

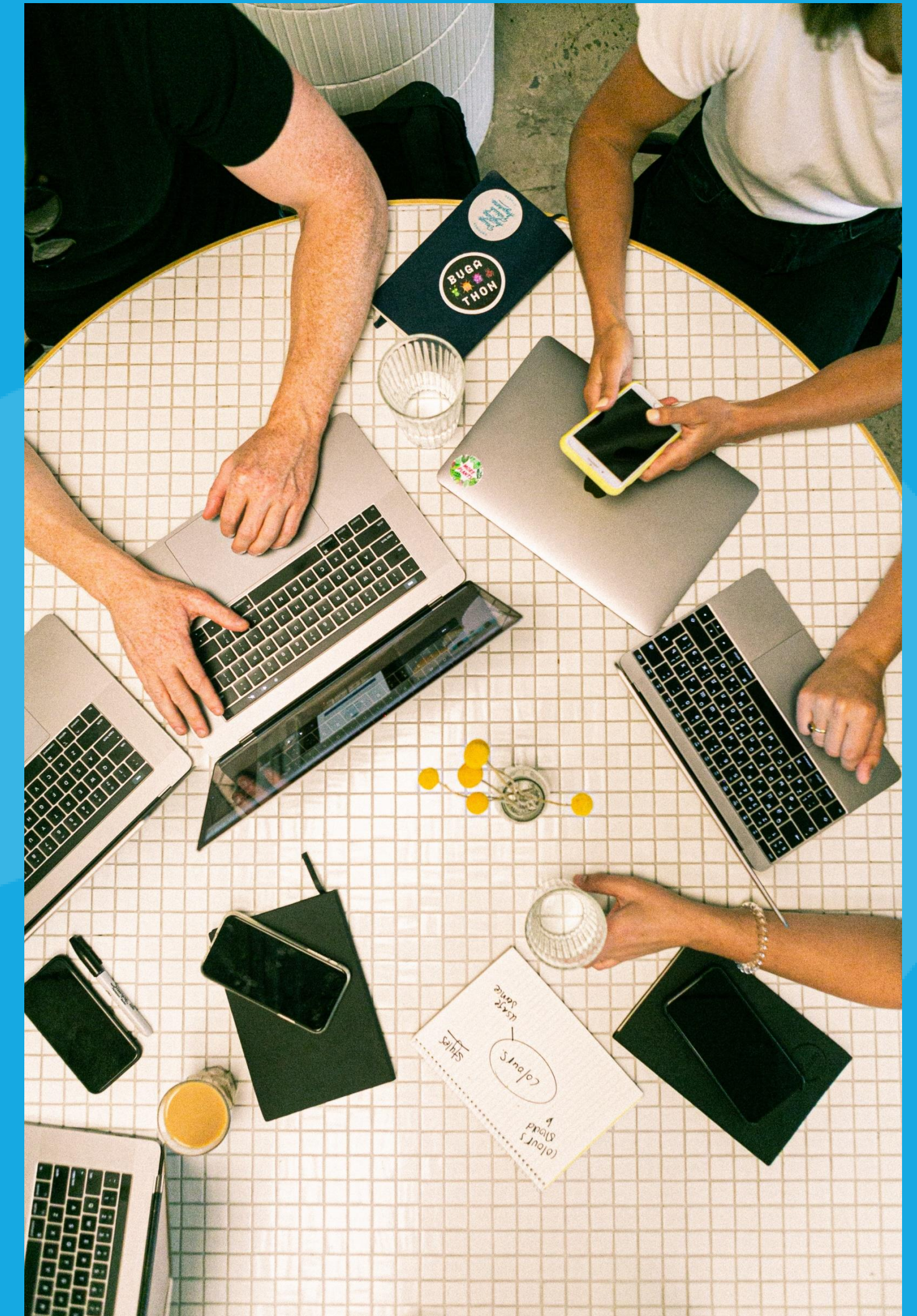

Positive relationship being developed with Department of Science, Innovation and Technology (DSIT)

Support for the establishment of a Cyber Security programme is included in the York & North Yorkshire Devolution plan

Completion of pilot programme - March 2023

Refinement of Strategy and development of 'roadmap' and business case - March 2023

Develop and deliver Phase 2 activity - April 2023-March 2024

Present business case to Combined authority - April 2023 onward

Scale-up delivery across North Yorkshire – April 2024 onward
