Request to Bid for Coronation Living Heritage Fund

Report of the Assistant Director – Environmental Services and Climate Change

1.0 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 To request approval from the Director of Environment in consultation with the Assistant Director of Resources to make a bid of up to £50,000 to DEFRA's 'Coronation Living Heritage Fund' for the development of two 'micro' woods in Selby and Tadcaster.

1.2 As set out in the Forward Plan, to consider the additional bid for a 'Coronation Community Orchard' on behalf of Selby Town Council of up to £50,000, and if appropriate, to request approval from the Director of Environment in consultation with the Assistant Director of Resources to make a bid of up to £50,000 to the 'Coronation Living Heritage Fund' Community Orchard fund.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 This Coronation Living Heritage Fund offers capital funding to local authorities for tree planting projects to celebrate the King's coronation and produce a lasting legacy of the next generation of heritage trees. Funding is available for two different types of projects:
 - Coronation Miyawaki woods: to plant miniature areas of woodland in urban areas using the Miyawaki method, usually the size of a tennis court.
 - Coronation community orchards grants: to provide grants for local people and groups to establish community orchards.
- 2.2 Between £10,000 and £50,000 is available per local authority for each of the above projects, and each authority may apply for up to two projects.
- 2.3 Applications are made to an online portal by 26 September 2023,10am.
- 2.4 Planting may take place up to March 2025.

3.0 REPORT

- 3.1 Selby District Council commissioned the Ground Work Trust to survey areas of public land in Selby District for the purpose of tree planting. A review of these surveys has identified two areas suitable for the creation of a coronation micro woods:
 - Wighill Park, Parkland Drive, Tadcaster
 - Leeds Road Recreation Ground, Selby
- 3.2 Site plans are in Appendix A. The boundaries shown on the plans are suggested fence lines. The tree planting will be delivered within the fenced areas, but with pedestrian access inside, to allow for maintenance visits, so the actual planting areas smaller than the areas shown on the plans.

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- 3.3 The sites have been selected as they are:
 - Both sites sit on the edge of housing areas and provide links to wider habitats providing wildlife corridors.
 - They are also not too close to neighbours, so the risk of local opposition is mitigated.
 - There are opportunities to involve local schools and communities in the planting works, recording tree health and growth and longer-term maintenance, over and above the 3-year planned maintenance which forms part of the bid costs.
- 3.4 Proposed costing for both sites (with a breakdown of the costs per site) have been provided by Groundwork Trust including 3 years maintenance. These are in line with the Coronation Living Heritage guidelines. Competitive quotes for all materials costs to ensure value for money at the point of delivery will be sourced.
- 3.4.1 It is not proposed to use plastic tree guards. A rabbit proof fence is proposed in the initial planting stage, but if plastic tree guards are used, they will be collected and recycled at a known scheme.
- 3.5 If successful, it is proposed that the implementation would be procured for external delivery and would include encouragement of local people to volunteer in the planting and onwards maintenance and tree health checks.
- 3.6 It is therefore proposed that a bid for up to £50,000 be made to the Coronation Living Heritage Fund.
- 3.7 Local Authorities may make applications to the Coronation Community Orchard Fund on behalf of community groups or Town and Parish Councils that are not eligible to apply directly. Selby Town Council had indicated that they were at an early stage in developing a Community Orchard project at the Bondgate Woodland in Selby, which is in their ownership. However, further communication has indicated that this is now no longer required. It is therefore not proposed to apply to the Coronation Community Orchard Fund on behalf of Selby Town Council.

4.0 CONSULTATION

- 4.1 Selby Town Council and Tadcaster Town Council have been consulted on the proposals and confirmed support to proceed.
- 4.2 Selby Sustainability Partnership have been consulted and confirmed support to proceed.

5.0 CONTRIBUTION TO COUNCIL PRIORITIES

- 5.1 Council Plan: A carbon neutral council
- 5.2 North Yorkshire Council Climate Change Strategy:
 - 5(c) Communications and Engagement: Encouraging everyone to take climate responsible choices.
 - 7(f) Capturing and storing carbon
 - 9(e) Sustainable land use and greenspaces
 - (f) tree planting at scale

6.0 ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 6.1 Alternative sites were considered from the original tree survey
- 6.2 Not to bid: this was rejected as the funding scheme provides the opportunity for the Council to deliver on multiple objectives.

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7.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 7.1 This is a bid for a capital grant of up to £50,000 to DEFRA's 'Coronation Living Heritage Fund'. This is an external fund from HM Government DEFRA which does not require match funding from the Council. Ongoing annual maintenance revenue costs are covered by the grant for the first three years but, if successful in the grant application, these would become a cost to NYC after the third year. This is anticipated to be low cost and not more than £500per annum as the prescribed Miyawaki method of establishment results in reduced long term maintenance specification. This ongoing revenue cost can be met from existing budgets within the Parks and Grounds service.
- 7.2 If successful, funding would be provided in November 2023, in advance of project commencement.
- 7.3 Should the grant be offered, 'Grant Acceptance' protocols will be utilised to ensure that the terms and conditions of the grant are acceptable prior to acceptance of the grant.

8.0 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

8.1 If the bid is successful, acceptance of the funding may require NYC to enter into a formal grant agreement. Any legal agreement required to be signed, will be reviewed by legal services and if any of the terms and conditions present unacceptable risk for the Council then the grant offer would be declined.

9.0 EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

9.1 There are no anticipated equalities implications. An Equalities Impact Assessment Screening report as appended in Appendix B. This highlighted the need to improve access for wheelchair users at the Tadcaster site, which has consequently been included in the costings.

10.0 CLIMATE CHANGE IMPLICATIONS

10.1 A Climate Change Impact Assessment is in Appendix C.

11.0 REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

11.0 The recommendations will enable tree planting in Selby and Tadcaster to proceed, providing improved public open space, biodiversity and opportunities for engagement with local people. It provides an opportunity to mark the ascendancy of King Charles III which contributes to civic pride in place.

12.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 12.1 To request approval of the Director of Environment in consultation with the Assistant Director -Resources to submit an application bid of up to £50,000 to the 'Coronation Living Heritage Fund' for the development of two 'micro' woods in Selby and Tadcaster.
- 12.2 To not apply or the Coronation Living Heritage Fund Community Orchard Fund.
