2.0 Mid Cycle Briefing - 31st March 2011

Child Poverty Needs Assessment

The Child Poverty Act 2010 places a duty on upper tier local authorities and their partners to produce a Child Needs Assessment to inform the development of a local Child Poverty Strategy.

The meeting was provided with an overview of the North Yorkshire completed Needs Assessment which included data from the National Indicator 116 (Percentage of Children inn Poverty) for 2008. It reports that 11.2% of children in North Yorkshire were considered to be living in poverty compared with 21.4% in the Yorkshire and Humber region and 20.9% in England. It goes on to say that although child poverty in North Yorkshire is much less prevalent than in other parts of the country, the data shows that more than 13,000 children in the county live in households whose income falls below the official poverty threshold.

Members were interested to know how the Needs Assessment will be used to develop actions to tackle Child Poverty. They were informed that the information is shared with partners and will be a strong thread running through the revised Children & Young Peoples Plan which is being developed.

The Chairman requested that a further report is brought back to the Committee in due course which informs the Members on the implementation plans being taken to tackle Child Poverty and the resources available.

2.1 Vocational Education for 14-19 year olds

Purpose of the briefing was to provide Members with an initial briefing on the outcome of the Wolf Report which is an independent review into vocational education for 14-19 year olds requested by the Education Secretary Mr Michael Gove in October 2010.

Officers provided the meeting with an overview of the headlines and the 27 recommendations arising from Professor Wolf's review.

It is too early to say what the implications will be for North Yorkshire but Officers suggest that the Wolf Review needs to be seen in context with all the other changes that are happening in relation to education and proposed that a detailed report is presented to the committee in the Autumn.

2.2 <u>Children & Young Peoples Service – Capital Programme 2011/12</u>

The Chairman had requested a briefing on the position regarding the Capital Programme allocations for 2011/12.

Officers explained that Capital allocations for Children and Young Peoples Services 2011/12 were announced on 13 December 2010 as part of the Local Government Finance Settlement. Unlike revenue, the capital allocations have been made for a single year only. Allocations for 2012 and beyond are not expected to be confirmed until after the James Capital Review report which is expected shortly.

Members were therefore provided with information in relation to the Proposed Capital Programme for 2011/12 only.

2.3 Children and Young Peoples Service, Savings and Transformation Strategy –

2.3.1 Project 5 – School Improvement

Members were provided with an update on the proposals to review and restructure the whole of the Quality and Improvement Service to achieve a savings target over the next two years of £1.298 million. A total savings target of almost £2.0 million has been set for subsequent years in the Savings Strategy and proposals for the second phase of the review will be brought forward later in the year.

The proposed new structure is designed to help develop a self-improving school system which reflects the drive at a national level to increase further the autonomy and responsibilities of schools. It will also ensure that the Local Authority is able to monitor standards, support schools in difficulty and be able to deliver its regulatory/statutory responsibility from a substantially smaller resource.

2.3.2 Project 10 – Outdoor Education

The meeting was provided with an update and progress briefing on moving forward Project 10 of the CYPS Savings and Transformation Strategy. In summary the proposals are for a revised staffing structure which maintains a teacher led education based Outdoor Learning service and for two Outdoor Education centres.

The Chairman requested that a progress report is brought back to the committee in twelve months time to consider how the proposals have progressed and the number of schools using the centres.
