Half term

As the school half-term break arrives, we're urging families to keep up the great effort to bring down the #Covid-19 infection rate and not to be tempted to head to the #NorthYorkshire countryside or coast.

Louise Wallace, our Director of Public Health, said: "There is no room for complacency. Infection rates are coming down, but only very slowly, so no-one should be lulled into a false sense of security. Rates could quickly shoot up again if we do not remain vigilant.

"I know how difficult this time is, the pressure that families are under and the desire to see loved ones, but please do not do so. The virus spreads when people mix with each other, so please don't break the rules."

Rapid testing in North Yorkshire

Information on lateral flow testing for people who have to leave home for work.

What is rapid testing?

Rapid testing using lateral flow devices (LFDs) involves taking and processing tests for COVID-19 directly at the point of care (e.g. workplace, care home). Samples are taken using nose and throat swabs and results are provided in around 30 minutes. Lateral flow tests look for parts of the surface of the virus (antigen) that are present during active COVID infection.

Currently, LFDs are targeted at people who do not have coronavirus symptoms (asymptomatic). Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 should isolate and access a PCR test. Find <u>more information about accessing PCR tests in North Yorkshire.</u>
