School Admission Arrangements for the School Year 2027/28

Report of the Corporate Director – Children and Young People’s Service

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To provide information about the response to the proposed admission arrangements for Community and Voluntary Controlled schools for the school year 2027/2028, and to seek approval for recommendation to the Council for determination.

2.0 SUMMARY

- 2.1 As the Admission Authority for all Community and Voluntary Controlled schools in North Yorkshire the Council must have agreed admission arrangements that govern the allocation of school places in place by the 28 February each year to apply to admission applications for the following school year. This is to comply with legislation, and to regulations that are set out in the School Admissions Code, 2021.
- 2.2 A six-week consultation on the proposed admission arrangements for the 2027/2028 academic year has been undertaken and included the admission policies and published admission numbers ('PAN's') for individual schools.
- 2.3 This report provides a summary of the responses received to the consultation and sets out proposals for the schools admission arrangements for the academic year 2027/2028.
- 2.4 The proposals in this report relate to the governance of school admissions only and are separate to the arrangements for Home to School Travel which are governed by the Council's Home to School Travel Policy.

3.0 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 As the Admission Authority for all Community and Voluntary Controlled schools in North Yorkshire, the Council consults annually on admission arrangements. The Council is currently required to determine its admission arrangements, which includes admissions policy and published admission numbers, annually by 28 February each year. When changes are proposed to admission arrangements, all admission authorities must complete a consultation by 31 January. Where the admission arrangements have not changed from the previous year there is no requirement to consult, subject to the requirement that admission authorities must consult on their admission arrangements at least once every seven years, even if there have been no changes during that period.
- 3.2 Consultation must last for a minimum of six weeks and take place between 1 October and 31 January in the determination year. This means that schools are consulted in the autumn term each year for admissions nearly two years later. The process is therefore based, to some degree, on schools' best estimates of the numbers of requests for places informed by the Council's forecasting model, which takes into account the patterns of parental

preference over the years. Since North Yorkshire Council is the only body that may determine the matter, it falls to the Council to determine the arrangements in February each year.

- 3.3 The Education (Relevant Areas for Consultation on Admission Arrangements) Regulations 1999 (SI 1999 No. 124) require local authorities to determine relevant areas for consultation on admission arrangements. The relevant areas for schools maintained by North Yorkshire Council are as follows:
- 3.3.1 For Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools, the relevant area for consultation is the entire County of North Yorkshire, plus the City of York and the area of Bradford Metropolitan Authority served at secondary level by South Craven School.
- 3.3.2 For Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Trust Schools and Academies the relevant area for consultation is North Yorkshire Council and admission authorities within a radius of 3 miles of the school, including admission authorities in neighbouring local authority areas.

It is proposed that the relevant areas for consultation remain unchanged

- 3.4 All admission authorities must participate in co-ordination and provide the Council with the information it needs to co-ordinate admissions for the normal admission rounds by the dates agreed within the scheme.
- 3.5 Although there is no longer a mandatory requirement for local authorities to undertake in-year co-ordination for schools for which they are not the admission authority, they can coordinate in year admissions with the agreement of the relevant admission authorities. It is proposed that the council will continue to coordinate in year admissions within North Yorkshire.
- 3.6 The consultation took place between 13 October and 24 November 2025, with the headteachers and governors of three Nursery Schools, 292 Primary schools (75 Community, 62 Voluntary Controlled (VC), 19 Voluntary Aided (VA), 108 Converter Academy Schools, 24 Sponsored Academy schools, three Free Schools and one Foundation Trust). The local authority also consulted 41 Secondary schools (11 are Community, 1 Voluntary Aided (VA), 20 Converter Academy Schools 8 Sponsored Academy Schools and one Free School), parents and other groups in the local area, the 13 neighbouring authorities, and with the relevant diocesan authorities. The consultation was published on the NYC website. All schools were asked to display a poster promoting the consultation and providing a link to the consultation with details of how to obtain a hard copy of the consultation documents.
- 3.7 Schools were asked to express their agreement or otherwise with the proposals relating to their own proposed Published Admission Number (PAN), the proposed admissions policy for Community and Voluntary Controlled schools, the proposed admissions policy for LA maintained Nursery schools and classes, pre-reception classes and pre-schools under school governance. In addition, they had the opportunity to make any other comments. Not all school respondents commented on every proposal within the consultation.
- 3.8 At the closing date of 24 November 2025, a total of 26 responses had been submitted from 15 members of the public, 6 schools including 1 Academy Trust and 3 neighbouring local authorities. One response was received anonymously. Twenty-five of the responses were received via the online survey and 1 of the responses was received via email.

A majority of the responses were supportive of the proposals, although some critical comments were received.

A summary of the responses, and copies of all the comments received are provided in Appendix 1 of this report.

4.0 PROPOSALS

4.1 The proposed co-ordinated Admission Arrangements for 2027/28, including appendices, are attached to this report at Appendix 2.

4.2 The Council should retain the in-year co-ordination of admissions, including on behalf of own admission authority schools. A copy of the proposed Co-ordinated In-Year Admission Arrangements Document is attached to this report at Appendix 3.

4.3 The proposed Admission Policies for 2027/2028 (these contain the criteria for determining admission where schools are oversubscribed) have been updated to reflect the relevant dates for 2027/2028 and include: -

4.2.1 NYC admissions policy for local authority-maintained community and voluntary controlled schools (Attached at Appendix 4)

4.2.2 NYC admissions policy for Ripon Grammar Boarding School, 2027/2028 (Attached at Appendix 5)

4.2.3 NYC admissions policy for community schools and voluntary controlled nursery schools, nursery classes, pre-reception classes 2027/2028 (Attached at Appendix 6).

4.3 The proposed Published Admission Numbers (PAN's) for 2027/2028 have been updated, to reflect the schools that requested a change.

4.3.1 The Council sets the admission limits of Community and Voluntary Controlled schools in consultation with the governing body of the school. An own admission authority school (Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Trust Schools, Academies or Free Schools) is not required to include a proposal to increase or keep the same admission number in any consultation on admission arrangements. Conversely, all admission authorities must consult if they propose a decrease in PAN.

4.3.2 As the admission authority for a community or voluntary controlled school the Council must consult the governing body of each school whether it proposes to increase, decrease or keep the same admission number. As part of the annual process the Council asked the governing bodies of all 148 community and voluntary controlled schools if they wished to make any changes to their published admission number prior to the consultation period. 99 schools agreed to no change, 8 requested a PAN change and 41 schools did not respond. Of the 8 that requested a change 7 requested a decrease that must be consulted on.

The following changes to the published admission numbers were proposed for 2027/2028:

The consultation document incorrectly proposed that the PAN for Pickering Infants and Nursery School should reduce from 60 to 30. This was an error, and it is not proposed that there should be any change to the School's PAN of 60.

4.3.3 The following are attached to this report: -

- The proposed PAN's for Community and Voluntary Controlled Primary Schools for the Academic Year 2027/2028 (Appendix 7); and
- The proposed PAN's for Community Secondary Schools for the Academic Year 2027/2028 (Appendix 8)

4.4 The relevant areas for consultation on Admission Arrangements remain unchanged.

5.0 ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED

5.1 No alternative options were considered as it is a statutory requirement to determine Admission Arrangements on an annual basis by 28 February.

6.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report

7.0 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

7.1 The consultation on proposed admissions arrangements for 2027/2028 is in accordance with the requirements of the School Admissions Code 2021 and associated legislation. Failure to comply with admission arrangements as determined can lead to challenge by way of objections to the Schools Adjudicator or complaints to the Local Government Ombudsman.

8.0 EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

8.1 The Council has considered that if the recommendations are accepted, they have universal application, and therefore no adverse impacts upon any person or groups who have protected characteristics under the Equality Act 2010.

9.0 CLIMATE CHANGE IMPLICATIONS

9.1 There are no climate change implications arising from this report.

10.0 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

10.1 North Yorkshire Council as an admission authority for maintained schools must have determined admission arrangements for 2027/2028. The arrangements decide the allocation of school places which will apply for admission applications for entry in the academic year 2027/2028. The approved arrangements are to be determined by February 2026, this is to comply with the regulations and legislation set out in the Admission Code 2021

11.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

11.1 That the proposed Admission Arrangements for 2027/2028 be recommended to the Council for approval on 13 February 2026, including: -

There are a number of families who have been left with no options of a school due to the new policy. School Admissions 2027-28**

1. Introduction and Purpose

*‘Everyone in North Yorkshire should have
the opportunities to reach their maximum potential’
Council Plan 2025-29*

North Yorkshire Council’s Coordinated Admissions Scheme provides a framework for ensuring that all applications for a school place starting in September 2027 are dealt with in a fair and transparent way. The scheme applies to all state funded schools in North Yorkshire who admit pupils at their normal year of entry including pupils who are applying for a place in:

- A primary or an infant school in the Reception year
- A junior school in Year 3; or
- A secondary school in Year 7.

The aim of the scheme is to ensure that all applicants receive an offer of:

- A single school place on the same day, i.e. the respective national offer day; and
- Where possible, a place at their highest ranked preference school where places are available.

North Yorkshire Council (the council), will work with all state funded primary and secondary schools in North Yorkshire, including community, voluntary controlled, voluntary aided, foundation and trust schools, and free schools and academies, to ensure the efficient operation of the scheme. The council will also work closely with other local authorities to ensure that the admissions arrangements are coordinated for parents applying for a school place in an out of county school.

Further information about the Council’s arrangements for school admissions can be found on the council’s website at: [School admissions | North Yorkshire Council](#).

This information includes:

- Information about the admission of children with an EHCP
- The Coordinated In-Year Admissions Scheme
- The Admissions Policy for all North Yorkshire community and voluntary controlled schools
- The number of allocations made at each school in the previous school year; and
- The number of schools that were oversubscribed and for which admission appeals were received, and the number and outcome of those appeals.

This scheme complies with the provisions of The School Admissions (Admissions Arrangements and Co-ordination of Admission Arrangements) (England) Regulations, 2012 and the School Admissions Code, 2021.

2. Schools and Admission Authorities in North Yorkshire

As of 1 September 2025 there were a total of 333 state funded primary and secondary schools and academies in North Yorkshire, comprising: -

The scheme does not affect the duty of the governing boards of academies, including free schools, voluntary aided, foundation and trust schools to determine their own admission arrangements.

Following the adoption of this scheme one or more community or voluntary controlled school may adopt academy status. If and where that is the case, then the academy's trust will become the admissions authority for that school.

3. The Common Application Form

Applicants for a school place who live in North Yorkshire should apply for a school place using the Common Application Form, using either:

- The online portal for school admissions applications which can be accessed using the following link: [Sign In - Portal for parents, schools and providers](#); or
- A paper form, a copy of which can be requested from (TO BE ADDED LATER).

Only one Common Application Form should be submitted per child.

3.1 Preferences

The Common Application Form allows applicants to:

- Express preferences for places at up to five schools, including schools in North Yorkshire or any other local authority area
- Rank their preferences; and
- Give their reasons for applying for a place at each of the schools that they preference.

When determining their preferences applicants are advised to consider:

- The admissions policies which apply to the respective schools; and
- The implications of the Council's Home to School Travel Policy, the details of which can be accessed on the council's website at: [School and college transport | North Yorkshire Council](#).

3.2 Supplementary Information Forms

Applicants may be required to complete a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) if they state a preference for a school for which the admission authority requires more information than that which is provided on the Common Application Form. Additional information that is provided on the SIF will be used by the relevant admissions authority in their consideration of the application.

4. The Co-ordinated Scheme for Normal Admissions

This scheme governs the arrangements for normal admissions, which are those which will be determined by:

16 April 2027	for places in the normal year of entry for a primary or an infant school in the Reception year
16 April 2027	for places in the normal year of entry for a junior school in Year 3
1 March 2027	for places in the normal year of entry for a secondary school in Year 7

The council will receive all Common Application Forms that are completed by applicants resident within North Yorkshire and will co-ordinate the consideration of all preferences indicated, and the allocation of places by each admission authority.

The council will receive information from other local authorities about preferences made for a place at a school in North Yorkshire, and will provide information to other local authorities about any preference made by a resident of North Yorkshire for a place at a school in their respective areas.

The council will receive ranked lists of preferences from other local authorities, providing information about where school places can be offered.

The council will provide information about preferences made for a school place at voluntary aided and trust schools, and at academies to the relevant school for their consideration. Following their consideration, those schools will provide completed ranked lists of all preferences back to the council.

The council will produce ranked lists of preferences made for community and voluntary controlled schools in North Yorkshire, identifying where places can be offered. Information will be provided to other local authorities about preferences for a place in a North Yorkshire school made by residents in their respective areas, confirming whether or not a place can be offered.

5. Applying for a place

5.1 Applying for a primary, infant, junior or secondary school place

Applicants for a school place who live in North Yorkshire should apply for a school place using the Common Application Form, using either:

- The online portal for school admissions applications which can be accessed using the following link: [Sign In - Portal for parents, schools and providers](#); or
- A paper form, a copy of which can be requested from (TO BE ADDED LATER).

Only one Common Application Form should be submitted per child.

Applications should not be made directly to schools. Any application that is received by a school should be forwarded to the council using the address below.

Applicants who live outside North Yorkshire but who wish to apply for a place at a school in North Yorkshire should apply using the Common Application Form provided by their own local authority.

5.2 Applying for an infant, junior or primary school place for 2027/28

Applicants living within North Yorkshire should complete a single application either online or in paper form listing up to five preferences for admission to any infant, junior or primary schools within North Yorkshire and other local authority areas, giving reasons for their preferences where appropriate.

When determining their preferences applicants are advised to consider:

- The admissions policies which apply to the respective schools; and
- The implications of the Council's Home to School Travel Policy, the details of which can be accessed on the council's website at: [School and college transport | North Yorkshire Council](#).

If applicants list a Voluntary Aided school or Academy including Free Schools as a preference the school may request supplementary information in order for them to apply their oversubscription criteria.

The deadline for the receipt of completed Common Application Forms is 15 January 2027.

Applicants will not be allowed to change their preferences after 15 January 2027 without a reason that is acceptable to the admission authority. The final date to accept any change or a late application is 15 February 2027.

Applicants who wish their children to attend an independent school will be encouraged to tell the council. Independent schools are not included in the co-ordinated arrangements, although applicants may also wish to apply for a place at a North Yorkshire school.

On the common application form applicants need to provide their child's name and residential address. The address provided must be where the child lives permanently. If residency is split between two parents, the address used must be the address where the child lives for the majority of the school week (Monday to Friday). Confirmation and agreement in writing from both parents will be required.

For primary school applications, where the application is submitted on time, an offer of a school place will be made on 16 April 2027.

Applicants who do not wish to accept a place at a school offered to them must notify the admission authority as soon as possible in writing that this is the case. Where the council is not the admission authority then they should also advise the council of the alternative provision that is being made. Without this information, the place will remain allocated.

The timetable for primary school admissions is attached at Appendix 3 of this document - Co-ordinated Admissions Arrangements, Primary Transfer 2027/28.

5.2.1 Admission of children below compulsory school age and deferred entry

Admission authorities must provide for the admission of all children in the September following their fourth birthday.

Where a place is offered at a school in North Yorkshire:

- that child is entitled to a full-time place in the September following their fourth birthday;
- the child's parents can defer the date their child is admitted to the school until later in the school year but not beyond the point at which they reach compulsory school age, and not beyond the beginning of the final term of the school year for which it was made; and
- where the parents wish, children may attend part-time until later in the school year, but not beyond the point at which they reach compulsory school age.

5.2.2 Admission of children outside their normal age group

Parents may seek a place for their child outside of their normal age group, for example, if the child has experienced problems such as ill health.

Parents of a summer born child, i.e. children born from 1 April to 31 August may also request admission outside their normal age group

When such a request is made, the admission authority will make a decision on the basis of the circumstances of the case and in the best interests of the child concerned, taking into account the views of the Headteacher and any supporting evidence provided by the parent. This will include taking account of the parent's views; information about the child's academic, social and emotional development; where relevant, their medical history and the views of a medical professional; whether they have previously been educated out of their normal age group; and whether they may naturally have fallen into a lower age group if it were not for being born prematurely.

Where an admission authority agrees to a request and, as a consequence of that decision, the child will be admitted to a relevant age group i.e. the age group pupils are normally admitted to the school, the council and admission authority will process the application as part of the main admissions round, unless the parental request is made too late to allow this. The determined admission arrangements and application of oversubscription may be applied.

An application will not be given lower priority on the basis that the child is being admitted out of their normal age group.

Parents have a statutory right to appeal against the refusal of a place at a school for which they have applied. This right does not apply if they are offered a place at the school, but it is not in their preferred age group

5.3 Applying for a secondary school place for 2027-28

Applicants living within North Yorkshire should complete a single application listing up to five preferences for admission to any secondary schools, including any Community, Voluntary Controlled, Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Trust schools and Academies including Free Schools within North Yorkshire and neighbouring local authority areas, giving reasons for their preferences where appropriate.

When determining their preferences applicants are advised to consider: -

- The admissions policies which apply to the respective schools; and
- The implications of the Council's home to school travel policy, the details of which can be accessed on the council's website at: [School and college transport | North Yorkshire Council](#).

The parents of Year 6 children who will be Year 7 in September 2026 will be informed by letter via their child's primary school that they will need to apply on-line for a school place.

Common application forms will be required for all transfers at Year 7. Applications for any other year group, apart from the normal year of entry (Year 7) will be dealt with as in-year applications.

The deadline for the receipt of completed Common Application Forms is 31 October 2026.

Applicants will not be allowed to change their preferences after 31 October 2026 without a reason that is acceptable to the admission authority. The final date for acceptance of any change or late application is 30 November 2026.

Applicants who wish their children to attend an independent school will be encouraged to tell the council. Independent schools are not included in the co-ordinated arrangements, although applicants may also wish to apply for a place at a North Yorkshire school.

On the common application form applicants need to provide their child's name and residential address. The address provided must be where the child lives permanently. If residency is split between two parents, the address used must be the address where the child lives for the majority of the school week (Monday to Friday). Confirmation and agreement in writing from both parents will be required.

For secondary school applications, where the application is submitted on time, an offer of a school place will be made on the 1 March 2027.

Applicants who do not wish to accept a place at a school offered to them must notify the admission authority as soon as possible in writing that this is the case. Where the council is not the admission authority then they should also advise the council of the alternative provision that is being made. Without this information, the place will remain allocated.

The council has a duty to ensure that a school place is available for every child in North Yorkshire. Therefore, a place at a school will be offered even where a Common Application Form has not been submitted on behalf of a child.

Parents who do not wish to accept a place at a school offered to them must notify the admission authority as soon as possible in writing advising the council of the alternative educational provision that is being made. Without this information, the place will remain allocated.

The timetable for secondary school admissions is attached at Appendix 4 of this document - the Co-ordinated Admissions Arrangements, Secondary Transfer 2027/28.

5.3.1 Selection

There are three selective grammar schools within North Yorkshire:

- Ermysted's Grammar School, Skipton – a Voluntary Aided boys' school
- Skipton Girls' High School – which is an Academy; and
- Ripon Grammar School – which is a mixed co-educational school

If a pupil has been entered for selection testing at any of these schools then the school should be listed as a preference on the common application form.

5.3.2 Skipton Selection

Ermysted's Grammar School is a selective grammar school that offers education to boys aged 11 to 18 who are deemed suitable for a grammar school education in accordance with their selection scheme. Further information about the tests can be obtained direct from the school ([Home - Ermysted's Grammar School](#))

Skipton Girls' High School is a selective grammar school that offers education to girls aged 11 to 18 who are deemed suitable for a grammar school education in accordance with their selection scheme. Further information about the tests can be obtained direct from the school ([Welcome to Skipton Girls' High School](#))

The governing board of Ermysted's Grammar School (Voluntary Aided) and the academy trust of Skipton Girls' High School are responsible for applying their own admissions policies and the local authority applies the published co-ordinated admissions arrangements on behalf of these schools.

The Skipton Academy is a non-selective Academy and Upper Wharfedale School is a non-selective secondary school in a selective area offering education for children aged 11 to 16.

5.3.3 Ripon Selection

Places will normally be provided at Outwood Academy Ripon and Ripon Grammar School for children who live in the City of Ripon together with the parishes of Aldfield, Azerley, Bishop Monkton, Bridge Hewick, Burton Leonard, Copt Hewick, Eavestone, Givendale, Grantley, Grewelthorpe, Hutton Conyers, Kirkby Malzeard, Laverton, Lindrick with Studley Royal and Fountains, Littlethorpe, Markenfield Hall, Markington-with- Wallerthwaite, Newby-with-Mulwith, North Stainley with Sleningfird, Sawley, Sharow, Skelding, Skelton, Studley

Roger and Winksley.

Outwood Academy Ripon is a non-selective Academy in a selective area offering education for children aged 11 to 18. Ripon Grammar School is a selective grammar school that offers an education for children aged 11 to 18. Children can only be admitted to Ripon Grammar School if they have been deemed suitable for a grammar school education, in accordance with the council selection scheme for Ripon Grammar School. The LA administers both the published selection scheme and the allocation of school places at Ripon Grammar School, as it is a community school. The council will apply the published co-ordinated admission arrangements on behalf of both Outwood Academy Ripon and Ripon Grammar School.

All children who wish to sit the selection test for entry into Ripon Grammar School will be required to apply to sit the selection tests. This includes children living and attending schools within the area served by the Ripon schools.

Ripon Selection Tests

Tests for all forms of selection must be clear and objective and give an accurate reflection of the child's ability or aptitude, irrespective of sex, race or disability. It is for the admission authority to decide the content of the test, providing that the test is a true test of aptitude or ability.

The results of these selection tests are used to identify the highest scoring 28% or as close as possible of Year 6 children who live in the Ripon selective area. This procedure sets the cut-off mark in the Ripon selective area and sets the standard, which children must reach, to be deemed suitable for a Ripon Grammar School education.

For the council to consider children who live outside the selective area to be deemed suitable for a grammar school education at Ripon Grammar School they must reach the cut-off mark which is set by the performance of the children who live in the selective area, as explained above.

There is no guarantee that children who reach the cut-off mark in the selection tests will be allocated a place at Ripon Grammar School. If the school is oversubscribed with children who are deemed suitable for a grammar school education, places will be allocated in accordance with the published oversubscription criteria dependant on the type of place applied for ie day place or boarding place.

The council ensures that parents are aware that meeting the academic requirements for entry to Ripon Grammar School is not, in itself, a guarantee of a place at the school.

If a child is refused a place at the school on 1 March 2027, parents will be offered their statutory right of appeal for a place at the school.

The School Admissions Code 2021 states that LAs should take all reasonable steps to inform parents of the outcome of selection tests before the closing date for secondary applications on 31 October so as to allow parents time to make an informed decision when selecting their preferences.

The council must ensure that tests are accessible to children with special educational needs and disabilities, having regard to the reasonable adjustments for pupils with a disability required under equalities legislation.

Selection Testing 2027/2028

Selection testing will take place on a Saturday during term time in September 2026, the confirmed date will be published on the North Yorkshire website by 30 April 2026 and the results of selection testing will be sent out to parents no later than 16 October 2026.

Late tests will take place on designated dates during the year. There will be dates set in January for any children moving into the area or for any children where there is a genuine reason that is agreed by the council. Any other late tests will take place in April, June and August. Any testing after August will be organised by Ripon Grammar School

5.4 Late Applications

Any Common Application Form for school places received after the closing date of 31 October 2026 for secondary schools and 15 January 2027 for primary schools will be considered as a late application unless a reason has been provided that is acceptable to the council as the admission authority. Late applications whose reasons have been agreed will be considered along with applications received on time.

Applications received on or after 1 March 2027 for secondary schools or 16 April 2027 for primary schools will be co-ordinated using the same arrangements and criteria as previous applications. The offer of a school place will be made in accordance with the council's agreed and published scheme. However, applications received after the first day of the school year will be considered as in-year applications.

Any changes of address for secondary school applications received after 30 November 2026 and for primary school applications after 15 February 2027 will not be considered until after the respective national offer day.

Changes cannot be made, in respect of preferences, for secondary schools after 30 November 2026 and to primary applications after 15 February 2027. Any late applications and changes received after these dates will only be processed after the National allocation's dates of 1 March 2027 for secondary applications and 16 April 2027 for primary applications.

5.5 The Allocation of School Places

When allocating school places, the council will consider all preferences that have been expressed on a Common Application Form and will allocate places on the following basis:

- If a child is eligible for only one school preferred then a place will be allocated at that school
- If a child is eligible for a place at more than one of the schools that have been preferred then a place will be allocated at the school ranked as the highest preference
- If a child is not eligible for a place at any of the schools preferred then a place will be allocated at the child's nearest suitable school with available places.

No places will be held in reserve for any school.

5.6 The Offer of a Place

The council will notify all applicants about the school place that their child has been allocated on:

For applicants for a place at an infant, junior or primary school:

On 16 April 2027 – the National Offer Day for primary admissions

For applicants for a place at a secondary school:

On 1 March 2027 – the National Offer Day for secondary admissions.

5.7 Appeals

Where the council has been unable to offer a school place listed as a higher preference, parents will be offered the statutory right of appeal against the decision.

In such circumstances, the offer email or letter will give the reasons why the council has been unable to allocate the applicant's other listed preferences.

Applicants wishing to make an appeal to North Yorkshire Council will be advised to access the council's website to obtain further information and to access the appeals form. This can be accessed using the following link:

Applicants wishing to make an appeal to another admissions authority who do not participate in the North Yorkshire co-ordinated scheme will be advised to contact the admissions authority directly to confirm the arrangements for appeals.

Where the council has multiple appeals for one school these will be grouped appeals unless the council decides that this would not be appropriate.

Applicants who are not resident within North Yorkshire and who are refused a place at a North Yorkshire school by their home local authority will be informed that they should contact North Yorkshire Council to discuss the appeals process.

The outcome of successful admission appeals will lead to further modifications to the original allocation. These changes must be communicated to other admission authorities (and theirs to North Yorkshire Council) to enable all authorities to make final adjustments to the allocation.

Once appeals have been completed, the council will communicate with all the schools within North Yorkshire to ensure that they have a correct and up-to-date allocation list.

5.8 Waiting Lists

A waiting list must be maintained for all oversubscribed Community, Voluntary Controlled, Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Trust Schools and Academies including Free Schools until at least 31 December 2027. Each child added to a waiting list will require the list to be ranked again in line with the school's published oversubscription criteria.

The council requires the governing body of Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Trust Schools and Academies including Free Schools to advise them when places become available, unless the council are maintaining the schools waiting list on their behalf. The co-ordination regulations require that any offer of a school place must always be made by the council.

Where places become available they will be allocated from the waiting list in accordance with the published oversubscription criteria. The council will offer the place to the child at the top of the waiting list. Applicants will have five working days to reply before the place is offered to another child. If North Yorkshire Council, after using all advised contact details, is unable to contact a successful applicant to offer a place, the available place will be offered to the

next child who qualifies for that place from the waiting list. The council will confirm, in writing, that the child has been removed from the waiting list. Should a parent wish for a child(ren) to be placed back on the waiting list they will need to notify the council in writing. It is the applicant's responsibility to keep the authority informed of updated contact and address details.

If an applicant changes address whilst their child is on a waiting list, they will be required to send evidence of the new address. If the change of address affects their child's position(s) on any waiting list(s), then the position will be changed accordingly.

If the council is able to offer a place to a child from the waiting list who is not resident in North Yorkshire then the child's home local authority will be advised.

5.8 Children of UK service personnel and crown servants

For families of service personnel with a confirmed posting, or crown servants returning from overseas, the admission authority will:

- a. Allocate a place in advance of the family arriving in the area (as long as one is available), provided the application is accompanied by an official letter that declares a relocation date.
- b. Use the address at which the child will live when applying their oversubscription criteria, as long as the parents provide some evidence of their intended address. Admissions authorities **must** use a Unit or quartering address as the child's home address when considering the application against their oversubscription criteria, where a parent requests this.

5.9 Applications from Outside of England

Families moving or returning to North Yorkshire from outside of England can apply for a school place in the normal admission round.

Where a school is oversubscribed evidence that a family intend returning or moving to the North Yorkshire such as a copy of flight tickets or travel arrangements will be requested.

Where an application is made from another country, and the applicant is not resident in North Yorkshire on the last date for changes and is not able to provide the authority evidence of their return to the area, then the oversubscription criteria for the admission authorities of the preference school will be applied using the current home address

It is the responsibility of parents of foreign nationals to check that their children have a right under their UK entry conditions to study at a school before applying for a school place.

School Admissions 2027-28**

1. Introduction

*'Everyone in North Yorkshire should have
the opportunities to reach their maximum potential'*
Council Plan 2025-29

In-year admissions are those, which occur outside of the normal admissions round. The normal admissions round refers to admissions, which admit children into infant, junior, primary or secondary school in the first year of entry. Applications for a primary and secondary school are deemed to be 'in-year' if they are submitted on or after the first day of the first school term of the admission year.

The scheme applies to 'in year applications' for a place from Reception to Year 11 at a school in North Yorkshire which is participating in the scheme. Applications for a place in Year 12 or 13 should be made directly to the appropriate school or college.

There is no requirement for local authorities to coordinate in-year applications. However, the School Admissions Code 2021 allows local authorities to coordinate in-year admission applications for any or all own admission authority schools in their area, with the agreement of the relevant admission authorities.

Further information about the Council's arrangements for school admissions can be found on the council's website at: [School admissions | North Yorkshire Council](#).

This information includes:

- Information about the admission of children with an EHCP
- The Coordinated Admissions Scheme
- The Admissions Policy for all North Yorkshire community and voluntary controlled schools
- The number of allocations made at each school in the previous school year; and
- The number of schools that were oversubscribed and for which admission appeals were received, and the number and outcome of those appeals.

When considering making an application for a school place parents are also advised to consider the implications of the Council's home to school travel policy. Information about the policy can be found on the Council's website at: [School and college transport | North Yorkshire Council](#).

2. Aims and Expectations

The scheme aims to provide a framework for a fair and open way of determining in year applications for a school place.

This scheme is a coordinated scheme for in year applications and it is available to the admission authorities of all mainstream state funded primary, infant, junior and secondary schools in North Yorkshire.

In accordance with the requirements of the School Admission Code 2021, should an admission authority wish to utilise this scheme and agree for the council to coordinate in year admission to their schools, they should:

- inform the authority by 1 August whether they intend to be part of the local authority's in-year co-ordination scheme for the following year 1 September to 31 August
- provide the council with all the information that the council is required to publish on its website, including application forms if appropriate
- commit to the co-ordination, processes and timescales in relation to in year processes for the duration of the school year for which they have requested
- place information on their website by 31 August and throughout the whole school year advising interested parents/cares of the process of coordination by the council
- not admit pupils at any time during the school year other than through the process of coordination by the council

The council will publish information on its website by 31 August to explain how in-year applications can be made and how they will be dealt with from 1 September onwards in that year.

On request the council will provide information to prospective parents about the places still available in all schools within their area. To allow the council to comply, in line with the School Admissions Code 2021, admission authorities for all schools in the area must provide the council with details of the number of places available at their schools whenever this information is requested, to assist a parent seeking a school place. Details on available places should be provided no later than two school days following receipt of a request from the council.

Admission authorities must not refuse parents the opportunity to make an application or advise them that they can only be placed on a waiting list rather than make a formal application

In determining applications for school places, admission authorities must comply with parental preference unless the published oversubscription criteria or one of the statutory reasons for refusing admission applies.

With the exception of designated grammar schools, all maintained schools, and academies, including schools designated with a religious character, that have places available must offer a place to every child who has applied for one, without condition or the use of any oversubscription criteria, unless admitting the child would prejudice the efficient provision of education or use of resources (excluding the normal year of entry i.e. Reception, Year 3 and Year 7) .

For example, admission authorities **must not** refuse to admit a child solely because:

- they have applied later than other applicants;
- they are not of the faith of the school in the case of a school designated with a religious character;

- they have followed a different curriculum at their previous school; or
- information has not been received from their previous school.

Where an admission authority is dealing with multiple in-year admissions and does not have sufficient places for every child who has applied for one, they must allocate places based on the oversubscription criteria in their determined admission arrangements only.

3. The application and allocation process

Where a child is already attending a North Yorkshire school and they wish to transfer to another school, parents should, in the first instance discuss the transfer with the current school.

Applicants living in North Yorkshire who want to apply for a school place or those families who are moving into North Yorkshire may apply by completing an application form.

The form is for applicants to express a preference for places both in North Yorkshire schools and at schools maintained by other local authorities and academies in other local areas.

Only one application can be processed for a child at a given time. Where an application is received from more than one parent for the same child and the schools differ, the council will inform both applicants. In most circumstances, the application (s) will not be processed until agreement with both applicants is received or one applicant can prove that they have a legal right to have their preferences considered over the other.

Following submission the council may seek clarification on details in an application or further information in relation to the application including proof of address.

An application will be processed 6 school weeks in advance of when the place is required. Applications received more than a term in advance maybe put on hold or withdrawn, for example where there are outstanding applications for the current term or half term that require processing eg an application made in April for Year 3 in the next school year will be dealt with after applications for Year 2 for the same cohort in the current year.

Parents can list up to five preferences and the application also allows parents to:

- provide reasons why they want a place at that school, this information is passed to the relevant admission authority,
- list the schools in order of preference
- provide any other details that maybe pertinent to the processing of their application for example start date, future address, siblings at their preferred school
- Parents are advised to consider their catchment school for their home address as well as any implications of home to school transport when expressing preferences. Further information is available on the council's website and can be accessed using the hollowing link www.northyorks.gov.uk/admissions.

Where a preference is expressed for a school in another local authority area, the application and relevant information will be forwarded to the relevant local authority.

If a local authority in another area does not coordinate in year admissions then the council will accept an application from a resident of another local authority.

Families moving or returning to North Yorkshire from outside of England will have their application considered and an application will be processed up to 6 weeks in advance of the requested start date.

Where a school is oversubscribed evidence that a family intend returning or moving to North Yorkshire, such as a copy of flight tickets or travel plans, will be requested.

Where an application is made from another country, and the applicant is not able to provide the council evidence of a return to the area before the requested start date then the

oversubscription criteria for the admission authorities will be applied using the current home address.

It is the responsibility of parents of foreign nationals to check that their children have a right under their UK entry conditions to study at a school before applying

For families of service personnel with a confirmed posting, or crown servants returning from overseas, admission authorities **must**:

- Allocate a place in advance of the family arriving in the area (as long as one is available), provided the application is accompanied by an official letter that declares a relocation date. Admission authorities **must not** refuse to process an application and **must not** refuse a place solely because the family do not yet have an intended address, or do not yet live in the area.
- Use the address at which the child will live when applying their oversubscription criteria, as long as the parents provide some evidence of their intended address. Admissions authorities **must** use a Unit or quartering address as the child's home address when considering the application against their oversubscription criteria, where a parent requests this.

Voluntary aided schools or academies including free schools may require parents to complete a supplementary information form (SIF) when applying for a school place.

When the council receives an in-year application form from a parent applying for a place at a school in North Yorkshire school, then it will liaise with all schools listed as a preference, whilst still attempting to comply with the parent's highest ranked preference of school.

A child's eligibility for a place at a school will be determined by the preferred school's admission arrangements and with reference to the Fair Access Protocol (FAP) (see below).

The governing boards both primary and secondary voluntary aided, foundation, trust and academies including free schools must apply their admission arrangements to determine a child's eligibility for a place at the school.

Responses regarding the allocation of places or where an admission authority is not able to offer a school place should ideally be received within 5 days of a request by the council, and no later than 9 days of a request. This applies to community and voluntary controlled schools in North Yorkshire and from the schools of admission authorities that have agreed for the authority to coordinate in year applications. This will allow the authority to notify parents of the outcome (below) in line with the timescales in the School Admissions Code 2021

The council will aim to notify the parents of the outcome of their application in writing within 10 school days and no later than 15 school days.

The council will advise of which preference can be offered and where any higher preferences cannot be met we will provide the reason for refusal and provide information about the right to an admission appeal.

Where an admission authority manages its own in-year admissions, it **must** also notify the council of every application and its outcome as soon as reasonably practicable, but should aim to do so within two school days. This is to allow the council to keep up to date figures on the availability of places in the area and to ensure they are aware of any children who may not have a school place.

Parents who do not wish to accept a place at a school offered to them must notify the admission authority in writing within 2 weeks of the offer being made.

The date of admission to school is not set by the council as it is an agreement between the new school and parents.

It is normal for a child to start at the beginning of the term or half term, where a new school is within a reasonable distance. This allows for the new school to prepare adequately for their admission. Where a child moves into the area and the previous school is not with a reasonable distance the new schools will arrange a start date as soon as possible.

4. Admission of a child outside their normal age group

Parents may seek a place for their child outside of their normal age group, for example, if the child has experienced problems such as ill health.

Parents of a summer born child, i.e. children born from 1 April to 31 August may also request admission outside their normal age group.

When such a request is made, the admission authority will make a decision on the basis of the circumstances of the case and in the best interests of the child concerned, taking into account the views of the Headteacher and any supporting evidence provided by the parent. This will include taking account of the parent's views; information about the child's academic, social and emotional development; where relevant, their medical history and the views of a medical professional; whether they have previously been educated out of their normal age group; and whether they may naturally have fallen into a lower age group if it were not for being born prematurely.

Where an admission authority agrees to a request and, as a consequence of that decision, the child will be admitted to a relevant age group ie the age group pupils are normally admitted to the school, the council and admission authority will process the application as part of the main admissions round, unless the parental request is made too late to allow this. The determined admission arrangements and application of oversubscription may be applied.

An application will not be given lower priority on the basis that the child is being admitted out of their normal age group.

Parents have a statutory right to appeal against the refusal of a place at a school for which they have applied. This right does not apply if they are offered a place at the school, but it is not in their preferred age group.

5. Appeals

Where a place is refused at a school applicants have a statutory right to an admission appeal. If a preference for a place at a school is refused the applicant will be informed of the reason for a place being refused and the right of an appeal

This right of appeal does not apply if a place is allocated but is not in a parent/carer's preferred year group.

Parent/carers can only appeal once in an academic year unless, in exceptional circumstances, the admission authority has accepted a second application because of a significant and material change in circumstances.

Where there is more than one admission appeal for the same year group and same school, these appeals may be heard as a 'grouped appeal' for the first stage of the appeal. A parent's specific reasons for appealing, second stage, will still be heard individually.

Where a place is refused at a school outside of North Yorkshire, local appeal arrangements may differ from above. Applicants are advised to contact that local authority to discuss the arrangements.

6. The Fair Access Protocol (FAP)

A child's eligibility for a place at a school will be determined by the in year admission arrangements and when required with reference to the Fair Access Protocol.

The School Admissions Code states that each local authority must have a Fair Access Protocol that is agreed by the majority of schools in the area. The FAP is to ensure that unplaced and vulnerable children and those who are having difficulty in securing a school place in-year, are allocated a school place as quickly as possible.

Eligibility for the Fair Access Protocol does not limit a parent's right to make an in-year application to any school for their child. Admission authorities must process these applications in accordance with their usual in-year admission procedures and must not refuse to admit such children on the basis that they may be eligible to be placed via the Fair Access Protocol. Where an in year application is refused a parent will continue to have the right of appeal, even if the child has been offered a school place via the Fair Access Protocol.

There is no duty for local authorities or admission authorities to comply with parental preference when allocating places through the Fair Access Protocol, but parents' views should be taken into account.

**NORTH YORKSHIRE LOCAL AUTHORITY
ADMISSIONS POLICY FOR COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED
SCHOOLS FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 2027/28**

All governing boards are required by section 324 of the Education Act 1996 to admit to the school a child with an Educational Health and Care Plan (EHCP) that names the school. This is not an oversubscription criterion. This relates only to children who have undergone statutory assessment and for whom a final Educational Health and Care Plan has been issued.

If the number of applications exceeds the Published Admission Number (PAN), after the admission of children where the school is named in the Education Health and Care Plan the following oversubscription criteria will apply:

Children in higher priority groups will be offered places ahead of those in lower priority groups (priority group 1 being the highest and priority group 5 being the lowest). All applications within each priority group will be considered equally (i.e. all applications, regardless of order of preference).

Tie break:

If there are not enough places for all the children in one of these priority groups, the council will give priority first to those with a sibling at the school in September 2027, who live the nearest to the school (in all cases sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent / carer's partner who live permanently at the same address where the child for whom the school place is sought is living in the same family unit) and then to those living nearest the school.

All distance measurements are based on the nearest route which is recognised by North Yorkshire Council's electronic mapping system from a child's home address to school. The measurement is made from a fixed point within the dwelling, as identified by Ordnance Survey, to the nearest school entrance identified on the system using footpaths and roads. The routes measured to determine the allocation of school places will be those recognised by the electronic mapping system used by the school admissions team.

If the distance tie-break is not sufficient to distinguish between applicants in a particular priority group a random allocation will be used as set out in this document.

RANDOM ALLOCATION PROCEDURE

Random allocations are necessary where:

1. There is more than one applicant ranked equally according to the published admission rules and there are insufficient places available to allocate all of the equally ranked applicants
2. This occurs where applicants are equidistant from a school because the usual method of measuring distance to the school results in two unrelated applicants having the same distance measurement. Each random allocation event only holds for the allocation of the currently available school place. On any waiting list the remaining applicants remain equally ranked and any further place is offered as the result of a further random exercise. In making a random allocation it is important that there is scrutiny from a person who is not involved in the allocation process.

DEFINITION OF ROLES

Independent Scrutineer (IS) – this is a person who ensures the process is carried out in a correct and transparent way. The IS must be independent of the school for which the allocation is to be made and also must be independent of the Council's Admissions and Transport team.

Admissions Officer (AO) – this is an officer from the Council's Admissions and Transport team who is responsible for carrying out the administration of the random allocation procedure and recording the results, under the scrutiny of the IS.

Person who makes the draw (P) – this must be a person independent of the school for which the allocation is to be made and must be a person who is not part of the Council's Admissions and Transport team.

PROCESS TO BE FOLLOWED – N.B. This entire process is to be carried out in sight of, and under the scrutiny of, the IS

1. The AO allocates each pupil to be included in the draw a number and records it on the 'Random Allocation Cross Reference Sheet'. This is placed in a sealed envelope.
2. The AO prepares as many equal sized pieces of white paper as are necessary, which are numbered consecutively.
3. The AO folds each numbered sheet and seals them in identical envelopes, i.e. envelopes with no visibly identifiable differences.
4. The AO shuffles the envelopes and hands them to P who shuffles the envelopes again, picks one envelope and opens it.
5. The AO records the first number drawn on the 'Random Allocation Record sheet'.
6. If more than one place can be offered they continue to draw envelopes and record numbers until all of the available places are allocated.
7. The AO then opens the previously sealed envelope containing the 'Random Allocation cross reference sheet' and records the numbers drawn on the 'Random Allocation cross reference sheet', marking clearly which child(ren) has(have) been allocated a place and which have not.
8. Once the process has been completed, the AO, IS and P should sign and date both the 'Random Allocation Record sheet' and the 'Random Allocation cross reference sheet' in order to certify that the procedure has been carried out correctly.

**NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL
RIPON GRAMMAR SCHOOL- BOARDING ADMISSIONS POLICY
FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 2027/28**

All governing boards are required by section 324 of the Education Act 1996 to admit to the school a child with an Educational Health and Care Plan (EHCP) that names the school. This is not an oversubscription criterion. This relates only to children who have undergone statutory assessment and for whom a final Educational Health and Care Plan has been issued. A child must have reached the prescribed academic standard and also be considered "suitable for boarding" before being offered a place.

Ripon Grammar School is a designated grammar school that has day and boarding places (boarding places are weekly or termly). As an academically selective school all students must reach the prescribed academic standard before being offered a place. The school does not have to fill all of its places if applicants have not reached the required standard.

The published admission number for the school is 117, this includes 14 boarding places. If the total number of boarding applications does not reach 14 the remaining places are allocated as day places, for any subsequent boarding applications priority would be given to these over a day application, until 14 boarding places have been allocated.

Where the number of boarding applications for pupils who have reached the prescribed academic standard exceeds the number of places available then a boarding waiting list will be created.

Suitability for boarding

As a maintained boarding school Ripon Grammar School can interview applicants to assess suitability for boarding, this interview will only consider whether a child presents a serious health and safety hazard to other boarders or whether they would be able to cope with and benefit from a boarding environment.

Parents of all boarding applicants must complete a 'suitability for boarding' form, available from the school, when applying for a place. When assessing how suitable a child is for boarding, Ripon Grammar School considers the following:

1. whether a child is able to cope with, and benefit from, a boarding place
2. whether a child presents a serious health and safety hazard to other boarders
3. whether the school can match the needs of a student in a residential setting

Eligibility for boarding

As a state maintained boarding school, all boarders must have either a full British Citizen passport, or an Irish passport or, in the case of EEA (European Economic Area - EU together with Switzerland, Iceland, Norway and Lichtenstein) and HK BN[O] passport holders, be dependant children of a parent who is either permanently resident in the UK or who is in the UK on a work or study visa.

All boarding students whose home is outside the UK, or whose parents work abroad, must have a named guardian in the UK.

Admission of children outside their normal age group

Families may seek a place for their child outside of his/her normal age group under various circumstances such as ill health, if the child is gifted and talented, when the child has experienced problems or if the child is summer born (ie born April -August).

Where a child is being educated outside their normal age group and a parent wishes for their child to be considered for a place at Ripon Grammar School, parents should submit their request for their child to be admitted outside the normal age group (subject to them passing) before they sit the selection test.

Where a child is educated a year below their chronological age group, a parent should submit their request before their child reaches the end of year 4. In the event that their request to be taught outside their normal age group is refused by the child could then sit the test at the beginning of year 5 (ie with the bulk testing for Year 6 pupils) and submit an application for year 7 (this would mean they miss year 6).

Where a child does not reach the required standard in the selection test for entry into year 7, they are not able to sit the test again the following year.

Appointments to Committees According to Political Proportionality

Report of Assistant Chief Executive Legal and Democratic Services

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To make recommendations for changes to the allocation of seats on and appointments to committees, subject to proportional representation due to recent political changes.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Recent changes to the political make-up of the Council has had an effect on proportional representation. These changes have occurred since the last proportionality report that came to Full Council on 12 November 2025.

3.0 CHANGES SINCE THE LAST FULL COUNCIL MEETING ON 12 NOVEMBER 2025

- 3.1 The changes to the political make-up of the Council that have occurred since the last Full Council Meeting on 12 November 2025 due to changes of political group/party are as follows:

- Councillor John Mann formally moved from the Conservative and Independents Group to become an Unaffiliated Independent on 24 November 2025.
- Councillor Rich Maw formally moved from the Unaffiliated Independent Group to the Green and Independent Group on 8 December 2025.

- 3.2 The number of Councillors by political group and party is now as shown below:

- 3.3 Due to the above changes, a new political proportionality calculation has been completed and the updated seat allocation is attached at Appendix A.

- 3.4 The reduction of the number of Conservative and Independent councillors by one from 46 to 45 means that the Conservative and Independents no longer hold a majority. As such, the rule (see the Local Government and Housing Act 1989) whereby the majority of the seats must be allocated to the political group (if any) that holds the majority of seats on the Council, no longer applies. This then means that the Conservatives and Independents

lose 13 committee seats due to the purely mathematical application of proportionality, without the majority rule.

- 3.5 The 13 committee seats are then re-distributed in a way that corrects the historical anomalies that were caused by the previous application of the majority rule and which also takes into account Cllr John Mann moving from the Conservatives and Independents to become an Unaffiliated Independent, and Cllr Rich Maw moving from Unaffiliated Independent Group to the Green and Independent Group as below:

3.7 The practice of rounding up and rounding down the mathematical proportionality calculation means that there are 8 seats through proportionality but only 7 seats on the committee. One of the political groups may wish to give up a seat to the Unaffiliated Independents or it could be decided by Council that the Unaffiliated Independents are not allocated a seat as their proportionate share is the lowest of all groups with representatives on the committee.

3.9 The practice of rounding up and rounding down the mathematical proportionality calculation means that the Green and Independent Group, North Yorkshire Independent and Reform UK are each entitled to 0.47%. A seat was previously held by Cllr Maw as the Unaffiliated Independent representative. It needs to be decided across the 3 groups where the 2 seats are allocated.

4.0 MAJOR OUTSIDE BODIES

4.1 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires political proportionality to be applied to all outside bodies where the Council appoints three or more representatives. For North Yorkshire Council, this includes: the Police Fire and Crime Panel; the North York Moors National Park Authority; and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority.

Police Fire and Crime Panel

4.2 The allocation of seats on the Police Fire and Crime Panel is affected by the moves of Cllr John Mann from the Conservative and Independents Group to become an Unaffiliated Independent on 24 November 2025 and Cllr Rich Maw from an Unaffiliated Independent to the Green and Independent Group. The following table shows the allocation of seats prior to the move:

5.0 ANALYSIS

5.1 The total impact of these changes is detailed at Appendix A, which shows the purely mathematical proportionality basis for allocations. However, this calculation must comply with the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 as per section 6.0 of this report.

6.0 POLITICAL BALANCE GUIDANCE

6.1 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 introduced a requirement that certain appointments should be proportionate to the political composition of the Council.

- 6.2 The Council or the Committee must give effect to principles set out in the statutory provisions. The principles are:
- 1) All the seats must not be allocated to the same political group
 - 2) The majority of the seats must be allocated to the political group (if any) that holds the majority of seats on the Council
 - 3) Subject to 1) and 2), in the case of ordinary committees, the number of seats on the ordinary committees which are allocated to each political group must bear the same proportion to the total of all the seats on the ordinary committees as is borne by the number of members of that group to the membership of the Council.
- 6.3 Please note that “Ordinary Committees” of this Council are: Chief Officer Appointments and Disciplinary Committee; Employment Appeals Committee; Pension Fund Committee; Development Plan Committee; Strategic Planning Committee; (Transport) Appeals Committee; Standards and Governance Committee; and the General Licensing and Registration Committee.
- 6.4 Scrutiny committees and the Audit Committee are not “ordinary committees”.
- 6.5 This means that it is necessary to add up the total number of seats on all the ordinary committees. If a political group represents, for example, three quarters of the membership of the Council, it is entitled to three quarters of the total number of seats on all ordinary committees.
- 6.6 As a result, on some ordinary committees a political group may have more members than the application of the next principle would justify. It provides an allowance for the fact that calculating the proportion will not usually lead to whole numbers and so there will be rounding up and rounding down.
- 6.7 The duty on the Council is to give effect to these principles in *so far as is reasonably practicable*. This recognises that there cannot be an exact application of the rules.
- 6.8 Co-optees are not considered as part of calculating political balance except for any co-opted member with voting rights appointed to a committee with education functions under section 13(5) Local Government and Housing Act 1989 - see section 15 of that Act.

7.0 ADDITIONAL LOCAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 It is established practice that every Councillor, who is not on the Executive, has a place on either an Overview and Scrutiny committee or on the Audit Committee, where practicable.
- 7.2 During the period of this Council it has been the established practice to allocate 1 seat on Scrutiny and Audit committees and 1 seat on Ordinary Committees to each of the Unaffiliated Independents. This is practice rather than a legal requirement.

8.0 SUMMARY

- 8.1 The impact of the moves of Cllr John Mann from the Conservative and Independents Group to become an Unaffiliated Independent on 24 November 2025 and Councillor Rich Maw’s move from the Unaffiliated Independent Group to the Green and Independent Group on 8 December 2025 is summarised as below:
- Conservative and Independents lose 13 seats on scrutiny (-7) and ordinary committees (-6)
 - Liberal Democrats and Liberals gain 1 seat on ordinary committees

- Labour gain 1 seat on scrutiny committees
- North Yorkshire Independents gain 1 seat on scrutiny committees and 1 seat on ordinary committees
- Green and Independents gain 2 seats on scrutiny committees and 2 seats on ordinary committees
- Unaffiliated Independent gain 3 seats on scrutiny committees and 2 seats on ordinary committees (when treated as a political group as opposed to 3 individuals)
- On the Harrogate and Knaresborough Area Planning Committee, one of the political groups may wish to give up a seat to the Unaffiliated Independents or it could be decided that the Unaffiliated Independents are not allocated a seat as their proportionate share is the lowest of all groups with representatives on the committee
- On the Scarborough and Whitby Area Planning Committee, there are 2 seats to allocate and the Green and Independent group, North Yorkshire Independent and Reform UK are each entitled to 0.47% of a seat under proportionality. As such, it needs to be decided across the 3 groups how those 2 seats are allocated.
- The Conservatives and Independents lose 1 seat on the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority and the Liberal Democrats and Liberals gain 1 seat
- The Green and Independents Group are now entitled to the seat that was previously gifted to them by the North Yorkshire Independents on the Police Fire and Crime Panel.

9.0 ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 9.1 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 introduced a requirement that certain appointments should be proportionate to the political composition of the Council and the Group need to consider a fair distribution of seats.
- 9.2 Alternative allocations could be made as long as they apply with the rules identified in section 6.0. The proposals in paragraph 8.1 represents the application of these rules in so far as is reasonably practicable.

10.0 IMPLICATIONS

- 10.1 There are no financial, legal, equalities or climate change implications arising from this report.

11.0 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 11.1 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 introduced a requirement that certain appointments should be proportionate to the political composition of the Council. The changes to the political balance that resulted from change to political parties necessitate a review of the proportional allocation of seats.

12.0 RECOMMENDATION(S)

In considering the proportionality calculations and analysis, it is recommended that the following changes be made to the allocation of seats on committees in accordance with proportionality rules as follows:

- Conservative and Independents lose 13 seats on scrutiny (-7) and ordinary committees (-6)
- Liberal Democrats and Liberals gain 1 seat on ordinary committees
- Labour gain 1 seat on scrutiny committees
- North Yorkshire Independents gain 1 seat on scrutiny committees and 1 seat on ordinary committees
- Green and Independents gain 2 seats on scrutiny committees and 2 seats on ordinary committees

- Unaffiliated Independent gain 3 seats on scrutiny committees and 2 seats on ordinary committees (when treated as a political group as opposed to 3 individuals)
- On the Harrogate and Knaresborough Area Planning Committee, one of the political groups may wish to give up a seat to the Unaffiliated Independents or it could be decided that the Unaffiliated Independents are not allocated a seat as their proportionate share is the lowest of all groups with representatives on the committee
- On the Scarborough and Whitby Area Planning Committee, there are 2 seats to allocate and the Green and Independent Group, North Yorkshire Independents and Reform UK are each entitled to 0.47% of a seat under proportionality. As such, it needs to be decided across the 3 groups how those 2 seats are allocated.
- The Conservatives and Independents lose 1 seat on the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority and the Liberal Democrats and Liberals gain 1 seat
- The Green and Independents Group are now entitled to the seat that was previously gifted to them by the North Yorkshire Independents on the Police Fire and Crime Panel.
