#### 1. Prevention of Crime and Disorder

This area already has three alcohol-serving shops and three licensed bars/pubs within a very short distance. The crime rate and level of alcohol-related anti-social behaviour in the area is already exceptionally high. Adding another licensed premises would only increase opportunities for alcohol-fueled disorder, placing additional strain on local police and community safety resources.

#### 2. Prevention of Public Nuisance

Residents already experience significant nuisance from existing licensed premises in the form of late-night noise, litter, public drunkenness, and intimidation in the streets. Another alcohol outlet will inevitably worsen these problems, making the area more difficult to live in.

#### 3. Public Safety

The current volume of alcohol-related activity in this neighbourhood poses risks to public safety. Granting a further licence will increase foot traffic and alcohol availability in an area already struggling with disorder, potentially escalating violence, vandalism, and street disturbances.

#### 4. Protection of Children from Harm

Many families with children live in the immediate area. Increased exposure to drunken behaviour and the normalisation of excessive alcohol availability is not in the best interests of local young people, who are already at risk of harm from the existing saturation of licensed premises.

For these reasons, I respectfully request that the Licensing Authority refuse this application in order to protect the community from further harm.
