Live Music

To use the clubhouse and Sponsors' lounge and chairman's suite for pre booked events (for example wedding receptions anniversaries, christenings etc.) To occasionally be able to use the pitch and other parts of the premises for pre-booked and /or public 'fun days' or similar events.

Recorded Music

To use the clubhouse and sponsors lounge and chairman's suite for pre booked events (for example wedding receptions, anniversaries and christening.) to occasionally be able to use the pitch and other parts of the premises for pre-booked and/or 'fun days' or similar events. The music could be provided by a DJ or a sound system. In the event of the premises being used for an outside event the finish time would be limited to 19:00.

Indoor Sporting Events

We wish to be able to provide the occasional event for private gatherings or clubs for example race nights, darts evenings etc. within the clubhouse and sponsors' lounge and Chairman's suite

Other Regulated Entertainment

In To use the clubhouse and sponsors lounge and chairman's suite for pre booked events (for example wedding receptions, anniversaries and christening) to occasionally be able to use the pitch and other parts of the premises for pre-booked and/or 'fun days' or similar events. In the event of the premises being used for an outside event the finish time would be limited to 19:00. doors only.

Licensing Objectives – Remove (replaced with the objectives on page 16)

General The club has to comply with the football Licensing Authority requirements on match days which sets out codes of practice relating to safety generally and the supply of alcohol resulting from the Taylor Report. Alcohol cannot be consumed outdoors on match days.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 1) The club have recently provided a secure cloakroom for all valuables.
- 2) The club liaise with the police on match days and will continue to do so. For bigger games a police presence is normally provided.
- 3) Stewards are provided for all matches to assist with public safety issues.
- 4) The club employ professional security personnel for bigger matches.
- 5) The football regulations state that alcohol cannot be consumed outdoors on match days.

Public Safety

- 1) The club liaise with the police on match days and will continue to do so. For bigger games a police presence is normally provided.
- 2) Stewards are provided for all matches to assist with public safety issues.
- 3) The club employ professional security personnel for bigger matches.
- 4) The club has to comply with the Fire Safety and Safety of places of Sport Act 1987.
- 5) The club have their own health and safety manual, a copy of which is kept at the premises at all times.
- 6) The club has recently carried out works to the premises to comply with all requirements of North Yorkshire County Council trading standards which mainly relate to safety issues on match days.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1) After 19:00 any exit from the premises for a pre-booked event is via the Western exit/entrance on Wetherby Road, away from the main adjacent residential housing.
- 2) The club liaise with the police on match days and will continue to do so. For bigger games a police presence is normally provided.
- 3) Stewards are provided for all matches to assist with public safety issues.
- 4) The club employ professional security personnel for bigger matches.
- 5) The football regulations state that alcohol cannot be consumed outside on match days and this is adhered to.

The Protection of Children from Harm

- 1) The trading standards report requests that stewards prevent children from climbing the trees to obtain a better view and this is adhered to.
- 2) Pre-booked functions are of such a nature that children should be with responsible adults at all times.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.
- 3. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
 - <u>Plays</u>: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - <u>Indoor Sporting Events</u>: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - <u>Live Music</u>: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the nonresidential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- <u>Dance</u>: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- <u>Cross Activity Exemptions</u>: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
