Title of proposal	Transfer of grant funding from Harrogate Borough Council (HBC) to North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) to facilitate the delivery of WiFi and Low Powered Wide Area Network (LPWAN) in the Harrogate District
Brief description of proposal	The proposal is for a Key Decision to accept the transfer of £350k of grant funding from HBC to enable NYCC to facilitate the delivery of Public WiFi and LPWAN in the Harrogate District.
	This will then form part of a wider programme of work to rollout out Public WiFi and LPWAN across the County. (As part of the North Yorkshire Digital Infrastructure Programme.)
	HBC have already agreed the transfer of funds to NYCC on 3 <sup>rd</sup> February.

## **Options appraisal**

The other option considered was to commence a full procurement process for these services (in conjunction with HBC). This was recommended for rejection in lieu of recent feedback from suppliers, the financial benefits associated with integrating delivery of Harrogate connectivity into an already established, wider programme of work, and delivery of a consistent technical architecture across the County as a whole.

The aim of the wider programme of work is to deliver a range of digital infrastructure projects as part of the UK Government funding Getting Building Fund.

## What impact will this proposal have on council budgets? Will it be cost neutral, have increased cost or reduce costs?

The proposal will be cost neutral on the council budget as the funding is coming from grant funding secured by Harrogate Borough Council to facilitate the delivery Public WiFi and LPWAN. This will form part of a wider digital infrastructure programme that NYCC is managing to delivery Public WiFi and LPWAN across the County. (Services and applications which will have the potential to operate on the infrastructure, will have the benefit to reduce cost to the council over the longer term but will be the subject of individual projects and climate change impact assessments.)

## Summary

The proposal to accept the grant funding transfer will facilitate the delivery of public WiFi and LPWAN in the Harrogate district.

This improved connectivity will enable the development and delivery of other projects utilising IoT that may have a more positive impact on climate change such as the monitoring of highways to ensure the efficient use of scarce resources, or better monitoring of air and light pollution to enable application which will adjust usage to bring down those impacts. Some negative impacts will be created in the build phase of this project but they should be minimal but more than offset by future projects that may utilise these networks.
