### 2.0 Mid Cycle Briefing – 28th July 2010

This was the first Mid Cycle meeting of the new Chair and Vice Chair. Their main focus was to gain an understanding of past issues covered the committee and to become aware of recent policy briefings and guidance published by the Coalition Government on children, young people and their families.

2.1 Announced savings from Government and reductions to specific budget lines was discussed and the Chairman considered that Members of the Committee would welcome a briefing from the Corporate Director and Executive Members on the proposals to deliver the Children & Young Peoples Savings and Transformation Strategy.

It was anticipated that the committee may wish to take a closer interest in some of the individual savings projects which form part of the Savings and Transformation Strategy.

- 2.2 The draft Annual Review of the Children & Young Peoples Plan 2009/10 was made available which outlined the key areas for improvement. The Chairman asked if Members of the Committee receive a copy of the final Annual Review.
- 2.3 The Work Programme was discussed in some detail but it was considered important for the committee to have a work programme that reflects the fast moving picture of developments and reductions in budgets announced recently. It was suggested that a draft Work Programme is brought to the Committee's attention at the next meeting for their consideration and approval, with the opportunity to add to the list of matters shown.
- 2.4 The Chair and Vice Chair agreed to use technology for some of their informal meetings whenever appropriate.
- 2.5 Chairman informed the meeting of arrangements that are underway to accommodate requests from Settle Sixth Form Students to attend the County Council Meeting in October and Sixth Form Students from Ripon Grammar the December County Council. The suggestion being that Councillors from the Young People Overview & Scrutiny Committee could 'buddy' the Sixth Formers.

The Chairman proposes drawing this to the Committees attention and asking Elected Members to volunteer to become a 'buddy'.

# 3.0 Safeguarding

Your Chairman is keen to see safeguarding issues maintained and covered within the Work Programme but as part of the mainstream work of the Children and Young Peoples Service and the NHS North Yorkshire & York PCT.
