PREMISES LICENCE APPLICATION
LICENSING ACT 2003

We are in receipt of your objection regarding the above application.

Please note that the licensing authority must provide the applicant with copies of any relevant representations and make them publicly available. Under normal circumstances, this will include your name and address. If you believe that, in the exceptional circumstances of your case, it is necessary to withhold your name and part of your address from the applicant, please provide reasons (e.g. fear of intimidation).

Additionally, the applicant or a representative may wish to contact you by email or telephone to discuss their application or to consider any amendments that may be made to alleviate your concerns. Please confirm if we can share any of your contact details for this purpose.

Representations must relate to one or more of the four licensing objectives of crime prevention, public safety, public nuisance and child protection.

1. The prevention of crime and disorder. This relates to any crime, disorder or anti-social behaviour at the premises or related to the management of the premises. A licence holder/applicant cannot generally be held responsible for the conduct of individuals once they leave the premises;
2. Public safety. This relates to the safety of the public on the premises, for instance, fire safety, electrical circuitry, lighting, building safety or capacity, and first aid.
3. Prevention of public nuisance. This can relate to issues such as hours of operation, noise emanating from the premises, vibrations, lighting and litter.
4. Protection of children from harm. This relates to protecting children from the activities carried out on the premises whilst they are there. The law already provides special protections for children under 18 to buy alcohol.

Any comments cannot be considered if they relate to anything else, such as planning permission, the need for the premises, trade competition, or the effect on house prices. Frivolous and vexatious representations will also be rejected.

Your representation has been accepted and will be sent to the applicant who will be advised to give careful consideration and to contact this department should they wish to start negotiating with a view to resolving the issues you have raised. Should your concerns be resolved by this process you can withdraw your representation at any point.

I have attached conditions which have been agreed between the applicant and North Yorkshire Police. It should be noted that the agreed hours are in line with the current Club Premises Certificate.

If resolution cannot be reached and the representation is not withdrawn the application will be dealt with by a Licensing Sub-Committee hearing which will be arranged within 20 working days of the end of the consultation period. Please be aware that the Licensing Authority has a maximum of two months from the original submission of the application to make a final determination so it is important that any negotiation is swiftly conducted.

Dear North Yorkshire Council Licensing Team,

I am writing to make a representation against the licensing application submitted by The Pateley Bridge Club, 42 High Street, Pateley Bridge, Harrogate, HG3 5JU, for the sale of alcohol and live and recorded music, as displayed in the club window.

I live at [REDACTED] Pateley Bridge, [REDACTED] and I wish to object on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance.

I am the homeowner and the parent of four children, and the noise generated by the club and its patrons already causes significant disruption to my family, particularly during the summer months when windows need to be open and daylight hours are longer. There is an archway directly outside the club where patrons gather, and on a regular basis my children and I are kept awake by loud shouting and screaming from people congregating in this area. The disturbance does not end when the club closes — it often continues for several hours afterwards as patrons linger and make their way home.

This has a real impact on my children's wellbeing and education. During exam periods in particular, the lack of sleep caused by late-night noise is extremely difficult for them. I often run workshops and have to leave very early in the morning. Driving is made dangerous by being kept awake at night.

The application seeks permission to serve alcohol until midnight on Sunday to Thursday and until 1am on Friday and Saturday, with music until the same hours. I believe these hours are excessive for a residential street. For context, the pubs in Pateley Bridge close at 11pm, and even at that hour the noise from the club and its patrons is a problem.

I would respectfully ask the Licensing Sub-Committee to consider the following conditions should an application be granted:

- Closing time of 10pm Sunday to Thursday and 11pm on Friday and Saturday.
- A requirement that the premises actively encourage patrons to leave quietly and disperse promptly at closing time, with signage and staff supervision at the exit.
- No use of the archway or outdoor area after 9pm.
- Doors and windows to remain closed during any live or recorded music.

I am happy to attend any licensing hearing to speak to these concerns in person.
