, Scrutiny Support Officer.

Members of the CPSG were updated on how the Young Peoples Council has been developing and felt that it was important to strengthen these links by arranging a further meeting with representatives of the Young Peoples Council. This has been arranged for the 1st April at the Golden Lion, Northallerton.

The next meeting of the CPSG will be held on the afternoon of the 1st May 2009.

3.0 Mid Cycle Briefing – 25th February

a. Update on CRB Clearance processes

Members were provided with an update on the County Council's CRB Unit which handles the administrative processes for CRB disclosures with a cross directorate working group to oversee the process and to provide advice and support to decision making managers. This group, the Safe Recruitment and Employment Group (SAFREG) meets quarterly and reports directly to the Management Board.

It is estimated that the authority conducted approximately 14,500 checks in 2008, split relatively evenly between new checks for staff and volunteers and rechecks for existing staff.

Members were advised that a major change to the vetting and barring regime, nationally, is being introduced in 2009. The establishment of the Independent Safeguarding Authority (ISA) will add another layer of complexity to the screening process for staff and volunteers. The ISA is a new Non-Departmental Public Body which will decide who is barred from working with children or vulnerable adults. It will replace the current statutory barring lists POVA (Protection of vulnerable adults), POCA (Protection of Children Act) and list 99, but it will not replace the CRB checking process.

b. <u>Briefing and update from Local Safeguarding Children's Board</u>

Members noted that the new structures of the NYSCB are now in place with most of the sub/task groups and forums having met and agreed work plans.

The Local Safeguarding Children's Board undertook a further Section 11 audit and an audit against the Haringey Joint Area Review as requested by DCSF in early December 2008. Responses were received from the key agencies involved in child protection and safeguarding.

Your Chairman is mindful that this is a matter of great interest to the full committee and has therefore added Safeguarding to the main agenda for March.

c. Progress on the development of Youth Councils

Members were pleased to learn that there has been a significant move towards giving young people more opportunities to get involved in the design, provision and evaluation of policies and services that affect them or which they use.

In April 2008 4Youth facilitated a Youth Council Development Day which was attended by representatives from a number of agencies and young people from existing youth councils in Craven and Selby. The decision was taken at this event to work towards the development of youth councils centred around 20 locations based on meeting young people's needs in terms of access and providing the opportunity to influence decision making in their local area. It is these areas which have been focussed on over the past year and the current 'state of play' of each youth council is detailed in *Appendix One*. Whilst they are each at differing stages of development the guiding principles for all are those set out by the National Youth Agency

d. Report of the Contact Centre Task Group

The Task Group for the cross cutting scrutiny review of Access to Services was established in March 2008. The aim was to undertake a post implementation review of progress of the Customer Services Centre and to look at the strategy for public access focusing on the planned developments of the face to face' Joint Access Centres.

The Group completed its work in January 2009 and presented their findings together with 12 recommendations to the Mid Cycle briefing of the Young Peoples Overview & Scrutiny Committee for comment.

The Chairman congratulated the Task Group on a very useful piece of joint scrutiny working.

e. <u>Draft North Yorkshire & York Domestic Abuse Strategy</u>

Members were informed that the draft Domestic Abuse Strategy is out for consultation. The Task Group who undertook the scrutiny review on Young People affected by Domestic Abuse were keen to have an opportunity to comment on the draft strategy and in recognition of this a meeting was arranged on Friday 13th March.

4.0 Young People Affected by Domestic Abuse

The report of the Task Group was presented at the Safer Communities Forum meeting on the 26th February and acknowledged as a good piece of work. Reassurances were given by the Chairman of the Forum that domestic abuse is a priority and will be driven forward through the Joint Coordinating Group for Domestic Abuse (JCGDA).

North Yorkshire Police informed the Chairman of the Task Group that they had held a Police Domestic Abuse meeting recently and used the recommendations from the Scrutiny Review as a basis for discussion. The Police are happy to share the outcomes and actions from this meeting with the committee.

The committee may wish to consider inviting a representative from North Yorkshire Police to one of their meetings to update and further inform the committee on the progress being made.

The committee are informed that the Chairman of the Task Group has since received an invitation from the Chair of the JCGDA to attend their next meeting in May.

5.0 Work Programme

Members may recall that the Work Programme reflects the key outcomes under Every Child Matters and the May committee meeting takes up the priorities for Achieving Economic Well-Being. Members are invited to add or comment on the areas for discussion at their next meeting.
