Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

All conditions embedded in the Licensing Act 1964, Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 (if applicable) and other legislation including those reproduced below are preserved as conditions attached to this licence.

Unless stated elsewhere on the licence permitted hours and other embedded restrictions are as follows:

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10:00 to 23:00 hours.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12:00 to 22:30 hours.
- c. On Good Friday, 12:00 to 22:30 hours.
- d. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 10:00 to 23:00 hours.
- e. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12:00 to 22:30 hours.
- f. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- g. On Christmas day, as provided by the rules of the club and notified in writing by the chairman or secretary of the club to the chief executive of the justices for the petty sessions area in which the premises are. The said hours shall:
 - i. not exceed six and a half hours;
 - ii. not begin earlier than 12 noon;
 - iii. not end later than 10.30 p.m.
 - iv. provide for a break of at least 2 hours, including 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.;
 - v. not extend for more than three and a half hours after 5 p.m.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a. during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b. during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c. during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied as ancillary to the meals;
- d. the supply to, or consumption by, any person of alcohol in any premises where they are residing.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the club operating schedule

Licensable Activities

Indoor sporting events

Snooker fixtures with spectators Sept -Apr

Live music

Indoors only

Live music is very occasionally performed, at the most four times a year. It is amplified but volume is controlled by club officials, particularly after midnight. Last year and the year before we had not live music.

Recorded music

Indoors only

Background music is played in the ground floor bar. It is left to the steward's discretion as to when and for how long. No predetermined days of the week.

Provision of facilities for dancing

Indoors only

In the rare event of a private party being held in the upstairs bar. Dancing would occur. This is not a regular occurrence therefore we do not have standard timings.

Supply of alcohol

Both on and off the premises

The premises will close 30 minutes after last orders are supplied within authorised hours. New Year's Eve 11:00 to 02:00.

Concerns for children

The club has one jackpot gaming machine, use of which is restricted to club members only. An appropriate notice is posted on the machine itself. The machine is in sight of the bar. Surveillance of the machine is exercised by the steward, bar staff, committee persons and officials.

Embedded restrictions to be removed

Licensing Objectives

General

Club management, steward and bar staff are informed of the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and statutory requirement to comply with all relevant provisions of the act.

The prevention of crime and disorder

Club constitution includes rules governing the conduct of members and their guests within and adjacent to the club premises. Admission to the club is confined to members and bona fide guests. Club employees are instructed not to admit or serve members and guests who behave in a drunk and disorderly way. Misconduct is reported to the committee to consider action under the clubs disciplinary code.

Public Safety

The club complies with Health and Safety and fire precautions regulations. Following risk assessment, preventative and control measures are in place to ensure the safety of members, guests and employees while on the premises. The club complies with advised safety limits. Emergency escape routes are signposted.

The prevention of public nuisance

When live or recorded music is played, all reasonable steps are taken to avoid disturbance to neighbouring properties.

The protection of children from harm

At the moment we have four junior members aged 16-17. They are not permitted alcoholic drinks and must vacate the premises by 22:00. We are not accepting any further junior members. Young adults applying for membership must satisfy the committee that they are over 18. Accompanied children and grandchildren of members and their guests may attend a private party in the upstairs function room. They are not allowed in the ground floor bar. Committee members, club steward and other members of staff are instructed in the offence provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to alcohol and the protection of children. Signage is posted at both bars prohibiting the direct or indirect supply or delivery of alcohol to children.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premises (between the hours of 11:00pm and the finish of regulated entertainment) shall not be audible inside habitable rooms of noise sensitive properties in the vicinity.

Prominent, clear notices, shall be displayed at all entrances, outdoor drinking areas and exits requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises quickly and quietly.

***Informative Note**

In relation to condition 1 licensees are advised to carry out a simple "sound check" outside the nearest noise sensitive property by listening to the music etc. coming from regulated entertainment. If the music etc. is audible then it is likely that this condition is being breached. Steps should then be taken to reduce the volume of the noise.

In case of dispute or complaint and for the purpose of providing an objective standard to assess whether this condition is being complied with or not, noise shall be considered not to be audible if:

- a) the measurement of sound when music etc is on (expressed as LAeq, 1min) does not exceed the measurement of sound (expressed as LA90, 5min) when the music is off, and
- b) the measurement of sound in each 1/3rd octave band between 40Hz and 160Hz when music is on (expressed as L10, 1min) does not exceed the measurement of sound in the same 1/3rd octave bands between 40Hz and 160Hz when music is off (expressed as L90, 5 min)

All measurements taken within the habitable room normally occupied at the time in question, using a Type 1 integrating-averaging sound level meter compliant with BS EN 60804, with either windows open for normal ventilation or closed, whichever situation causes greater noise disturbance.
