Safe Accommodation

IDAS has safe accommodation for anyone fleeing domestic abuse.

We have women only refuges, self-contained flats, Safe Havens (volunteer host accommodation) and access to the refuge database.

We can help find accommodation across Yorkshire and nationwide.



Support for adult survivors

- We provide 1-1 support for survivors of domestic abuse and sexual violence through a needs-led, trauma-informed approach.
- We support survivors to create a personalised safety plan and offer practical solutions to keep them safe at home.

- We also offer group support to empower and rebuild confidence
- We also have Court IDVA's to support survivors going through family court and offer continued training to magistrates.





Our work in Skipton and Ripon

- Our Craven team dedicated time to going out into some of the most rural areas of the district to make important connections and share resources.
- We will be beginning workshops with Craven College through their Enrichment Programme.
- Our team attended Ripon Races and had stalls for games and a silent auction to fundraise.

• Our refuge team have built good relationships with local services in Ripon to ensure clients are supported when they move into the community for example with sourcing appliances and bedding.

£20 could provide essential supplies to a family escaping domestic abuse £60 could help fund a night in emergency accommodation for a family £100 could provide support sessions to help someone recover from abuse
