Work Programme Report

1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 This report asks the Committee to:

2.0 Mid Cycle Briefing – 23rd February 2012

The following items were discussed at the last Mid-Cycle Briefing which are summarised below.

2.1 Paediatric & Maternity Services at the Friarage Hospital

Prior to the meeting Members had been provided with a copy of the National Clinical Advisory Team (NCAT) report which considered the options being discussed within the South Tees Hospital Trust on the reconfiguration of children's services.

The Chairman asked that the Scrutiny of Health Team Leader is invited to the meeting to provide them with an update on the planned process for public engagement by South Tees Hospital Trust on the options for reconfiguring children's services. Members were advised that nine meetings are scheduled to take place through March to June (exact dates will be circulated) to explore with the public what the options are.

The Members acknowledged that the Scrutiny of Health Committee are fully engaged with this matter but asked on behalf of the full Committee if there would be an opportunity for the Young People Overview & Scrutiny Committee to be invited to join Scrutiny of Health at one of their meetings when this issue is discussed further.

2.2 Demand for Primary School places in North Yorkshire

Recent national press coverage has highlighted the potential shortfall of primary school places across England. With this in mind the Members were keen to understand the situation in North Yorkshire and requested an initial briefing on the demand for primary school places in North Yorkshire.

Members were advised that although in recent years pupil numbers nationally have been falling across both the primary and secondary school and this has been reflected in North Yorkshire school population which peaked in 2022 of 86,405. However by 2010 this had fallen to 80,473. In North Yorkshire the primary school population by 2010 had fallen to 40,385 but between now and 2015-16 primary aged pupils are forecast to rise from the current 39,419 to 42,267, a rise of over 7%.

Across the county there are currently 46,999 primary school places. Therefore in overall terms there are sufficient places for all the primary school pupils who need them both now

and in the long term. However, this overall position conceals a number of development 'hotspots' and places where significant surplus places are likely to remain.

Pupil forecasting on a County and District-wide basis are updated annually and twice a year pupil forecasts refreshed for each locality area and for individual schools. This also takes into account the actual numbers of pupils in schools as well as the impact of forecast changes to the birth rate and migration.

The Chairman suggested that this item is brought to the attention of the full Committee and asked that it is added to the Work Programme for a detailed briefing at the June meeting.

2.3 Pupil Referral Service

In response to a number of queries raised by the Chairman in connection with the Pupil Referral Service Review (the review of behaviour services forms part of the larger review of Quality & Improvement Service in the CYPS Savings and Transformation Strategy) Members requested a position statement with regard to the provision of services across the County.

Members were advised that it is the responsibility of Local Authority to educate permanently excluded pupils or children who do not have a school place or cannot attend school (this includes pupils excluded from Academies). North Yorkshire chose to do this through locally based Pupil Referral Services extending its work to include working with children who are at risk of exclusion or out of school for whatever reason. Although the number of permanent exclusions is reducing the overall work of the PRSs is increasing with preventative work.

Currently there are four Pupil Referral Service (PRS) bases - Harrogate, Northallerton, Scarborough and Skipton. A further site has been identified in Selby which opens in September 2012 this long awaited provision is very welcome. The decision to establish a PRS in Selby was taken in 2007 but the difficulty has been in finding suitable premises which has delayed implementation. In the past the Harrogate PRS has provided for Selby.

The PRSs are funded from DSG through devolved budget with £4.75m being shared between the four units based on FTE places. However, with the Selby provision opening in September the distribution of funding is under review to ensure equitable distribution of resource across all five PRSs which are not solely based on per capital.

The Chairman summed up by requesting a further briefing at full Committee in September which picks up on a number of services provided by the Quality and Improvement Service and asked that under the item on Young People not educated in mainstream settings that Enhanced Mainstream Primary Schools and the new Forrest Moor provision are included to complete the package of provision and suggested that these areas are added to the Work Programme.

3.0 Scrutiny Review – Youth Participation

The Task Group met at the Ripon Youth Centre towards the end of February where they met the new Chairman of the North Yorkshire Youth Council and received a detailed briefing on the Flying High Group. The next meeting is on the afternoon of the 16th March.

4.0 Work Programme Schedule

Members are asked to comment on the revised Work Programme and approve the content.
