

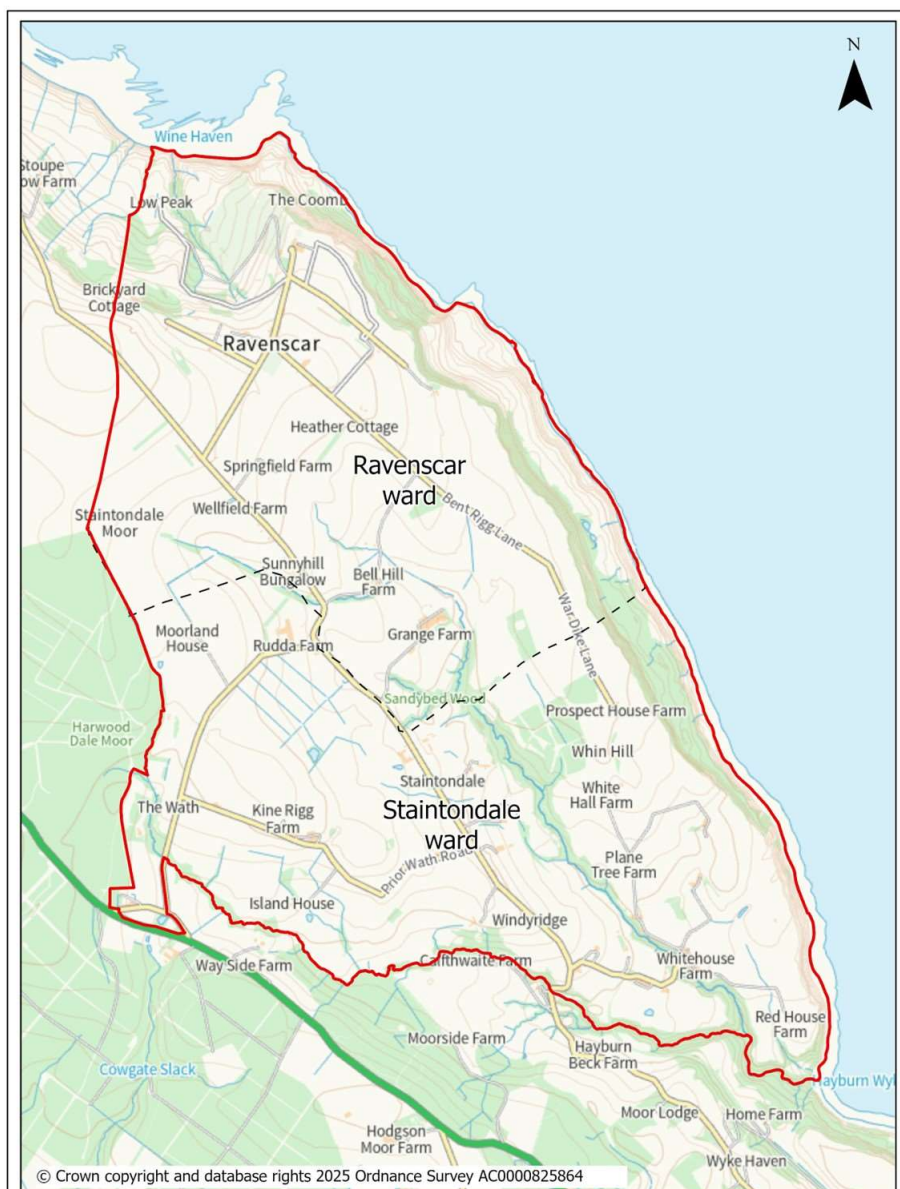
## Community Governance Review for Staintondale Parish Council

Staintondale Parish Council is divided into two wards; Staintondale ward and Ravenscar Ward. The location of the boundary line separating those two wards is under review. An order dated 1950 describes the boundary line between the two wards to be in a slightly different position to where it lies now.

The boundary line change has occurred between 1950 and 2007. How, why or when a change may have occurred between those dates has not been identified. Some electors within the parish would like the boundary line returning to the location evidenced in the 1950 order.

The current arrangements and location of the boundary line are as follows:

Staintondale Parish Council	Electors (June 2025)	Councillors
Ravenscar Ward	139	4
Staintondale Ward	106	3

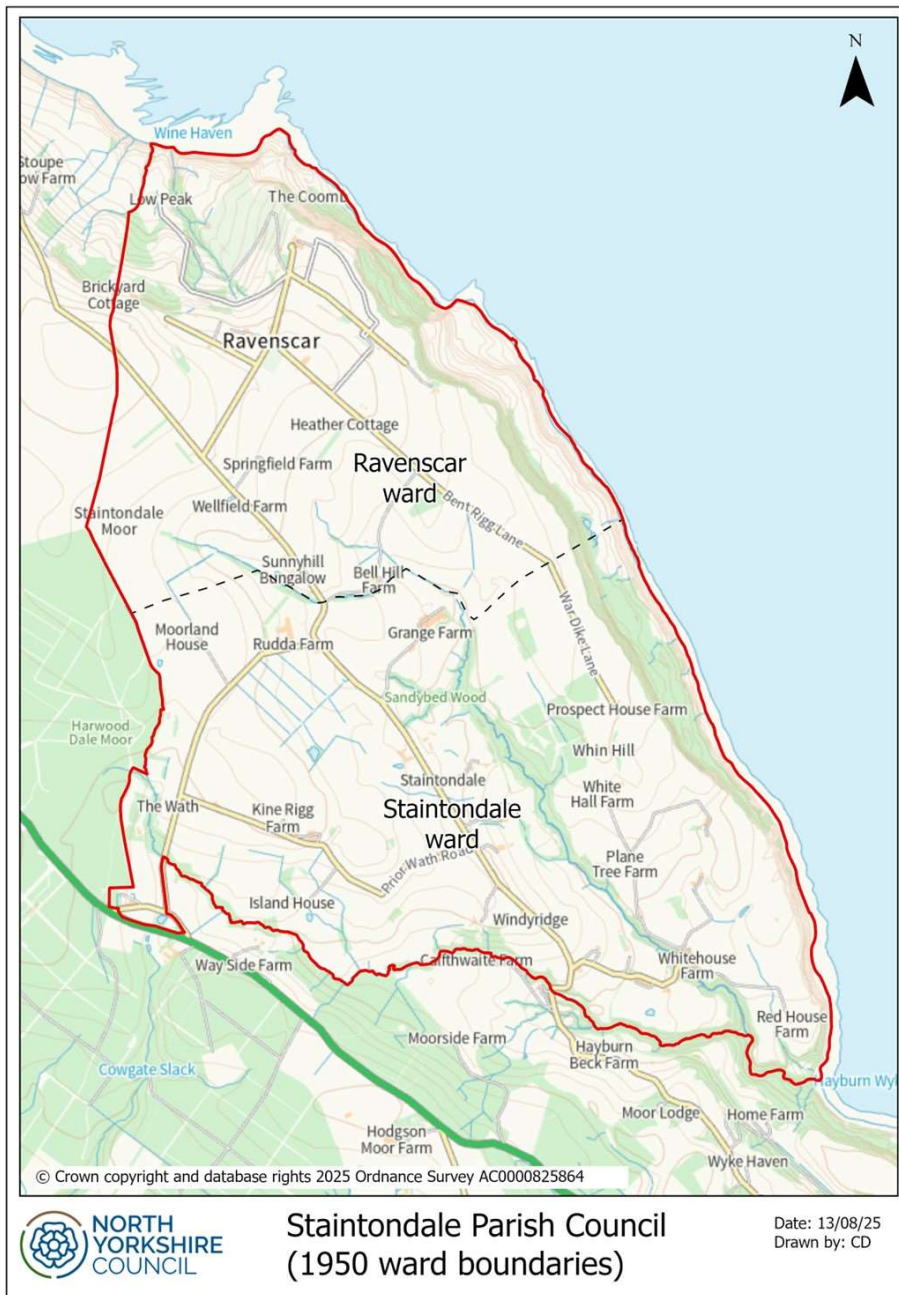

The order dated 1950 describes the wards and the position of the boundary line as follows:

'The parish shall be divided into two wards, the portion to the north of a line commencing at the western boundary of the parish to the north of Moorland House and passing in an easterly direction to Bloody Beck, along the said Beck and passing to the south of Bell Hill Farm, from there in an easterly direction passing to the north of Grange Farm to the War Dike, then following the line of the said Dike, passing the south of Ashyard Farm, to the sea, to be known as the Ravenscar Ward and the portion to the south of such line to be known as the Staintondale ward'.

Under the 1950 order the parish council arrangements would be as follows:

Staintondale Parish Council	Electors (June 2025)	Councillors
Ravenscar Ward	130	4
Staintondale Ward	115	3
<b>TOTALS</b>	<b>245</b>	<b>7</b>



If the previous boundary line were to be reinstated, the impact of the change is low affecting only four properties and nine electors who are currently in Ravenscar ward becoming part of the Staintondale ward.

This review seeks to review the position of the boundary line between Staintondale ward and Ravenscar ward by obtaining views and preferences of existing electors and other interested stakeholders in the area.
