In April 2023 North Yorkshire Police requested a review of the Premises Licence for JK's Bar, Wellington Road Whitby. This was due to multiple breaches of the licence conditions, the crime and disorder and anti-social behavior associated with the premises.

On the 23rd May 2023 the licensing sub-committee held the review hearing and determined that the premises licence would remain with an additional condition in that a personal licence holder would be in the public areas of the premises when the retail sale of alcohol takes place, and that Bulent Osman be removed as the Designated Premises Supervisor.

Despite the review hearing, removal of Mr. Osman as DPS and addition of conditions, the premises continue to breach the conditions attached to the premises licence and show a complete disregard not only to the responsible authorities but to the residents, visitors and local businesses because of the crime, disorder and anti-social behavior attributed to the bar.

JK's Bar continues to seriously undermine the licensing objectives, specifically:-

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety &
- The Prevention of public nuisance.

North Yorkshire police see no alternative than to seek a revocation of the Premises Licence.

In April 2023, North Yorkshire Police took JK's Bar, Wellington Road, Whitby to a licensing review due to repeated breaches of the Premises Licence conditions, incidents of crime and disorder and Anti-social behavior.

On the 23rd May 2023, North Yorkshire Council licensing sub committee held the review hearing at Scarborough Town Hall whereby the premises licence remained but removed Bulent Osman as the Designated Premises Supervisor and included a condition that at least one Personal Licence Holder shall be on duty in the public areas of the premises at all times when the retail sale of alcohol licensable activity takes place.

Members of the committee said

'There have been so many alleged offences of breaching the licence conditions over a long period of time. It is clearly important that conditions are complied with to prevent crime and disorder in the night time economy and to maintain public safety.

Mr Osman accepted that patrons of his premises were intoxicated and it is important that CCTV is in operation at such premises to retain evidence in the night time environment where a variety of offences commonly occur. Without providing and recording staff training and also retaining CCTV the licensing objectives have been undermined. Every opportunity to put matters right have been provided but this has not been taken by Mr Osman and the licensing objectives continue to be seriously undermined. (DOC REF 1)

On the 3rd June 2023 a member of the public reported that there were lots of people spilling out of JK's bar and onto the street, drinking. The caller said that the licence for the bar had been reviewed last week and special measures had been put in place and the landlord is unable to operate his own bar. It is intimidating for families and residents walking past. (DOC REF 2)

At 03:14 on the 4th June 2023 the ambulance service contacted the police as they were dealing with a male who had a head injury and was on the floor outside the bar, his family were there causing issues and being aggressive towards the ambulance crew (DOC REF 3)

Between the 4th and 7th June 2023 Four noise complaints were received from local retailers saying that the excessive noise and Anti Social behavior coming from the bars on Wellington Road were having a detrimental effect on their businesses. (DOC REF 4)

On the 8th June 2023 PC Chadwick and PC Graham from the police alcohol licensing unit attended JK's Bar for a licensing visit post-review. Bulent Osman was present along with Matthew Robinson. Mr Osman said that Mr. Robinson was currently doing his personal licence course and he would, once he'd obtained his personal licence, become the DPS and would also manage the premises. The conditions attached to the premises licence were discussed and the Staff training documents were requested for inspection. Mr Osman said that the staff training would be one of Mr. Robinsons jobs when he took over but it hadn't been done at that time and there was no documentation.

Staff training and documentation is a condition on the premises licence, Annex 2 conditions 9 & 10, and therefore a closure notice under Section 19 of the Criminal Justice and police Act was issued with a requirement to have staff training completed and documented by the 15th June 2023. (DOC REF 5)

The incidents from the weekend were discussed and the CCTV was viewed which showed the outside area on the 3rd June was extremely busy with customers from both bars spilling out onto the street, drinking and causing a nuisance to other members of the public. The incident from the 4th June 2023 was also viewed which showed the male with the head injury had been drinking at JK's prior to an altercation taking place outside. PC Chadwick made a written request to Mr Osman for CCTV footage (DOC REF 6)

PC Graham made some enquiries with the council highways department as there had been so many complaints regarding the outside area and confirmation was received that JK's did not have a street café licence.

Mr Osman then applied to the Highways department for a street café licence.

On the 14th June 2023 notification was received from North Yorkshire Council saying that the review appeal period had finished and no application for an appeal had been lodged. The premises were now without a DPS as Mr Osman was no longer permitted to carry out this role.

On the evening of the 16th June 2023 a DPS variation was submitted to the council naming Martin Marot as the DPS. This was with immediate effect and was confirmed as validated by

the council on the 19th June 2023.

On the 21st June 2023 Martin Marot withdrew himself as DPS at JK's Bar.

On the 23rd June Matthew Robinson became the DPS at JK's.

On the 10th July a further complaint was made regarding the behavior of customers in the outside areas of both barson Wellington Road, drunken people and vomiting in the street, during a Saturday afternoon. (DOC REF 7)

On the 28th July 2023 Matthew Robinson removes himself as DPS at JK's. He states he only worked that initial weekend and was then made to feel unwelcome at the premises. He believes he was just used as a name on the Premises Licence as they needed a DPS. He did not receive any training for the role or any payment for the work he did, he wasn't going to risk his licence if he wasn't there to supervise what was going on. (DOC REF 8)

On the 28th July 2023 Darren Harrison is appointed as the new DPS at JK's Bar.

On the 2nd August 2023 PC Chadwick & Sergeant Stoffel from the police alcohol licensing unit and council enforcement officer Lisa Templeton attend JK's to conduct a licensing compliance visit and discuss with Mr. Osman the multiple recent changes of DPS at the venue. Whilst at the premises the licence conditions were checked for compliance and there were no visible signs asking the customers to be respectful and leave quietly and when we arrived the doors were wide open and music was playing. The licence condition states ; All doors to the premises must be kept closed, save for access and egress, when live or recorded music is being provided. For the avoidance of doubt, this includes both the inner and outer doors at the lobby entrance to the premises.

A closure notice under Section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 was issued for breaches of conditions 5 & 6 of Annex 2. (DOC REF 9)

On the 29th August 2023 Darren Harrison removes himself as DPS.

On the 30th August 2023 Flash Baldwin is appointed as DPS. PC Chadwick contacts Mr Baldwin to explain that due to an ongoing investigation he is involved in the police could not support his application at this time, Mr Baldwin says that he will withdraw his application.

On the 8th September 2023 Flash Baldwin removes himself as DPS

On the 12th September 2023 Thomas Purvis becomes the DPS at JK's Bar.

On the 14th September 2023 PC Chadwick and PC Graham are on other enquiries in Whitby town and turn into Wellington Road, Whitby. It is noted that JK's Bar did not have barriers in place to denote their outside area which is a requirement of their pavement café licence. A member of bar staff from JK's, Mandy Wilson, is seen to walk over to the public bins and dispose of several empty bottles from the bar, she then returns to the premises. Upon checking the bin it is almost full with similar empty bottles.

The officers attend JK's and speak to Bulent Osman and Ms Wilson, Initially they are asked where the outside barriers are and Mr Osman said they were out, when in fact there were only a couple which were inadequate. He was asked about his waste disposal and officers had just seen his bar staff using the public bins. He said he had a waste disposal agreement in place and he would tell his bar staff not to do that again. He was asked when the new DPS Mr Purvis would be in and Mr Osman didn't give an answer.

The officers then went to the bar opposite and informed them that the barriers were not out and this was dealt with immediately.

Whilst at the bar opposite JK's the officers were made aware of a recent incident outside in the street whereby an altercation took place at JK's which then led to one of the males stealing a bottle of wine from a neighbouring shop and smashing it on the floor, a fight then ensues and other customers, members of the public and families watch on. 2 members of SIA registered door staff from other premises in the town go to JK's to assist and detain the offenders until police arrive. Both males are arrested for affray. (DOC REF 10)

On the 12th October 2023 PC's Graham and Chadwick were on enquiries in Whitby town when it was noted again that the outside barriers at JK's were not deployed outside as required in the pavement licence and customers were sat outside drinking. The officers went inside and spoke to Mandy Wilson who was the only person working. There were a few people sat at the bar drinking and an elderly male sat at a table inside, drinking. The current DPS was not present and neither was Mr Osman. MsWilson does not have a personal licence, despite her informing the officers that she had completed her personal licence course.

This was a breach of the additional condition added to the licence by the Licensing Sub Committee at the review hearing 5 months previously which states :-

At least one personal licence holder shall be on duty in the public areas of the premises at all times when the retail sale of alcohol licensable activity takes place.

Initially Ms Wilson said the Mr Osman had just popped out however the group at the bar said he had been gone for about 1 hour and then Ms Wilson said that he had gone back to Thornaby.

PC Chadwick issued a closure notice under Section 19 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 for a breach of condition 3 under Annex 3. (DOC REF 11) and statements from the officers (DOC REF 12)

During that visit the other conditions were checked for compliance Ms Wilson could not locate the licence however upon checking the CCTV system in the cellar PC Graham found the premises licence but Ms Wilson was unable to operate the CCTV and the fire exits were again bolted from the inside. In September 2022 PC Chadwick and PC Graham reported JK's to the Fire Service for bolting the fire escape doors and Mr Osman was aware of this and the serious consequences for public Safety.

PC Graham made further contact with the Highways department regarding the outside area and also the Fire Service with regards to bolting the fire exits.

Mr Osman was asked to attend Whitby Police Station on the 26th October 2023 to be interviewed under caution regarding the licence breaches identified above. A letter was sent via e-mail and to his home address (as registered on the premises licence)

On the 25th October 2023 PC Chadwick and Sgt Stoffel were in Whitby and attended JK's to speak to Mr Osman to ensure he would attend for interview, Mr Osman claimed that his e mail had been hacked and he had not received anything. Mr Osman asked the officers if it could be rearranged until the following Tuesday as he had no one to look after the bar so it was agreed that he would attend on Tuesday 31st October 2023.

On Monday 30th October 2023 PC Chadwick received an e mail from a solicitor who was representing Mr Osman saying that it would need to be rearranged and suggested the week commencing the 20th November.

The premises is now on the 6th DPS in 5 months, there have been 21 incidents reported of which 14 are violent or public order incidents (DOC REF13), there have been 3 further Section 19 closure notices for breaches of the licence conditions and warnings from the Highways department regarding the outside area, concerns from the Fire Service and reports to the environmental agency regarding waste disposal.

Mr Osman has shown a complete disregard to responsible authorities by continuing to commit offences under the Licensing Act 2003, despite being given a second opportunity by the licensing Sub Committee on the 23rd May 2023.

He has demonstrated on numerous occasions that he is unwilling or unable to comply with the requirements needed to run a licensed premises safely and legally.

Mr Osman was the sole director of the company that is the Premises Licence Holder until the

27th August 2023 when he appointed a new director, Mr Berkan OKTAY. Mr Osman is currently the secretary for the company who has significant influence and control. Mr Oktay has never been present at any meeting with the police and his name has never been mentioned.

Mr Osman is barred from being the DPS by the previous licensing sub- committee to limit his personal involvement in the premises and to drive compliance but in actual fact Mr Osman is even more hands-on since the previous review and sustained non-compliance with licence conditions has continued, and in fact incidents of violence have got worse during this period. Given Mr. Osman has had his direct involvement in the management of this premises curtailed to the fullest extent possible by the hearing previously, revocation is sought in this instance.

North Yorkshire Police are not willing to delay the submission of a second review until Mr Osman is available for interview and they ask the licensing sub committee to consider revoking the premises licence for JK's Bar as it continues to seriously undermine the licensing objectives and would respectfully direct members to Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998" it shall be the duty of each authority to which the section applies to do all it reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in its area."

... that are relevant and consideration has been given to these today

and to maintain public safety. Mr Osman has also accepted that there has a been a breach in relation to not having door staff on.

There was also an incident where an alleged drink spiking incident took place and the CCTV was wiped. Mr Osman accepted that patrons of his premises were intoxicated and it is important that CCTV is in operation at such premises to retain evidence in the night time environment where a variety of offences commonly occur. Without providing and recording staff training and also retaining CCTV the licensing objectives have been undermined. Every opportunity to put matters right have been provided but this has not been taken by Mr Osman and the licensing objectives continue to be seriously undermined.

The sub committee also asked for an occupancy figure to be obtained as soon as possible and added to the licence.

It is the decision of the sub-committee today:

To remove the Designated Premises Supervisor

To add a condition to the licence that at least one personal licence holder shall be on duty in the public areas of the premises at all times when the retail sale of alcohol licensable activity takes place.

The sub-committee believe that

The DPS has accepted that the premises requires improvement. This remains the case after the police's interventions with the Premises improvement plan and the section 19 notices served on the premises. He has stated that 'I like to delegate, I am not hands on, I don't see it as my role.' A DPS should be hands on and is a responsible position. Unfortunately there is no one to delegate to and staff have not remained in post and there has been a high turnover of staff.

Of particular concern are the repeated issues of not documenting staff training which constitutes a breach of the licence. Different staff members will have had different levels of training, but none were able to satisfy the police in relation to operating the CCTV. This is a crucial condition on the licence. It is not acceptable to merely take on staff assuming that they will have had training. Checks needed to be made and in any event, training should be provided which looks at the conditions on the premises licence. The DPS employed a 16 year old at the premises. The DPS accepted that he was present at the premises until midnight and the student stated that he was actually there later than that. The licence states that 'No persons under the age of 18 shall be permitted to remain on the premises until after 20:30 unless the premises has been hired for an event or function at which the general public are excluded.' Had that individual been properly trained the content of the premises licence should have been discussed with him. The protection of children from harm licensing objective is engaged by breaching the licence condition.

Mr Osman has no idea about the duties and responsibilities of the DPS. He assumed someone had a personal licence without making checks.

There have been so many alleged offences of breaching the licence conditions over a long period of time. It is clearly important that conditions are complied with to prevent crime and disorder in the night time economy

I am the above named person and live at the address supplied to the police.

At about the end of May 2023 my friend said that she was interested in taking over a bar in Whitby, this was JK's bar on Wellington Road, Whitby. She asked me if I wanted to help out as she knew I had experience within the licensing trade, I was happy to help. On the 8th June 2023 I met with Bulent Osman, who was the current owner of the bar along with Gordon PENTER whom I have known for at least the last 5 years and Gordon was looking at buying the premises and I was going to run it for him. Gordon decided not to progress with the sale so Bulent and my friend Lucy said they would run it together and I would do my personal licence course and be nominated as the DPS. I was aware the premises had been taken to a licensing review recently and knew that additional conditions had been put on the licence, one of which was to have a personal licence holder there at all times when the premises was open. I hadn't got my personal licence when I first met Bulent but I had intentions of doing it and began an online course. Bulent needed someone as DPS on the licence as a matter of urgency so I spoke to my good friend who was the DPS at The Fylingdales Inn, Martin Morat, and he agreed to be the DPS until I got my personal licence providing everything was done correctly and his licence wasn't put at risk.

On the 16th June 2023 I went to the bar to see how things were going. I was there for at least half an hour and saw customers being served alcohol even through Bulent wasn't there. I sent him a text message saying 'We have to have someone with a personal licence on-site at all times mate, if Martin comes down he'll remove himself as DPS because it's a breach of licence'. Bulent responded with 'I am here, I'm three minutes away, there's no breach'

I have taken a screenshot of this message and exhibit this as MDR/1

On Monday 19th June 2023 Martin removed himself as DPS. I completed my course and my personal licence was issued by North Yorkshire Council on 23rd June 2023. I immediately completed the paperwork to show me as DPS and this was sent to the council electronically. I worked at the premises that weekend but then it became apparent that Bulent didn't want me at the premises and I was there just as a named DPS. I was never paid anything for the work I had done.

On the 14th July 2023 I sent a text message to Bulent saying "I have had a think and I'm not prepared to carry on as DPS, if I am not there I can't supervise the alcohol sale and I am not being there without getting paid. Probably not what you want to hear but I am risking 6 months prison and an unlimited fine for nothing"

I heard nothing at all back from Bulent and on Friday 21st July 2023 I sent the following text message "Still not had a reply and its been another week. I'll phone and cancel it this afternoon"

I exhibit screenshots of these messages as MDR/2.

I then contacted the council licensing department to request I be removed as DPS at JK's bar. They sent me through the relevant paperwork which I completed and emailed straight back. Bulent was fully aware that that I was removing myself as DPS when I sent the text messages on the 14th and 21st July 2023 and he never once attempted to contact me.

I had never signed a contract, never had any staff training and never been paid for any of the work I had done.

I last saw Bulent on the 3rd August 2023 when I attended the premises to get my tools back. He stood there screaming and shouting at me and told me that I wouldn't get my tools back, which would be approximately £1000 to replace. I will make a separate report to the police regarding this.

I must have only been at the premises about 4 times but I wasn't happy with what I saw and how he ran the place. He would buy very large bottles of cheap vodka which were under the bar and they had a blue label on and he would fill up the Smirnoff bottles with this cheap vodka and sell it as Smirnoff Vodka.

I wanted to run a legitimate business, and this was never going to happen with Bulent Osman there. I want nothing more to do with the premises and I am happy to assist the police in any way I can

I am PC Deborah Chadwick and I am a Police Alcohol Licensing Officer based at Scarborough Police Station. I have been in this role for the last 12 years and predominantly cover Scarborough and Ryedale areas.

On Thursday 12th October 2023 I was on duty in Whitby with PC 752 Alison Graham. We attended a couple of premises in Whitby regarding licensing enquiries and then we headed back via Wellington Road where we saw people sat in the outside area of JK's bar drinking alcohol, and there were no barriers out defining the outside area, which is a requirement on the Pavement Café Licence.

At about 2.15pm we went inside the premises and there were 3 or 4 people sat at the bar drinking alcohol and another elderly male sat at a table inside drinking what looked like a pint of lager. A member of bar staff whom I know as Mandy came over to us and I asked if Bulent Osman was about. Mandy informed me that he had just popped out and wouldn't be long. I know Mandy from many previous visits to the premises and she knows that myself and PC Graham are police officers who deal with licensed premises.

On the 23rd May 2023 North Yorkshire Police took JK's Bar to a licensing review due to multiple breaches of the premises licence. At the hearing (Whereby Mandy was present) the licensing sub-committee decided to remove Bulent Osman as the DPS and added the following condition :-

At least one personal licence holder shall be on duty in the public areas of the premises at all times when the retail sale of alcohol licensable activity takes place.

PC Graham asked to look at the incident book where the names of the staff members on duty are recorded and she then informed Mandy that the outside barriers were not there again and they needed to be, Mandy went and put the barriers out. I asked Mandy for the Premises Licence and she had no idea where to locate it or what it looked like. We explained that it was a document of several pages and it had a blue spine, she went off and looked. I took out my Section 19 Closure Notice pad and PC Graham went off to check the fire exits as on previous visits these have been locked. I began to fill out the closure notice and Mandy then said that she had got her personal licence, she said she had done it on line a couple of days ago but had not received a certificate or a personal licence from the council. PC Graham informed me that both fire doors were locked from the inside and she informed Mandy, who unlocked them and was told that this must not happen again.

PC Graham asked Mandy if she could operate the CCTV system and both her and PC Graham went to the cellar where the system is kept. I remained at the bar and a female came up to me to ask where the bar staff were, I informed her that she wouldn't be long and she put some money on the bar and said to me ' Can you get me 2 pints of Moretti when she is back' the female then went to the toilets. PC Graham and Mandy returned, Mandy was unable to access the CCTV system but PC Graham located the Premises Licence whilst in the cellar and handed it to me.

I continued filling out the Section 19 Closure Notice as the premises had breached the condition which had been put on at the review hearing, condition 3 under Annex 3 as there was no personal licence holder on duty at the premises and alcohol was being sold. I asked Mandy how long Bulent Osman had been away for and she asked the group at the bar 'What time did Bul leave?' They responded saying 'about an hour ago'. Mandy said that he had gone through to Thornaby to his other premises. PC Graham said that he would be gone at least a couple of hours then.
