1. PROJECT DETAILS

The York & North Yorkshire Sector Study (2022) written by KADA¹ is the second of two documents commissioned by the former York and North Yorkshire Local Enterprise Partnership (now the York & North Yorkshire Mayoral Combined authority – YNY MCA) to identify those sectors that would potentially contribute the most to future economic growth in York and North Yorkshire.

Through analysis of the wider economy, five sectors; 'Agri-food', 'Advanced Manufacturing', 'Digitech, Data and Creative Industries', 'Health, Pharmaceuticals and Life Sciences' and 'Sustainable Energy and Bioeconomy' were identified as priority sectors and further detail regarding their importance and opportunities presented in the report.

In analysing each sector, it's relative size is partly demonstrated through the concentration of employment as a 'Location Quotient'; a means to measure the concentration of a particular activity relative to a wider geographic area. In the report the 'Health, Pharmaceuticals and Life Sciences' sector in YNY has an overall LQ of 1.22 but with a 'Craven' area value of 4.23, substantially above other areas of NY including the second highest value covering the 'Harrogate' area of 1.39.

Please outline why the budget is required and what are the current barriers to project development it will help overcome?

Within the project area there are a number of businesses that operate in this sector including, amongst others, Scapa Healthcare, Dechra Pharmaceuticals, Principle Healthcare, Lonsdale Health Products, the Airedale Group, Broughton Laboratories and, The Friendly Chemical Company.

Although creating an informal cluster of businesses, the same report noted this was one sector that has had negligible growth since 2015.

There is though, especially in a local context, anecdotal evidence of opportunities for growth, such as planning applications for expansion of existing premises but also businesses expanding to employment sites in neighbouring local authority areas. As such, the wider 'health' of this sector, its future growth potential, and local requirements in terms of skills, infrastructure and land availability is not clear.

Delivery of the activity proposed in this project proposal will help address this gap in knowledge, will provide appropriate evidence to inform future priorities for the Skipton & Ripon area and future Local Economic Action Plans along with informing wider Council strategies including the North Yorkshire Local Plan.

The ERTT PDF will fund necessary consultancy and research works, including:

- Procuring necessary expertise to undertake research into the sector.
- Undertaking face to face discussion with businesses to identify strengths and opportunities for growth along with weaknesses and threats affecting their operation in North Yorkshire.

Subject to endorsement of Skipton & Ripon ACC and approval by the Corporate Director, implementation will commence in July 2024, with an anticipated completion date of March 2025.
