Our first floor flat over the Skipton Building Society branch faces onto the High Street and is just 10 doors away from the premises address that the applicant proposes to use.		
The applicant wishes to trade from his Hotdog Heaven van from the Market setts outside 69 High Street up until 12:30am Mondays to Wednesdays, 1:00am on Thursdays, 2:00am Fridays and Saturdays and 11:30 pm on Sundays.		
I am concerned that trading so close to residential accommodation until the early hours of the morning will result in people gathering to order food which will cause a public nuisance. Inevitably when trading late at night into the early hours, the applicant's prospective customers will be under the influence of alcohol. From our experience, people under the influence of alcohol, ears ringing from loud music in the night club and bars, converse loudly and shout at each other. Such disturbances can clearly be heard in our flat, making sleep difficult, even interrupting sleep.
