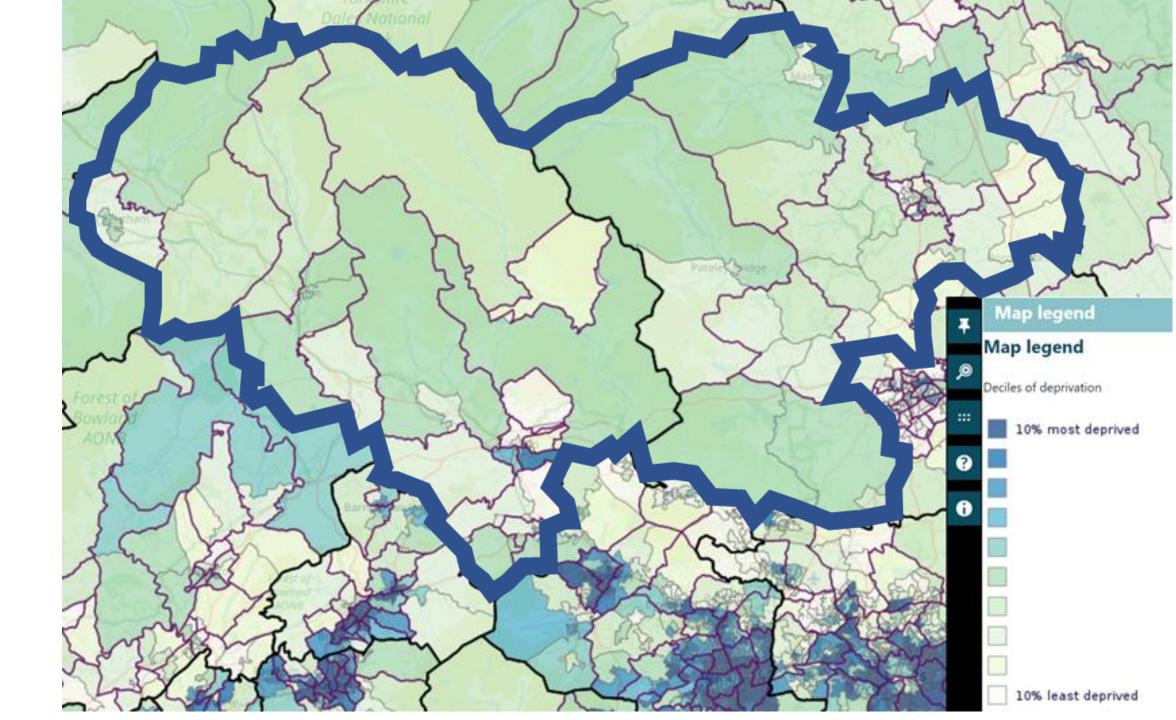

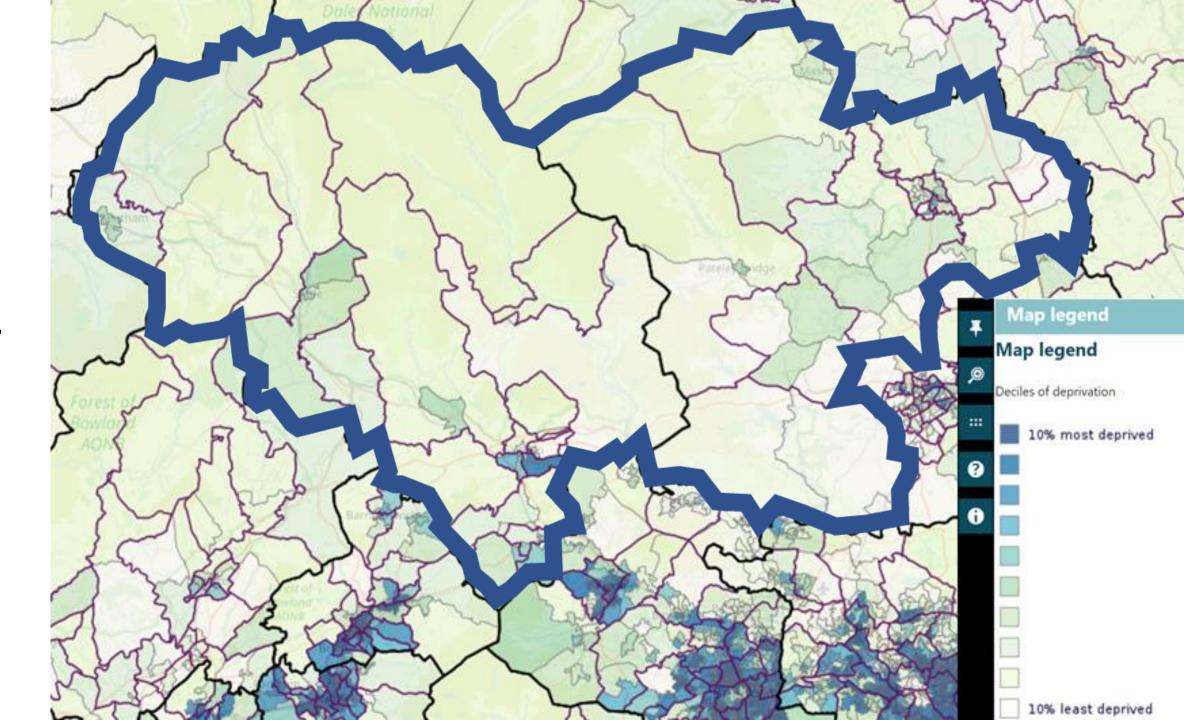

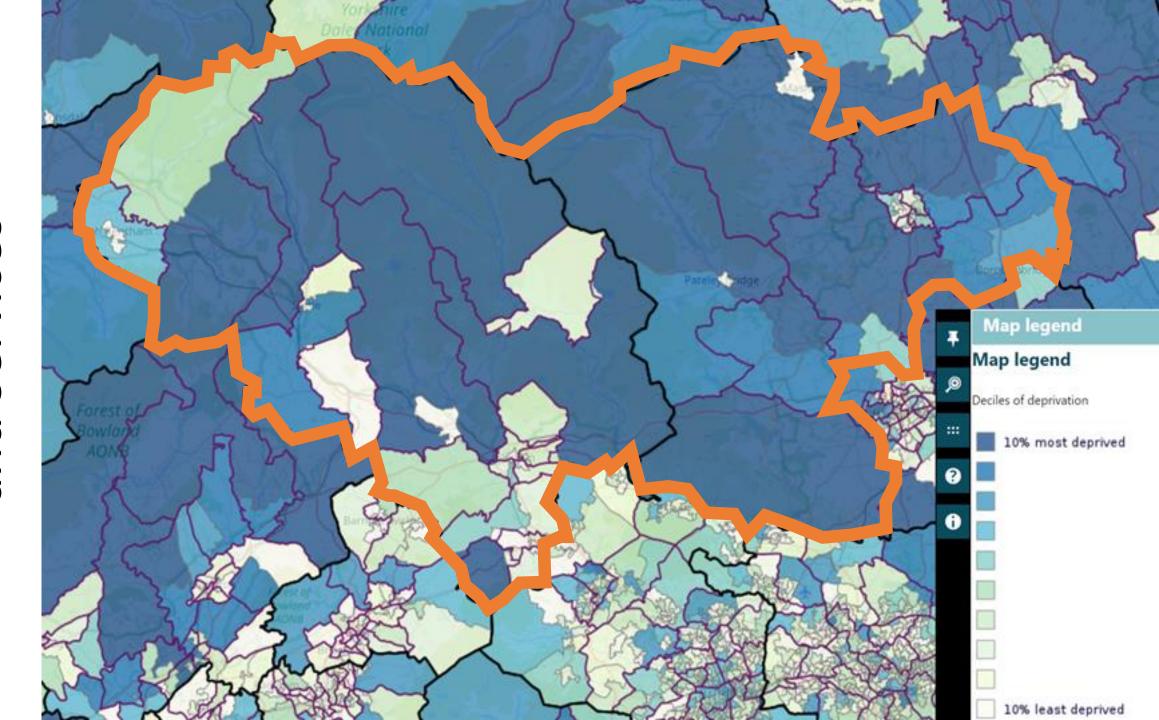

#### **Ripon Health Check**

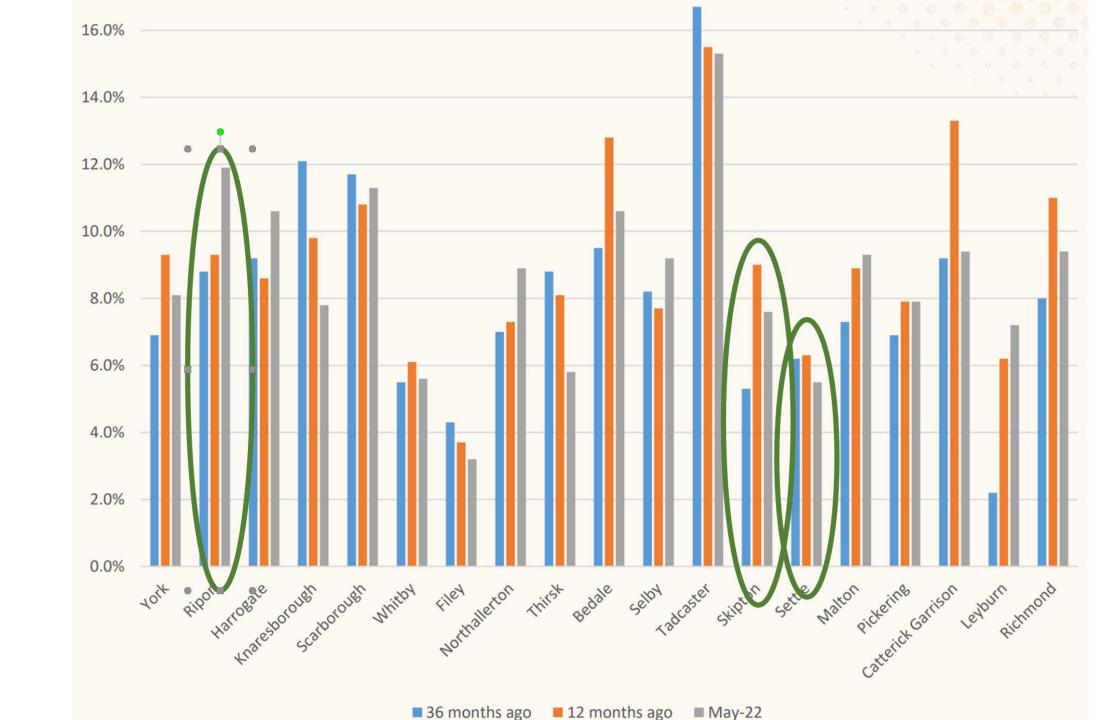
"For a small city centre the lack of integration and connectivity of assets, lack of promotion, information and routing to all components is a weakness. The surrounding workforce are not visible in the city centre. There are many assets to build on, and a need to focus on optimising the customer, user experience."

#### Same Formula

- Build on your strengths built heritage
- Focus on the visitor experience car parks to culture
- Promotion locally and regionally
- Increase footfall from residents, workers and visitors

#### Challenges

- Competition from towns and on-line
- Empty units creating blight
- Loss of wider uses



#### **Summary 1**

- Low productivity
- Low workplace wages
- Low economic activity rates due to early retirement
- Declining working age population
- Relatively high house prices/poor affordability
- Too high a reliance on micro economy
- Tourism underperforming becoming day trip reliant
- Not strong in growth sectors
- Car dominated town centres
- Large rural hinterland undergoing change



#### **Summary 2**

- Strong economic base with significant businesses
- Strong communication links access to A1 or into West Yorkshire and East Lancashire
- Good education attainment
- Low levels of unemployment
- Low levels of deprivation
- Attractive towns and villages
- Enviable visitor economy/heritage assets Ripon Cathedral, Bolton Abbey,
   Fountains Abbey,, Lightwater Valley, Three Peaks

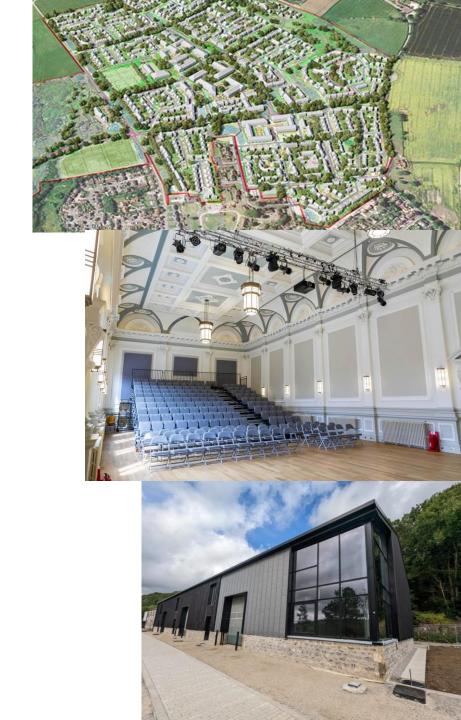
