# **Healthy Child Service**

- North Yorkshire Council and Harrogate District NHS Foundation Trust S75 began July 2021
- Service is made up of 4 Pillars which cover Universal, mandated and targeted services
- The service can be accessed by phone, via health chat (app), virtual clinics and visit families at home dependent upon need














## National Child Measurement Programme



The service deliver the Reception and Year 6 measurements Early years have been identified as a priority group

































# Home Environment Assessment Tool (HEAT)

#### The assessment:

- Routine for all home contacts
- Part of a holistic assessment objective
- Includes safe sleeping and health and safety
- Identifies difficulties and concerns early
- Allows development of actions, programme of support and timescales
- Review as necessary

### Findings from HEAT:

- Clutter/ rubbish
- Overcrowding
- Safe sleep
- Smoke alarm (none or broken)
- Malodourous
- Damp
- Lack of furniture
- Not suitable due to SEND
- No toothbrushes
- Multi-agency working
